BASEBALLS:

EMERGENCY WEATHER SHELTER:

TOURNAMENT FORMAT:

Teams will be allowed to take infield only if time allows. We have all veteran umpires. Once game starts they control play. Home team will be decided by a coin flip. All teams will play two games on Friday and two games on Saturday (except for 9's). Medals will be awarded to the 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place teams.

CONCESSIONS AND ADMISSION:

Concessions are available at all fields. Rest rooms are available at all parks. There will be a \$5 admission charge for adults each day. Students (17 and under), players, and coaches will be admitted free.

TRF Cal Ripken 10-11-12 Year Old Tournament Rules

REGULAR BASEBALL RULES WILL APPLY EXCEPT FOR THE FOLLOWING

Games are 6 innings in length. 10-run rule after 4 innings. However, after 90 minutes the next inning started will be the last inning. EXAMPLE--5:00 game, it is 6:30 and it is the bottom of the 3rd. The 4th inning will be the last inning. In case of a tie we will put a runner at 2nd base (the runner will be the last out of the previous inning) with one out for the bottom and top of the inning to determine the winner.

Pitchers may not pitch in more than 6 innings in 2 consecutive games. (1 pitch=1 inning). This is a rolling six format.

The second trip to the mound in the same inning to the same pitcher shall automatically result in the removal of that pitcher from the game as a pitcher only.

If a runner attempting to reach home plate intentionally and maliciously runs into a defensive player in the area of home plate, he will be called out on the play and ejected from the game.

There are no balks. Catchers do not have to catch the third strike in order for the batter to be called out.

Baserunners may not leave the base until the ball reaches the batter. The violation by one runner shall affect all other runners. PENALTY—ball is not dead—after the play is completed the runners must return back as far as they can go. No runs may score if the runners leave early with the bases loaded and the batter bunts or hits the ball in the infield. EXAMPLE—runner on first leaves early—hitter singles—runner advances to third. RULING—send runner back to second. Any outs recorded during the play will stand.

The standard re-entry rule will be used. There is no designated hitter or courtesy runner allowed. An extra hitter may be used so that a team may bat 10 players. The extra hitter will be treated as any other starter. If teams want to bat the entire lineup they may do so as well. So you either bat 9 or 10 or the entire lineup.

The mound is 46 feet from home plate and the bases are 65 feet in length.

In case a game needs to go to extra innings a runner will be placed at second base (the last person out of the previous inning) with no outs. If after that full inning the game is still a tie, the game will end in a tie.
