The BOD would like to thank all of the teams that participated in our Breast Cancer Awareness Day!!

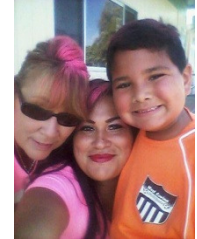
IMPORTANT INFORMATION
