Celebrity Bios

Dave Andreychuck

Born and raised in Hamilton, Dave was drafted 16th overall in the 1982 NHL draft by the Buffalo Sabres. Dave played 10 seasons with Buffalo compiling a very impressive 348 goals and 391 assists and reaching the playoffs in 8 of those 10 years.

Acquired by Toronto in 1992, Dave continued to amass impressive statistics. During this trade year, Dave scored a personal best 54 goals and 99 points. In 1993-94, he scored 99 points for the second straight season and played in his second All-star Game. To date Dave has earned Hall of Fame numbers with 593 goals, 654 assists and has played in 1443 regular season games. Dave's playoff numbers are just as impressive with 15 post season appearances, 128 games played, 39 goals and 38 assists.

Dave now spends his time living in Buffalo in the off-season with his wife Sue and three children Taylor, Caci and Brooke. His Parents, Julian & Roz and sisters Karen and Sandy still live in Hamilton.

Molly Killingbeck

Molly has enjoyed success as a world class athlete and coach in track and field. Her illustrious career started at York University in Toronto, where she was recently inducted into the University's Sport Hall of Fame.

A sprint specialist, Molly has been on Commonwealth, Pan Am, World and Olympic Teams from 1980 to 1988. At the 1984 Olympic Games in Los Angeles, she helped Canada earn a silver medal in the 4x400 metre relay. Molly's career spans to include extensive coaching accomplishments as a sprint/relay coach where she assisted the Men's 4x100 relay team in securing a Gold medal at the 1996 Olympic Games in Atlanta.

Molly continues to give back to the sporting community as a former member of Toronto's 2008 Olympic Bid and as a Board Member for Commonwealth Games Canada, Athletics Canada Foundation, ProAction (Cops helping kids) and the Next Door Family Resource Centre. She currently lives in Toronto with her husband Liam and son Gabriel Quinn.

Vicky Sunohara

Vicky started her ice hockey career playing in the Scarborough League for girls and boys. She continued to play at Northwestern University and the University of Toronto. Her great skill took her to the next level as she has played for Team Canada on five World Championship Teams. Vicki played forward on two Olympic teams, winning a silver medal in Nagano and the gold in Salt Lake City.

Lori Dupuis

A team mate of Vicki's, Lori has played defense at three World Championships, winning gold all three times. Lori's goal is "ask yourself what you want, then do what you have to do". She certainly pursued this goal as a member of two Olympic teams winning silver in 1998 and gold in 2002. Lori is an outstanding team player and played a key roll in Canada's International success on the ice..
