

Medicine Hat Soccer Association Coach Code of Conduct

This year as a **COACH** I agree to...

- 1. Remember that young athletes have other interests and obligations and may not be able to attend every game or practice.
- 2. Teach my athletes to "**Honor the Game**". I will teach and reinforce fair play, respect for the letter and spirit of the rules, respect for the officials and our opponents.
- 3. Ensure that all athletes are treated fairly when providing instruction, lending support and allocating playing time...regardless of their ability!
- 4. Not ridicule or yell at my athletes for making mistakes or for performing poorly. I will remember that children play to have fun and must be encouraged to have confidence in themselves. I will praise publicly and, when necessary, correct privately (i.e. **away** from the team and with a parent if felt necessary).
- 5. Ensure that equipment and facilities are safe. This includes ensuring that all athletes are wearing shin guards and have removed all jewelry.
- 6. Get recommendations from a physician and support from a parent before allowing a player to participate following a serious injury (i.e. any injury that keeps players out for greater than one week). I will ensure a letter of consent from a physician and/or parent is received before allowing the player to participate again in practices or games.
- 7. Obtain proper training and continue to upgrade my coaching education/skills on a regular basis.
- 8. Remain open to feedback from players, parents, the association and/or the director responsible for my program.
- 9. Resolve team/player conflict by...
 - a) Talking directly to the player(s) in question **away** from the rest of the team,
 - b) Talking directly with the player(s) and their parents in question **away** from the rest of the team if the initial behavior has not changed, and/or
 - c) Setting up a Parent/Coach/Player Meeting with Mini/Minor Director if steps "a" and "b" do not resolve the issue in question.
- 10. Complete a mid-season feedback session with the parents/players on the team I am responsible for. Feedback will be open to what parents/players would like to see stopped, started, or continued within their team. I agree to forward this information to the association once it has been compiled.
- 11. Speak in a manner that positively promotes and supports our program, the association, association volunteers and association staff.
- 12. Follow the **24-Hour Rule** when expressing concerns to players, to parents, to any of the coaching team, association volunteers or staff.
