

In New Jersey ... It's The Law

CURRENT VERSION OF TEXT

An Act concerning protective eyewear for certain children and supplementing Title 5 of the Revised Statutes.

Be It Enacted by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

1. Any child who wears corrective eyeglasses while participating in racquetball, squash, tennis, women's lacrosse, basketball, women's field hockey, badminton, paddleball, soccer, volleyball, baseball or softball, sponsored by a school, community or government agency, shall be required to wear protective eyewear that meets the frames ¹and lens¹ standards of the American Society for Testing and Materials (ASTM) F803 ¹and lens standards of the American National Standards Institute (ANSI) Z87.1¹.
2. The New Jersey Council on Physical Fitness and Sports, established under P. L. 1999, c. 265 (C.26:1A-37.5 et seq.) is authorized to provide grants to assist low-income families in purchasing the protective eyewear. As used in this section, a "low-income family" means a family which qualifies for low-income housing under the standards promulgated by the Council on Affordable Housing pursuant to the "Fair Housing Act," P. L. 1985, c. 222 (C.52:27D-301 et ¹seq.] al.1).
3. No school, community or government agency engaged in organizing, teaching, refereeing or coaching a sports activity described in section ¹of this act shall be liable in a civil action for failure to administer or enforce the provisions of this act.
4. This act shall take effect six months after the date of enactment.
