 - a) a Member of the Association agrees that such students may represent a high school operated by the Member; and
 - b) the student otherwise meets all the eligibility requirements of the Association.
 - schools that have Home School or Distance Learning Students representing them in interschool competitions must submit form E-18 to the SHSAA office; and
 - d) when submitting enrolment numbers as required by the SHSAA bylaws, the school shall only report the numbers reported to the Ministry of Education and any adjustments for classification purposes will be completed by the SHSAA office upon receipt of form E-18.

 - i. Confirmation that they have not been a high school student during the past 4 years (individuals within this four-year period may coach but cannot be the sole individual responsible to coach or supervise a school team or student-athlete), and
 - At least two letters of reference References acceptable to the Member which attest to the qualifications and suitability of the individual to supervise and coach students of school age, and
 - iii. has completed or is currently enrolled in the 'Fundamentals of Coaching' offered online at SchoolCoach.ca (enrolled by the E-5 date of the activity of the school year and completed by the beginning of the SHSAA playoffs for that activity), and
 - iv. a clear criminal record check, if requested to do so by the Member. Members shall request such checks unless in their opinion, considering the best interests of the students, it is unnecessary to do so.

Notice of Eligible Players

- For each sport a List of Eligible Players Form (From E-5) notifying the Association of the list of eligible players for that sport must be completed for each team by the deadline date set for that sport in that school year or prior to the first competition for that team in that school year, whichever comes first.
 - a) In districts where the option to register additional (Grade 9-12: junior varsity, developmental, 'B', Blue, Green, etc.) teams in ExNet does not exist then all students and coaches representing the school in interschool play must be duly entered on the registration form for the school team.

- 2. If forms are submitted after the deadline date

 - c) Schools that participate in SHSAA playoffs with an incomplete eligibility form will be assessed a \$100 fine payable to the Association.

(The bottom 50% of schools would be entered in 2A and the top 50% of schools would be entered in 3A) *As a result the classification for 6-man football would be for schools with a maximum of 64 boys in Grades 10 – 12.*





m) LAST ROCK ADVANTAGE in regional play and provincial pool play will be awarded to the winner of the coin toss; in the provincial semi-final curling games will be awarded to the teams finishing first in their pools; in the provincial final games will be awarded to the team finishing first in their pool. If both first place finishers are in the final, then a coin toss will determine the last rock advantage. b) Team roster size is unlimited for 11v11. Roster size is capped at 14 for 7v7. The playoff roster for each 7v7 team will be set at a maximum of 14 for the first game of regional playoffs. No changes may be made to the roster for the remainder of the SHSAA playoffs. Rosters must be submitted to SHSAA Office and Event Host prior to the playoff beginning.

SOCCER SPORT ADVISORY GROUP SHSAA EXECUTIVECARRIED

16/10/02 BE IT RESOLVED that the following addition be made to 3 f) in the amendments for soccer:

3. RULES:

The SHSAA has adopted the FIFA (International) rules, with the following SHSAA amendments:

- f) **TIE MATCHES:** In regional and provincial playoff games, where there is a need to have a winner declared, should a match end in a tie at the end of regulation time:
 - 1) Overtime periods will be two 5-minute halves. For the Saturday games at the provincial tournament only, overtime shall consist of two 10-minute (5-minute for 7v7) halves before the shootout. The following procedures will be used at the end of regulation time:
 - A coin is tossed and the team that wins the toss decides which goal it will attack in the first half of overtime.
 - ii. The other team takes the kick-off to start the overtime.
 - iii. The team that wins the toss takes the kick-off to start the second half of overtime.
 - iv. In the second half of the match the teams change ends and attack the opposite goals.
 - v. There is no GOLDEN GOAL in effect


2) Each team shall take five penalty kicks. The kicks shall be taken in alternate order by five different players of each team at the same goal. No player shall kick more than once until all eligible players have had a kick. Each team shall utilize the same number of eligible players for penalty kicks. The eligible players are those who were on the field at the end of regulation play (see the appropriate ruling in the "Laws of the Game"). Only eligible players are allowed on the field during the penalty kicks.



BE IT RESOLVED that the STARTING HEIGHTS AND PROGRESSION FOR HIGH JUMP reflect the following changes.

11. STARTING HEIGHTS AND PROGRESSION:

A. HIGH JUMP:

The starting height of each high jump competition will be determined by the head official to allow each competitor a reasonable chance to clear at least one height. On each successive round, the bar shall be raised by either 5 cm, 3 cm, or 2 cm (the increment of the bar never increasing) at the discretion of the official in charge. The increment decision will be based upon the number of competitors left in the event and their collective ability in compliance with the rules set out by the I.A.A.F.

- a) Midget Girls start at 1.25 metres 5 cm advance to 1.50 metres 2 cm advance from 1.50 metres to completion **Junior and Senior Girls** start at 1.30 metres 5 cm advance to 1.55 metres 2 cm advance from 1.55 metres to completion - Midget Boys - start at 1.50 metres 5 cm advance to 1.70 metres 3 cm advance from 1.70 to 1.79 metres 2 cm advance from 1.79 metres to completion d) Junior Boys start at 1.55 metres 5 cm advance to 1.80 metres 3 cm advance from 1.80 to 1.89 metres 2 cm advance from 1.89 metres to completion e) Senior Boys - start at 1.60 metres 5 cm advance to 1.85 metres 3 cm advance from 1.85 to 1.91 metres 2 cm advance from 1.91 metres to completion

11. STARTING HEIGHTS AND PROGRESSION:

A. HIGH JUMP:

The starting height of each high jump competition will be determined by the head official to allow each competitor a reasonable chance to clear at least one height. On each successive round, the bar shall be raised by either 5 cm, 3 cm, or 2 cm (the increment of the bar never increasing) at the discretion of the official in charge. The increment decision will be based upon the number of competitors left in the event and their collective ability in compliance with the rules set out by the I.A.A.F. The following heights are suggestions only:

- a) Midget Girls
 - start at 1.25 metres
 - 5 cm advance to 1.50 metres
 - 2 cm advance from 1.50 metres to completion
- b) Junior and Senior Girls
 - start at 1.30 metres
 - 5 cm advance to 1.55 metres
 - 2 cm advance from 1.55 metres to completion
- c) Midget Boys
 - start at 1.50 metres
 - 5 cm advance to 1.70 metres
 - 3 cm advance from 1.70 to 1.79 metres
 - 2 cm advance from 1.79 metres to completion
- d) Junior Boys
 - start at 1.55 metres
 - 5 cm advance to 1.80 metres
 - 3 cm advance from 1.80 to 1.89 metres
 - 2 cm advance from 1.89 metres to completion
- e) Senior Boys
 - start at 1.60 metres
 - 5 cm advance to 1.85 metres
 - 3 cm advance from 1.85 to 1.91 metres
 - 2 cm advance from 1.91 metres to completion

All playoff matches would continue to be played with the third set to 25 points.

4. PROVINCIAL TOURNAMENTS:

A. Conference Tournaments:

- a) ALL TEAMS entered in volleyball in each classification 1A 4A will be distributed into one of four three regions.
- b) Regions with nine or more teams will be divided into conference tournaments as determined by the SHSAA office with two or more teams advancing from each conference tournament to the regional tournament. Regions with eight or fewer teams entered will advance directly to a regional playoff with no conference playoff conducted.
- c) The SHSAA will seed and post draws on the SHSAA website.

B. Regional Tournaments:

- a) In the 1A, 2A, 3A and 4A categories, all teams entered in volleyball must qualify for the regional tournament by:
 - 1) winning the conference
 - 2) finishing second in the conference
 - 3) finishing third in a conference when only two conferences are in the region
- b) Four Three regional tournaments will be conducted in each of the above classifications for boys and girls. The four three regional tournaments will consist of six to eight teams.
- c) All regional tournaments will be contested as a two-pool round robin tournament. The top two teams from each pool make the playoff round and the top two three teams will advance to provincials. In six-team regional tournaments, the pool assignment will be as follows:

Pool A - #1, #3, #6 Pool B - #2, #4, #5

- d) In order to properly seed the regional tournaments, the SHSAA requires confirmation of season results from ALL TEAMS ENTERED IN VOLLEYBALL. Seeding forms are available on the SHSAA website.
- e) The host locations for the Conference and Regional tournaments in each category will be posted on the SHSAA website and in the September Newsletter.
- f) In the 5A category there will be four regional tournaments: Saskatoon, Regina, North and South. The Saskatoon and Regina regional representatives (2 each) will be determined through their respective leagues.
- g) The North and South 5A Regional Tournaments will consist of two pools; round-robin play with the top three teams of each pool meeting in single-elimination contests to determine the top three places.

C. Provincial Tournaments:

 a) Provincial tournaments will consist of ten teams in all categories. The ten finalists in each division will be decided in the following manner:

- 1) The host team.
- In the 1A, 2A, 3A and 4A classifications, the top two three teams from each of the four three regional tournaments will advance to the provincial championship.
- 3) The third place team from the regional of the previous year's gold medalist.
- 4) In the 5A classification, the provincial championship will consist of ten teams. BE IT RESOLVED that the conference and regional playoff format be amended as follows:

4. PROVINCIAL TOURNAMENTS:

A. Conference Tournaments:

- ALL TEAMS entered in volleyball in each classification 1A 4A will be distributed into one
 of four three regions for classifications with 54 or less teams. For classifications of 55
 teams or more, distribution of teams will be into four regions.
- b) Regions with nine or more teams will be divided into conference tournaments as determined by the SHSAA office with two or more teams advancing from each conference tournament to the regional tournament. Regions with eight or fewer teams entered will advance directly to a regional playoff with no conference playoff conducted.
- c) The SHSAA will seed and post draws on the SHSAA website.

B. Regional Tournaments:

As "on the mat" video is not provided at SHSAA wrestling competitions, the Jury of Appeal will not function to review the scoring of the match or particular periods of action during the match. The "white paddle challenge" is not in effect for SHSAA competitions. The "Challenge" process as outlined in the Wrestling Canada Rulebook will be in use. The use of on-mat video will be utilized if made available by the committee responsible for hosting the event on behalf of the SHSAA.
