**SECTION I – INTRODUCTION and INTENT of REP:**

**Notice to Vendors**

Gambrills Odenton Recreation Council Board of Directors, known here after as GORC, will be accepting sealed bids from experienced, qualified vendors who specialize in commercial lawn care and maintenance services including, but not limited to, mowing, trimming, weed control, and aeration/thatching for the following:

**REQUEST FOR PROPOSAL  
Lawn Care and Maintenance Services  
GORC Park and Neighboring Schools**

Proposals must be received via e-mail at [landscaping@gorc.org](mailto:landscaping@gorc.org) by **5:00 PM, February 5, 2016**. Complete specifications and instructions are attached herewith.

GORC plans to contract for lawn care and maintenance services for all common areas, parks, traffic circles, and buffer zones administered by the GORC. Areas of work are defined on the attached Exhibit A maps outlining areas of the park and playing fields at neighboring schools. We expect the selected Contractor to begin work on or about March 01, 2016.

Submission of a proposal signifies the Contractor's agreement that its proposal and the content therein are valid and will become part of the contract that is negotiated between GORC and the successful Contractor. All prices submitted within the proposal shall remain in effect for the contract period.

**SECTION II – SCHEDULE:**

**SECTION III -- BACKGROUND:**

GORC is soliciting proposals for lawn care and maintenance services for the locations listed in Exhibit A. GORC is responsible for the maintenance and upkeep these areas. While GORC is focused on providing the community with good looking green spaces, it is also committed to the conservation of resources.

**SECTION IV -- GENERAL CONDITIONS and FINANCIAL PROVISIONS:**

**CONTRACTOR QUALIFICATIONS:** The successful Contractor must be properly licensed to do business within Anne Arundel County and the State of Maryland. The successful Contractor shall have been in the lawn care and maintenance business for a minimum of two (2) years. The Contractor shall have a person available during normal business working hours to address any problems or complaints.

**PRICING:** The Contractor warrants that the pricing stated herein shall remain firm for a period of one (1) year from the first day of the contract period. Pricing shall include all charges that may be imposed in fulfilling the terms of the contract.

**HOURS:** Hours of lawn care and maintenance shall **ONLY** be performed from 8:00 AM to 5:00 PM Monday through Friday. **Please note any work done at an Anne Arundel County Public School must be done outside regular school hours.** A regular mowing schedule shall be set up upon contractual award.

**TERMS OF CONTRACT:** The initial contract term will be approximately from March 01, 2016 through November 30, 2016. Upon board approval, the contract will be renewable on an annual basis for up to one (1) additional fiscal year.

**CONTRACT AGREEMENT:** All subsequent contract agreements as a result of an award hereunder, shall incorporate all terms, conditions, and specifications contained herein, and in response hereto, unless mutually amended in writing.

**SIGNED PROPOSAL CONSIDERED AN OFFER:** Receipt of a signed proposal shall be considered an offer on the part of the Contractor. The terms, conditions and specifications of this proposal will become part of the contract, if the proposal shall be deemed approved and accepted by GORC. In the event of a default on the part of the Contractor after acceptance, GORC may take such action as it deems appropriate including legal action for damages or specific performance.

**PAYMENT TERMS:** Payment terms are NET 30 days following receipt of correct detailed invoice. Invoicing to be done by the last day of the month for all work performed during said month. All functions as described below must be detailed in the bill. Invoices must be submitted after work is completed to:

GORC is responsible for all payments to the Contractor under this contract.

**SUBCONTRACTING:** The Contractor shall not have the right or power to assign, subcontract, or transfer interest in this contract without the prior approval of the GORC Board of Directors stipulated in writing.

**CHANGES:** GORC shall have the right, at any time, to alter the specifications to meet increased or decreased needs. If any such changes cause an increase or decrease in the cost or the time required for the performance, or otherwise affects any other provision of this agreement, an equitable adjustment shall be made and this agreement shall be modified in writing accordingly.

**AVAILABILITY OF FUNDS:** Any and all payments to the Contractor shall be deemed binding only to the extent of appropriated funds for the purpose set forth in this proposal.

**NON-DISCRIMINATION:** The Contractor shall not discriminate against any individuals and will take proactive measures to assure compliance with all Federal and State requirements concerning fair employment, employment of people with disabilities, and concerning the treatment of all employees without regard to discrimination based upon age, race, color, religion, sex, national origin or disability.

**GOVERNING LAWS:** This contract is made under and shall be governed and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Maryland.

**ADVERTISING:** In submitting a proposal to GORC, the Contractor agrees not to use the results of their proposal as a part of any commercial advertising without prior written approval of GORC.

**CONFIDENTIALITY OF PROPOSALS:** In submitting a proposal the Contractor agrees not to discuss or otherwise reveal the contents of the proposal to any source outside of current GORC board members until after the award of the contract. Contractors not in compliance with the provision may, at the option of GORC, be disqualified from contract award. Only discussions authorized by GORC are exempt from this provision.

**ELABORATE PROPOSALS:** Elaborate proposals in the form of brochures or other presentations beyond that necessary to present a complete and effective proposal are not desired.

**COST FOR PROPOSAL PREPARATION:** Any costs incurred by Contractors in preparing or submitting proposals are the Contractors' sole responsibility. GORC will not reimburse any Contractor for any costs incurred prior to award of this contract.

**TIME FOR ACCEPTANCE:** Each proposal shall state that it is a firm offer which may be accepted within a period of 90 days following the due date of February 05, 2016. Although the contract is expected to be awarded prior to that time, the 90-day period is requested to allow for unforeseen delays.

**RIGHT TO SUBMITTED MATERIAL:** All responses, inquiries, or correspondence relating to or in reference to this Request for Proposals, and all other reports, charts, displays, schedules, exhibits, and other documentation submitted by the Contractors shall become the property of GORC when received.

**COLLUSIVE BIDDING:** The vendor's signature on the GORC "Request for Proposal (RFP)" is a guarantee that the prices quoted have been arrived at without collusion with other eligible Contractors and without effort to preclude GORC from obtaining the lowest possible competitive price.

**GENERAL INDEMNITY:** The Contractor shall save and hold harmless, pay on behalf of, protect, defend, indemnify GORC, assume entire responsibility and liability for losses, expenses, demands and claims in connection with or arising out of any injury, or alleged injury (including death) to any person, or damage, or alleged damage, to property of GORC or others sustained or alleged to have been sustained in connection with or to have arisen out of or resulting from the performance or the intended performance of any work/service, outlined or resulting from this agreement, by the Contractor or their employees, including losses, expenses or damages sustained by GORC or GORC board members from any and all such losses, expenses, damages, demands and claims. The Contractor further agrees to defend any suit or action brought against GORC or GORC board members based on any such alleged injury or damage and to pay all damages, cost and expenses in connection therewith or resulting therefrom. As an integral part of this agreement, the Contractor agrees to purchase and maintain, during the life of this contract, contractual liability insurance in the amounts required in the general liability insurance requirements. The obligations of the Contractor pursuant to this paragraph shall not be limited in any way by any limitation in the amount or type of proceeds, damages, compensation, or benefits payable under any policy of insurance or self-insurance maintained by or for the use and benefit of the Contractor.

**CONFLICT OF INTEREST:** All Contractors must disclose in writing with their proposal the name of any owner, officer, director, or agent who is also a member of GORC. Preference will be neither given nor contract denied because of membership. By submitting a proposal, the Contractor certifies that there is no relationship between the Contractor and any person or entity which is or gives the appearance of a conflict of interest related to this RFP.

**ERRORS AND OMISSIONS:** The Contractor shall not take advantage of any errors or omissions in this RFP. The Contractor shall promptly notify GORC of any omissions or errors found in this document.

**INSURANCE COVERAGE:** During the term of the contract, the Contractor at their sole cost and expense shall provide commercial insurance of such type and with such terms and limits as may be reasonably associated with the contract. At a minimum, the Contractor shall provide and maintain the following coverage and limits:

- Worker's Compensation** - The Contractor shall provide and maintain Worker's Compensation Insurance, as required by the laws of Maryland, as well as employer's liability coverage with minimum limits of no less than One Hundred Thousand Dollars, for bodily injury per accident. This insurance must include and cover all of the Contractor's employees who are engaged in any work under this contract.
- General Liability** - The Contractor shall provide and maintain General Liability Coverage at a rate no less than One Million Dollars per occurrence, Two Million Aggregate, for bodily injury, personal injury and property damage.
- Automobile** - Automobile Liability Insurance to include liability coverage, covering all owned, hired and non-owned vehicles used in connection with this contract. The contractor shall provide and maintain the minimum combined single limit of One Million Dollars for bodily injury and property damage with uninsured/under insured motorist and medical payment.

**INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS:** Providing and maintaining adequate insurance coverage is a material obligation of the Contractor and is of the essence of this contract. All such insurance shall meet all laws of the State of Maryland. Such insurance coverage shall be obtained from companies that are authorized to provide such coverage and that are authorized by the Commissioner of Insurance to do business in Maryland. The Contractor shall at all times comply with the terms of such insurance policies, and all requirements of the insurer under any such insurance policies, except as they may conflict with existing Maryland laws. The limits of coverage under each insurance policy maintained by the Contractor shall not be interpreted as limiting the Contractor's liability and obligations under the contract.

**OTHER INSURANCE PROVISIONS:** The policy or policies are to contain, or be endorsed to contain, the following provisions:

- A. Contractor's insurance is to be considered primary for losses that occur as a direct result of the Contractor's actions.
- B. Coverage shall state that the Contractor's insurance shall not be suspended, voided, canceled, reduced in coverage or in limits except after 30 days written notice.

The Contractor must include a copy of their insurance certificate with their proposal package. Upon award of this contract, the selected Contractor shall add GORC as an Additional Insured to their insurance policy.

**PROPOSAL OPENING:** The proposal deadline is **5:00 PM February 05, 2016**. Thereafter, the GORC Grounds Committee will review all received applications. They will make their recommendation to the entire GORC board. See "**EVALUATION CRITERIA**" and "**AWARD OF BID**" for further explanation on the components involved with the award of this contract.

**EVALUATION CRITERIA:** GORC, at its sole discretion, following an objective evaluation, will award this contract to the most responsible, responsive Contractor. The proposals will be evaluated on a "best overall value" basis including, but not limited to, completeness and content of the proposal, pricing, quality, the Contractors ability to follow the specifications, the Contractors ability to provide a team of skilled, trained employees, the Contractors experience with similar projects and the Contractors responses to "Mandatory Issues". In addition to these considerations, the evaluators may request additional information, oral presentations or discussions with any or all of the responding Contractors to clarify elements of their proposal or to amplify the materials presented in any part of the proposal. However, Contractors are cautioned that the evaluators are not required to request clarification; therefore, all proposals should be complete and reflect the most favorable terms available from the Contractor.

GORC reserves the right to make independent investigations as to the qualifications of the Contractor. Such investigations may include contacting existing customers. Contractors should keep in mind that this is a Request for Proposals and not a request to contract. GORC reserves the unqualified right to accept or reject any and all proposals, and to waive any irregularities as may be permitted by law when it is deemed that such action will be in the best interest of GORC.

**REFERENCE TO OTHER DATA:** Only information which is received in response to this Request for Proposals will be evaluated. Reference to information previously submitted shall not be evaluated.

**AWARD OF BID:** GORC, at its sole discretion, following an objective evaluation, will award this contract to the most responsible, responsive Contractor. Price will be a major consideration but will not be the determining factor in our selection. The award of this contract will be based and granted on "**BEST VALUE.**" "**BEST VALUE**" will allow GORC to consider factors beyond pricing such as whether the responsible Contractor is able to meet and/or exceed the required specifications. "**BEST VALUE**" will permit and reflect prudent stewardship of funds and trust. Award of the contract to one Contractor does not mean that the other proposals lacked merit. Award of the contract signifies that after all factors have been considered, the selected proposal was deemed most advantageous to GORC.

**NOTIFICATION OF AWARD:** After all prerequisites and specifications have been met by the Contractor and the award for lawn care and maintenance services has been made, the successful Contractor will be notified. GORC will notify the successful Contractor in writing, either by a LETTER OF AWARD or a PURCHASE ORDER or both. VERBAL NOTIFICATION OF THE AWARD OF THIS CONTRACT IS NOT CONSIDERED A RELIABLE MODE OF NOTIFICATION AND, THEREFORE, WILL NOT BE RECOGNIZED AS AN OFFICIAL NOTIFICATION.

**TERMINATION FOR CAUSE:** GORC reserves the right to terminate this contract at any time for cause. The violation of any provision or condition contained in this contract, or the refusal, failure, or inability to carry out any provisions of this contract in a timely manner shall constitute sufficient grounds to terminate this contract for cause. Should GORC elect to terminate this contract for cause, GORC will notify the Contractor 30 days prior to the termination date and shall specify the cause for termination as well as the date the termination shall be effective. This termination notice will be issued via a written letter sent by certified U.S. mail. Immediate dismissals may be executed if deemed necessary by GORC.

**TERMINATION WITHOUT CAUSE:** GORC and the Contractor may terminate this contract without cause. Written notice of termination must be sent via certified U.S. mail no later than thirty (30) days prior to the termination date.

## **SECTION V – EMPLOYEE GUIDELINES:**

**DRUG POLICY:** The Contractor certifies that it maintains a drug free work place environment to ensure worker safety and workplace integrity.

**AUTHORIZED PERSONNEL:** During the performance of these services, the Contractor’s employees are not to be accompanied in the work area by acquaintances, family members, associates or any other person(s) who are not a current, authorized employee(s) of the Contractor.

**EMPLOYEE GUIDELINES:** The Contractor shall use only qualified personnel to provide the required services.

**ANNE ARUNDEL COUNTY PUBLIC SCHOOL POLICIES:** Performance of the scope of work located at Anne Arundel County Public Schools is subject to work rules and guidelines set forth by the AACPS (including but not limited to submitting employees for background checks, etc.)

**ANNE ARUNDEL COUNTY RECREATION & PARKS POLICIES:** Work performed at GORC Park is subject to any work rules and guidelines set forth by Anne Arundel County Recreation & Parks (including but not limited to submitting employees for background checks, etc.)

## **SECTION VI – SAFETY:**

**SAFETY:** The Contractor and any persons employed by the Contractor shall be required to adhere to all OSHA requirements and regulations that apply while performing any part of the work listed under the title “Scope of Work”. The Contractor and any persons employed by the Contractor shall be required to wear all safety items as required by OSHA regulations while performing any part of the work listed under the title “Scope of Work.”

**State and Federal Regulations:** The Contractor shall perform all work in accordance with State and Federal safety regulations in regards to work zones, work areas, equipment, vehicles, tools and supplies. The Contractor shall provide all necessary and required work zone protective devices and traffic channeling devices as required under State and Federal safety regulations.

**Public Safety:** The Contractor shall protect the safety and convenience of the general public. The Contractor shall perform work as needed and necessary to protect the general public from hazards.

**SECTION VII -- SPECIAL CONDITIONS:**

**FACILITY:** It is up to the contractor to tour the areas covered by this scope of work and inspect the spaces to be serviced before submitting a proposal. It is the contractor's responsibility to verify all information in order to appropriately bid this proposal.

**CONTRACTOR SUPERVISION:** The Contractor or the Contractor's authorized agent shall make sufficient routine inspections to ensure the lawn care and maintenance work is performed as required by the contract.

**SECTION VIII – PROPOSAL INFORMATION:**

- Proposals for lawn care and maintenance services must be received by **5:00 PM, February 05, 2016**. **Proposals must be submitted by e-mail at [landscaping@gorc.org](mailto:landscaping@gorc.org)**. GORC must receive all proposals **PRIOR** to the date and time specified.
- All proposals must be submitted on the required forms. All blank spaces for bid prices must be completed in ink or typewritten. The Bid Forms must be completed, signed, and dated by an official of the company authorized to bind the firm. Unsigned proposals will not be considered.
- Questions regarding this RFP must be received in writing no more than five days prior to proposal due date. Questions will be sent to: [landscaping@gorc.org](mailto:landscaping@gorc.org)
- All locations must be bid individually.
- All questions in the "Mandatory Issues to be Answered" must be fully addressed in your proposal.
- The successful Contractor shall be responsible for having taken steps reasonably necessary to ascertain the nature and location of the work, and the general and local conditions, the size and scope of the land, which can affect the work or the cost thereof.** Accuracy of the Contractors proposal should be based on site visitations and a careful review of the RFP specifications. After proposals have been submitted, the Contractor shall not assert there was a misunderstanding concerning the quantity or nature of the work to be performed in an effort to alter their responsibility to successfully perform work or will require additional compensation from the GORC.
- The Contractor to whom this project is awarded shall execute a written contract with GORC to perform the work as outlined in these specifications and in accordance with all the conditions as described in this RFP.

- The Contractor and their employees are expected to be trained and experienced in lawn care and maintenance services on a large scale. When submitting a proposal, the Contractor should include a statement of experience where lawn care and maintenance services have been performed in similar work situations and environments.
- GORC may make such investigations deemed necessary to determine the ability of the Contractor to perform the services outlined in these specifications. If requested, the Contractor shall provide GORC with all such information and data for this purpose. GORC reserves the right to reject any proposal if the evidence submitted by or derived from an investigation of such Contractor fails to satisfy GORC that the Contractor is properly qualified to carry out the obligations of the contract and to complete the work specified in this RFP.
- A conditional or qualified proposal will not be accepted.

**SECTION IX – MANDATORY ISSUES:**

1. List or detail all pertinent information and data that would indicate the ability of your organization to satisfactorily fulfill the work as outlined in this Request for Proposals.
2. Has a member of your management team personally inspected the proposed work sites? Please include a copy of your complete plan for the performance of specified work?

## **SECTION X -- SCOPE OF WORK:**

**CONTRACTOR RESPONSIBILITIES:** The chosen Contractor shall provide the management, supervision, and manpower necessary to provide the lawn care and maintenance services, as detailed in this proposal. All work shall be performed in a professional and workmanlike manner.

1. This contract is for one (1) year with renewal options for two (2) additional one (1) year periods.
2. Services for each function must be bid individually on the bid sheet. GORC reserves the right to select which services will be awarded as part of the contract.
3. AJ DiDominicus and Mike Pozdol shall serve as the point of contact regarding services to be performed. They can be reached at [landscaping@gorc.org](mailto:landscaping@gorc.org).

**All equipment shall be supplied by the Contractor.**

The successful Contractor shall be prepared to perform the following services, according to the work schedule outlined in the specifications below. See attached map (Exhibit A) which identifies the distinct areas:

### **FUNCTION 1:**

**MOWING** (weekly from mid-March through October to be determined with GORC representative)

- Trash and litter picked up and removed from grass prior to mowing.
- Grass mowed (including boulevard areas adjacent to parks).
  - Mowed height shall not be below 3 inches in height except last mowing of season.
  - No more than 1/3 of the height of the grass should be taken off per mowing.
  - Park space shall be cross cut at a 90 degree angle every other mowing.
- Edging/Trimming
  - All buildings, sidewalks, fences, driveways, parking lots, and other surfaced areas bordered by grass will be edged every mowing.
  - Grass around sprinkler heads will be trimmed so as to not interfere with or intercept water output.
  - Contractor shall take necessary steps to prevent bark injury, from mowers and line trimmers, to all trees/shrubs growing in lawn areas.
  - All areas not able to be mowed will be trimmed to the same height as the mowed grass.
- Clippings may be left on the surface as long as no readily visible clumps remain on the grass after mowing. Otherwise, clippings must be distributed by mechanical blowing or removed.
- Concrete areas are to be blown or swept to remove grass trimming after mowing and trimming.
- Weeding during mowing visits:
  - Grass and weeds in mulch beds, parking lot, walkways or paved areas shall be removed or sprayed
  - Spraying to be done using necessary pre-emergent or post-emergent herbicide
- ALTERNATE – Provide second weekly mowing for main multi-purpose field with Bermuda grass during summer months as necessary.**

**FUNCTION 2:**

**TRASH REMOVAL - GORC PARK** (mandatory award with Mowing – Function 1 above)

- To occur twice per week (days to be determined) from March 1, 2016 through March 1, 2017.
- Trash to be removed from all cans within the park and moved to dumpster (provided by GORC / AA County).  
Trash bags will be placed in each trash can as part of service.
- Contractor to provide labor to maintain trash removal 3x per year for special events at the park:
  - Spring Parade (approximately April 16, 2016)
  - Cream the Coach & Bonfire (September or October, 2016)
  - Homecoming (September or October, 2016)
- Contractor to provide clean-up services for bonfire debris removal on day following Cream the Coach & Bonfire

**FUNCTION 3:**

**PRUNING – GORC PARK** (approximately 1 to 2x per year)

- Contractor shall clean-up and prune all trees and shrubs along walking paths, buildings, fields and parking lots.
- All limbs and debris to be removed by contractor.

**FUNCTION 4:**

**AERATION** (schedule to be determined)

- Plug aeration will be used. Aerating will be done with coring machines which remove cores 1/4 to 3/8 inches in diameter and 3 to 4 inches deep
- Contractor to recommend seed type and state seeding rate as part of proposal
- Contractor will be responsible to mark any sprinkler lines or utilities to perform work.

**FUNCTION 5:**

**MONUMENT/MEMORIAL MULCH** (2x per year between Main Field and Field #7)

- Edge, weed and mulch landscape bed with brown died mulch.
- Apply pre-emergent weed control to mulch areas.

**FUNCTION 6:**

**FERTILIZATION**

- Fertilizing of lawns shall consist of:
  - Pre-emergent & fertilizer
  - Summer weed & feed
  - Early Fall weed & feed
- Contractor to recommend product and state application rate as part of proposal

**FUNCTION 7:**

**MAIN FIELD – BERMUDA GRASS**

- Urea Fertility application (state application rate) approximately 4x annually
- Potash (Potassium) application (state application rate) approximately 3x annually
- Field Renovation
  - Hollow tine aerifying the entire field +/- mid June.
  - Take the plugs/sprigs created from the aerification and place these in the worn areas.
  - Grow in these areas (usually in the middle of the field) similar to a sprigging, but with 2-3 extra fertilizations to push the growth.
- Monitor water and set schedule for Bermuda field throughout entire year.
- Vertiquake the field to promote root depth and create less compaction.

**FUNCTION 8:**

**BASEBALL & SOFTBALL FIELDS – WEED REMOVAL AND CONTROL**

- Apply post-emergent herbicide to field and remove weeds (approximately 1x)
- Apply pre-emergent herbicide to field to prevent future weed growth (approximately 2x)
