## **1972 FOOTBALL COACH OF THE YEAR**

### **RON STRUCK**



Ron Struck, present football coach at Belle Fourche High School was chosen 1972 Football coach of the Year while coaching at Colome, South Dakota. In his three years of coaching at Colome his team suffered defeat only two times and won 24 games. In the 1972 season his team was 9-0 and was ranked number two in the state.

Struck was a standout athlete at New Effington and was a two-sport letterman at Dakota State from 1966-70. For his outstanding coaching record the S.D.H.S.C.A. elected him 1972 Football Coach of the Year.

### JOHN BRUCE



John Bruce attended high school at Milbank where he lettered three years in football, basketball and track. He graduated from high school in 1960 and from S.D.S.U. in 1964.

In nine years as a coach he has run up a 154-62 win-loss record in basketball and also sports a 44-6-2 record as a football coach at Hayti. During his coaching tenure he has coached four teams to state tournament berths with one State Championship while coaching at Britton. For these accomplishments the S.D.H.S.C.A. has selected John Bruce as the 1973 Basketball Coach of the Year.

## **1973 WRESTLING COACH OF THE YEAR**

### **MARV SHERRILL**



In six years of coaching, one at Brookings and five at Watertown, Marv Sherrill has a 57-26-3 dual match record. He has coached State Championship squads in 1972 and 1973, and a runner-up squad in 1972. His wrestlers have captured eleven individual state titles and two of them have won All America honors.

For these accomplishments the S.D.H.S.C.A. has selected Marv Sherrill as the 1973 Wrestling Coach of the Year.

## **1973 TRACK COACH OF THE YEAR**

### **RICH GREENO**



Rich Greeno's coaching began at Phillip in 1950-51, where he coached football, basketball, and track. From 1954-68 he was at Yankton High School. While at Yankton his teams won four E.S.D. Conference track titles and two cross-country championships. During one stretch his Buck cross-country teams won 23 straight dual and triangular meets. Twice his Yankton squads finished second in the state track meet.

He has guided the Lincoln Patriots to four state track titles and three consecutive cross-country crowns in five years. For all these feats the S.D.H.S.C.A. voted him Track Coach of the Year for the second time; the first time being in 1969.

### ELMER HANSEN



The S.D.H.S.C.A. Distinguished Service Award is given for "outstanding achievement and contributions to high school athletic programs". In 1973 two persons, Elmer Hansen and Philip McKeoun are honored.

Elmer Hansen coached and taught for 40 years before retiring in 1970. He spent 34 of those years coaching at Washington High School. At Washington he was head coach in track and cross country from 1949 until retirement. During these years he coached 11 state championship teams, five E.S.D. crowns, and 19 regional crowns. For these many accomplishments Elmer Hansen was chosen one of the 1973 Distinguished Service recipients.

### **PHILIP McKEOUN**



Philip McKeoun, Webster's super fan, who retired from the U.S. Postal Service in 1968 after 50 years of service, marked the beginning of his "career" in 1924 when he took four senior boys to see the Hobo Day game at Brookings. Little did he realize he would spend the next 44 years helping high school athletes by taking them to games and supporting their games.

His activities are well summed up in a plaque he received in 1967 from the Webster High School athletes: "The youth, past and present, acknowledge a great debt of gratitude for his encouragement, for his generosity, and for the many memorable occasions he has made possible". For this dedicated support of high school athletics the S.D.H.S.C.A. presents a Distinguished Service Award to Philip McKeoun.

## 1973 DISTRICT 7 - TRACK COACH OF THE YEAR

### MEL MINTON



For 43 years of successful coaching, Mel Minton was selected the NHS/ACA's District 7 Track Coach of the Year. Minton's tenure includes 23 years at Deadwood and 20 years to Rapid City Central. Minton's track teams at Central won three successive state track titles in 1964, 65, and 66. His cross-country team in 1964 also won the state title. Mel was previously honored by the South Dakota Sports Writer as the 1965 Track Coach of the Year. For these accomplishments Mel Minton was chosen District 7 Track Coach of the Year. (District 7 includes South Dakota, North Dakota, Nebraska, Wyoming, Montana, and Idaho).
