CHAMPIONSHIP REWIND

2014 | Cape Breton, N.S. | 6-0-0-0 (W-OTW-OTL-L)

The U.S. National Under-17 Team cruised to its fourth World Under-17 Hockey Challenge championship, winning each of its six games and outscoring opponents, 47-6, including a 9-1 win over Quebec in the semifinals and a 4-0 triumph over Pacific in the championship game. Team USA's Colin White notched a tournament-best 10 goals and 18 points.

2010 | Timmins, Ont. | 6-0-0-0 (W-OTW-OTL-L)

Team USA claimed the World Under-17 Hockey Challenge crown for the third time overall and first time since 2002, thanks largely to a sound defensive unit, a deep group of forwards and goaltender John Gibson. The United States knocked off three-time defending champion Ontario in the championship game, 2-1, on a pair of goals by Tyler Biggs and 38 saves from Gibson.

2002 | Selkirk-Stonewall, Man. | 4-1-0-0-1 (W-OTW-OTL-L-T)

Fresh off its 2001 title, the U.S. went unbeaten in its four preliminary-round affairs before skating into the championship game following a 7-2 victory over Ontario in the semis. Led by Robbie Earl, Team USA clinched back-to-back titles with a 4-3 overtime win against Pacific. Two-time U.S. Olympian Ryan Suter skated for Team USA during the event.

2001 | New Glasgow-Truro, N.S. | 6-0-0-0 (W-OTW-OTL-L)

The newly formed National Team Development Program celebrated its first-ever international tournament championship when the 2001 U.S. National Under-17 Team captured first place at the World Under-17 Hockey Challenge.

U.S. ON TO SEMIS AFTER WIN OVER CANADA BLACK: Joey Anderson scored twice, Max Jones and Kailer Yamamoto each buried one goal and Jake Oettinger turned in a 23-save performance to lead the U.S. National Under-17 Team past Canada Black, 4-1.

The United States built a 2-0 advantage by the first intermission, added another tally in the middle period and one final goal in the third. The U.S. Player of the Game was Joey Anderson.



TWO PLAYERS ADDED TO U.S. ROSTER: Team USA includes 20 full-time members of USA Hockey's National Team Development Program and two players who have been added to the U.S. roster for the World Under-17 Hockey Challenge. Those players - Riley Tufte, who will skate for Blaine (Minn.) High School this winter, and Kailer Yamamoto, a member of the Western Hockey League's Spokane Chiefs - will stay with Team USA through the completion of the event before returning to their 2014-15 teams.

2014 CHAMPIONS

The 2013-14 U.S. National Under-17 Team became the first U.S. team to win World Under-17 Hockey Challenge since 2010.

USA KEYNOTES

INTERNATIONAL DEBUTS: Of the 22 players on Team USA, 19 are making their international hockey debuts at the World Under-17 Hockey Challenge. The U.S. roster does include three players with international experience - Keenan Suthers, Riley Tufte and Kailer Yamamoto. All three skated for the U.S. Under-17 Select Team at the Under-17 Five Nations Tournament this summer in Germany, helping the squad to a second-place finish.

NATIONAL TEAM DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM: Twenty members of Team USA skate full-time at USA Hockey's National Team Development Program in Ann Arbor, Mich. The NTDP aims to prepare student-athletes under the age of 18 for participation on U.S. National Teams and success in their future hockey careers. Now in its 18th season, the NTDP has produced U.S. stars such as Patrick Kane, Phil Kessel, Ryan Suter and James van Riemsdyk.

COLLEGE BOUND: The UI7 Team has 13 players who have committed to play college hockey at NCAA Division I schools. Of all the colleges with verbal commits, the University of Michigan boasts the most with five. The University of Minnesota Duluth is the only other school that has more than one recruit (two), while six other programs - Boston University, Harvard University, the University of Minnesota, the University of Notre Dame, the University of Wisconsin, and Western Michigan University - all have one.

CAPTAINS AMERICA: Defenseman Ryan Lindgren, a native of Minneapolis and former standout at Shattuck-St. Mary's, will wear the "C" for Team USA at the World UI7 Hockey Challenge. His assistant captains are defensemen Griffin Luce and Luke Martin, as well as forward Nick Pastujov.

COACH COLE: U.S. head coach Danton Cole is making his third appearance behind the bench of Team USA at the World Under-17 Hockey Challenge, having previously worked in that role at the 2011 and 2013 events. In 2011, Cole guided the United States to a second-place finish, and, in 2013, he helped the team capture third place.

GOING FOR NINE IN A ROW: Team USA is looking to extend its eight-year medal streak at the World Under-17 Hockey Challenge to nine this week. During that stretch, the United States has earned two championships, four second-place finishes and two third-place showings. The last time the U.S. failed to finish in the top three was 2005.

HOCKEY CONNECTIONS: Joey Anderson's dad, Gerry, played college hockey at St. Scholastica (Minn.) ... Trent Frederic's brother Grant played for Janesville in the North American Hockey League ... James Greenway's brother, Jordan, is a member of the U.S. National Under-18 Team ... Max Jones' dad, Brad, played on the U.S. Men's National Team in 1987-88, was a four-year standout at the University of Michigan (1983-87) and played 148 games in the National Hockey League. Jones' brother, Mitch, plays for the Plymouth Whalers of the Ontario Hockey League ... Chad Kry's dad, Mark, skated at Boston University from 1987-91 before playing nine seasons of professional hockey ... Ryan Lindgren's dad, Bob, played goalie at the University of Michigan. Lindgren's brother, Charlie, won USA Hockey's Dave Peterson Goalie of the Year Award in 2013 and currently tends goal for St. Cloud State University ... William Lockwood's dad, Joseph, played for the University of Michigan ... Griffin Luce's dad, Scott, is director of scouting for the NHL's Florida Panthers. Luce's grandfather Don is currently a pro scout for the NHL's Philadelphia Flyers and has spent time with five other NHL organizations ... Luke Martin's brother Jimmy played at Yale University from 2007-11 ... James Sanchez's brother, Joey, played in the NAHL for Janesville and Michigan ... Keenan Suther's grandfather Tom signed with the NHL's New York Rangers before being deployed in World War II ... Kailer Yamamoto's brother, Keanu, skates for the Spokane Chiefs of the Western Hockey League ... Goalie coach Kevin Reiter's brother, Kenny, won a national title in 2011 as a goalie at the University of Minnesota Duluth and now plays pro hockey ... Intern coach Tyler Walsh's dad, Sean, won two national championships (1993, 1999) as head coach at the University of Maine. Walsh's grandfather Ron Mason earned the second-most wins in NCAA history (924) and lead Michigan State University to the 1986 NCAA title. He was inducted into the U.S. Hockey Hall of Fame in 2013.

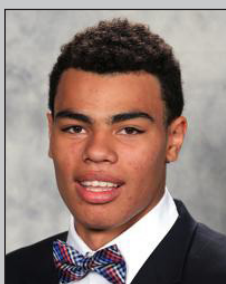
