

Captain Selection Process

A. Steps to becoming a captain:

1. The candidate must fill out designated captain application form, including student and parent signatures.
2. **Activities Director will review student behavior logs to inform coaches of questionable behavior incidents.**
3. The candidate will be interviewed by a panel of coaches. Interviewers will forward notes and rating of each candidate to the head coaches.
4. If approved by the interview team, the candidate must speak to the team regarding:
 - a. Their leadership qualities and leadership activities they have participated in while a student at LNHS
 - b. Student must be willing to be proactive (confronting) peers who are violating MSHSL rules or school policies
 - c. Must address their past violation (if applicable), and how they have made a positive change
5. Vote taken by team and coaches will be considered along with the feedback from the interview team.

Previous MSHSL Violations

A student that has had a chemical, behavioral or **academic violation** during his/her 9th or 10th grade year may earn the privilege to become captain during his/her career. If a student in 11th or 12th grade has any violations, the privilege of becoming a captain is forfeited.

A. Chemical Violations-

Steps to earn the privilege of becoming a captain who has had a previous chemical violation:

1. Complete a chemical awareness session with school health counselor, or attend a recommended chemical diversion program
2. Complete a chemical evaluation by a professional
3. Student must write and share an account of the incident with their teammates:
 - a. Reflection of how it affected the relationships with parents, teammates, and coaches
 - b. List all the pressures they faced prior to and after the incident
 - c. List the positive options that are available should they be faced with the situation again
4. Student must address peers, youth teams, or other organizations about positive life choices

B. **Behavioral Violations-**

Behavioral infractions include any action resulting in school suspension from LNHS.

C. **Academic Violations-**

Academic Violations may include, but are not limited to, plagiarism, misrepresenting one's work or accomplishments, fabricating data, unauthorized advantage or assistance as defined in Student's Code of Conduct of the LNHS student planner.
