4. Rules & Regulations Review - additions and subtractions

Coach Transfer Rule - a coach can move from club to club, but only relatives are eligible to play under said coach. The players moving count against the transfer rule.

AAA Transfer Rule - AAA players will count against an association's new player cap if they have been out of a CCYHL Member Association for one year. If a AAA Player is returning to their home association, they do not count against the cap.

AAA players will not count against an association's new player cap if they have been out a CCYHL Member Association for two or more years.
