

PARENT'S AND SPECTATOR'S CODE OF CONDUCT

PYLGSA

Mission Statement

The mission of parents and spectators participating in Placentia Yorba Linda Girls Softball is to provide positive support and encouragement for their child participating in PYLGSA. Ensure a sports environment that is safe, educational and fun for all PYLGSA participants.

Code of Conduct

- I will encourage good sportsmanship by demonstrating positive support for all players, parents, coaches and umpires, at every practice, game and/or other league function.
- I will place the emotional and physical wellbeing of the youth participants ahead of any desire for my child's personal success or my desire to win.
- I will support the coaches' decisions, and utilize PYLGSA recommended lines of communication to address any problems that may arise.
- I will demand a sports environment that is free from drugs, alcohol, abusive language and behavior, smoking on school property, and will refrain from the same at all PYLGSA events.
- I will do my part to ensure that all players have a safe and healthy environment in which to play.
- I will respect and teach my child to respect the property of PYLGSA and the City of Placentia, City of Yorba Linda, and the PYLUSD.
- I will teach my child to treat other players, coaches, fans, umpires and league officials with respect. Respect should be afforded regardless of race, sex, creed, ability or team affiliation.
- I will help my child enjoy participating in PYLGSA by doing whatever I can, such as being a respectful fan, assisting with coaching, field service, trash pickup or providing transportation.
- I will always remember that PYLGSA is a youth sports organization, and the game is for children and not adults.
- I will advise my daughter to be considerate and cautious in her use of social media, and provide a positive example for her to follow.

Snack Bar Policy: If a parent/guardian misses (or is more than 15 minutes tardy) for an assigned snack bar shift, then the player will be suspended for the next scheduled game.

The parent/guardian may be assigned to a shift at a later date to be determined by the snack bar coordinator. If the parent missed a second assigned shift, then the player will be suspended for the next two scheduled games and the matter to be brought forward to the PYLGSA Board for further action. If the parent/guardian is unable to fulfill their snack bar obligation, then the parent/guardian must find a replacement. (Must be 16 or over/18 Over to work BBQ) It is still the parent/guardian's responsibility to make sure that the replacement shows up for the shift. Initial _____
