Hawk, a native of Wessington Springs, owns a lifetime record of 130-39-2 in football. He has coached conference championship teams in thirteen of the twenty years he has coached.

He has previously won SDHSCA Football Coach of the Year in 1970, Sportwriters Coach of the Year in 1971, District 7 Football Coach of the Year in 1971, and was recently honored as a Hall of Famer at Northern State College.

Max and his wife Jane have three children, Lynne a freshman in college, Monte a junior in high school, and Jenny an eighth grader.

Pierre du Charme, a Barnesville, Minn., native and North Dakota State graduate, guided his Aberdeen team to a 13-1 Eastern South Dakota Conference title. His over-all record of 20-4 stands as a best-ever record for an Aberdeen Eagle team.

"Being named Coach of the Year by my fellow coaches is one of the greatest honors I could ever hope to achieve," said du Charme. He has since left the Aberdeen school to become head basketball coach at Mayville State College in North Dakota.

Tom Long, of Rapid City Stevens, one of the state's most successful high school wrestling coaches, has been named Wrestling Coach of the Year by the S.D.H.S.C.A.

Long's 1975-76 Stevens team captured its second straight Class "A" title. During the regular season his Raiders won all thirteen dual matches.

Long coached three state championship teams at Rapid City Central before becoming Stevens' wrestling coach in 1969. He began his coaching career in 1952 at Bridgeport, Nebraska and moved to Rapid City four years later where he has won more state wrestling titles than any other South Dakota Coach.

Lounsbery, a Centerville native, has been the Centerville Tornadoes track coach for seven years. His team captured the State "B" title in 1976 after finishing runner-up in 1975. His coaching tenure also includes five years coaching all sports at Tulare and one year of basketball and track at Custer.

Ron modestly says, "Any time one receives an honor like this there are a lot of people involved like assistant coaches, the kids, the school, and the administration."

LAVERNE DIEDE

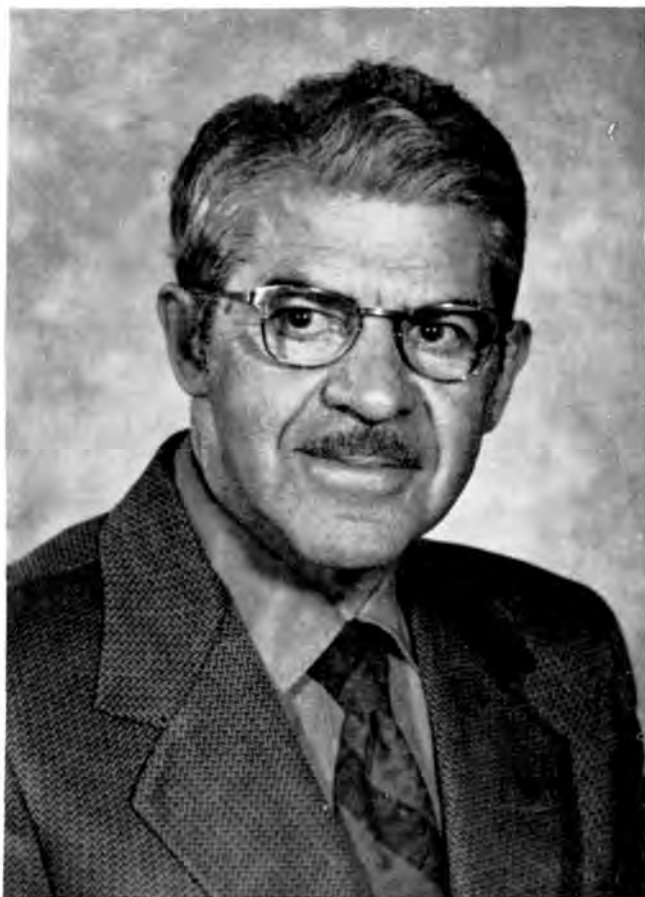

Pascale serves as team doctor for all their athletic teams. He is the familiar voice on the loudspeaker at all local football games and the timer for all home basketball contests. Dr. Pascale also gives the physicals and treats athletic injuries for the school in Irene, Wakonda and Beresford. (a total of over 6,000 physical exams to area athletes in forty-two years.)

He has been the Honor Athlete at the Centerville Athletic Banquet and was named the first Tornado Track Booster at the first annual Centerville Rotary Track and Field Meet.

Jim Quinn coached and taught at Sturgis, Kadoka, Vale, Hill City, Faith, and Rapid City. He won conference championships in all three major sports at Hill City and revived and won track championships at Faith. Quinn served the Basin League seven years as secretary-treasurer, over ten years as statistician and also published their newspaper and annual.

A founder of the Rushmore Coaches Club in 1960, he served as its president in 1969-70. Quinn has served on the Rapid City Chamber of Commerce Sports Committee since its inception in 1973.

In 1975 Quinn founded a publishing service to do program books for area athletic teams and events.
