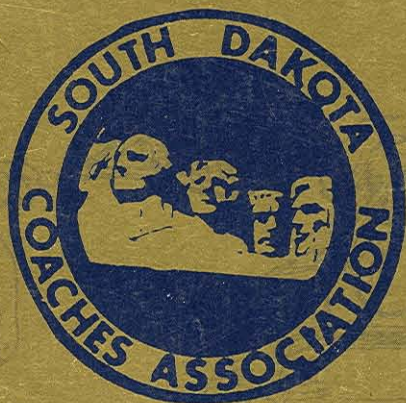

Thelen began coaching at Montrose in 1977 — his first experience with nine-man football. His teams have won two consecutive state Class 9-A championships against schools with much larger enrollments. "The kids, the community, and my assistants are the ones who deserve the credit," Thelen says.

A graduate of Riggs High School, Pierre, Thelen attended USD/S and graduated from Dakota State College.



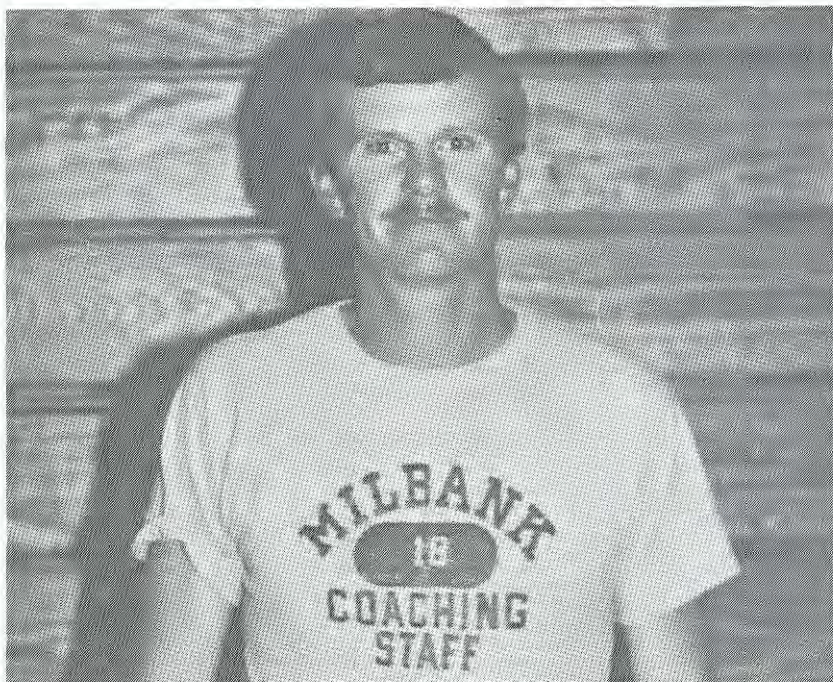
1984 BOYS CROSS COUNTRY COACH OF THE YEAR

Watertown's veteran coach guided his runners to the Eastern South Dakota Conference championship. McElroy began the season with an inexperienced lineup, but they developed well and also placed fourth in the state Class AA competition.



1984 GIRLS CROSS COUNTRY COACH OF THE YEAR  
DICK WHERRY, MILBANK



Wherry was a rookie cross country coach six years ago and anxious to give it a try. In a four-year time span his girls won 23 consecutive Northeast Conference dual meets. In 1984 they won all but one meet and were tied for third at the state meet, claiming fourth place because of tie-breaking procedures.

JIM HOLWERDA, BROOKINGS

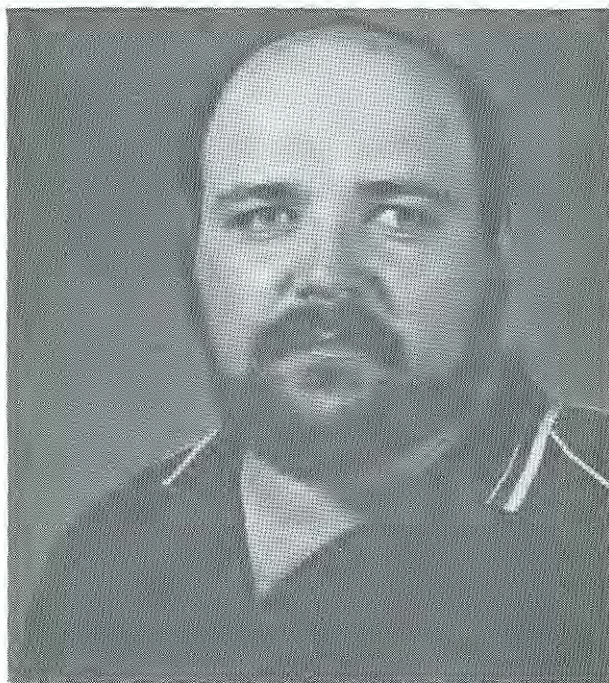


Brookings had a group of talent-laden players, and they blended into a perfect mixture. They came through the regular season undefeated, won the E.S.D. Conference title, the region and the long-awaited state championship.

1985 WRESTLING COACH OF THE YEAR

Philip's teams had a 48-12 record in dual meets during Dolezal's tenure as head coach. Last season they won district and region meets and placed second in the state Class "B" tournament.

"Our program has been benefitted by the attitude of our athletes. And we get good community support."



1985 GYMNASTICS COACH OF THE YEAR  
LOLLY FORSETH, SIOUX FALLS



Sioux Falls Lincoln's team had a 12-1 record and with a great deal of team effort won the Class "A" state championship.

"Communication is the key. Winning is really nice; but more importantly, you hope to teach things like citizenship, discipline and loyalty."



**1985 BOYS BASKETBALL COACH OF THE YEAR  
GARY MUNSEN, MITCHELL**

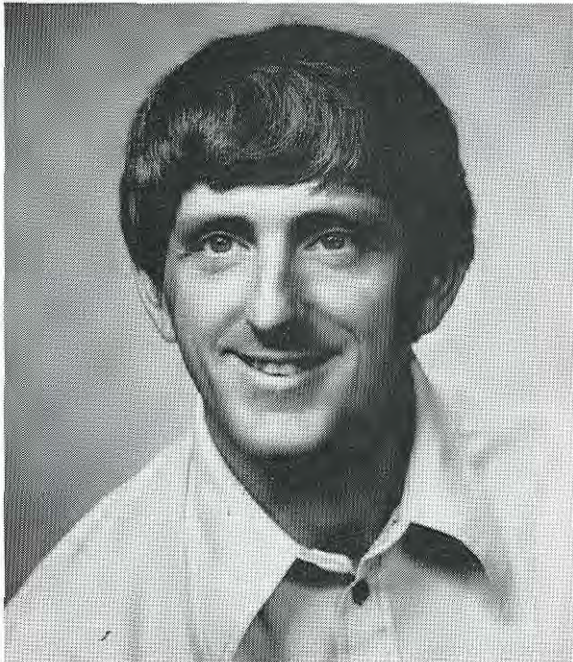


Munsen guided the Kernels to a 23-0 season and their second consecutive State "A" championship. His Kernel teams have won eight Region 5 titles and four E.S.D. Conference crowns, and have a 30-game winning streak. "My kids and assistant coaches deserve this honor as much as I do," Munsen said.

Munsen was an all-state football and basketball player at White Lake and earned his degree at Dakota State College in 1966. He owns a 259-105 career record in his fifteen years as a varsity coach.



1985 VOLLEYBALL COACH OF THE YEAR  
GALEN BUSCH, MISSION



Busch guided the Todd County Falcons to a 26-5 season record, a region title and third place in the state Class "A" meet this year. The outstanding season was somewhat of a surprise after the Falcons lost thirteen matches the previous year. "We made a commitment to do much better," Busch said.

He has coached Todd County to a 162-47 record in seven years as head coach and credits the school and town with solid support for the volleyball program. This is the second time in three years that Busch has been named Coach of the Year in volleyball.



**1985 BOYS TRACK COACH OF THE YEAR  
LYLE CLAUSSEN, BRANDON**

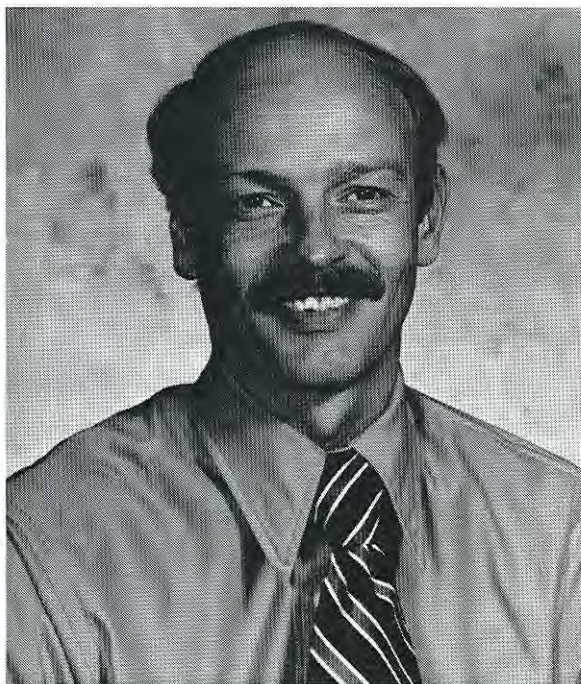


Claussen has coached the Brandon Valley Lynx for thirteen years. His boys' team won the Class "AA" state championship this year.

Claussen has been active in the state and national coaches associations and last year was the first recipient of the Max Hawk Award.



1985 GIRLS TRACK COACH OF THE YEAR  
JOHN HUTH, ABERDEEN



Huth's girls' team was second in the E.S.D. Conference meet, won the Region 1AA title, and placed fifth in the state Class AA meet, in his eighth year at Aberdeen Central. He also coached the boys' team to the Region 1AA track title.

He stated, "It was a great honor . . . It is a real humbling thing for me because I know very well in track and field that a lot of your success is determined by the athletes you have and the coaches you have."



1985 GOLF COACH OF THE YEAR  
NORMAN WEST, YANKTON

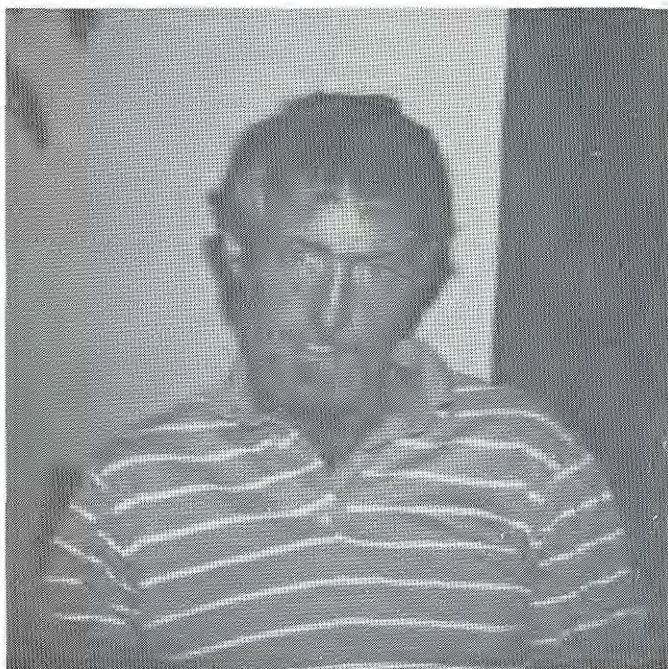


West's boys' golf teams have won three straight Class "A" championships and have won five overall. His girls' teams have won all six of the girls' regionals and have been fifth or better in six of the last ten state meets. The boys' teams, under his direction, have won the E.S.D. five times and have been in the top four in fifteen of the last twenty years; they've won 18 of 20 regional crowns, and have been in the top four in the Class "A" state competition in 13 of 20 years.

"The real joy of coaching comes from being a part of young people's lives. Losing is a learning experience and winning is a momentary high which makes for good memories," he said. West was the District 6 nominee for National Coach of the Year by the NHSACA in 1984.



1985 TENNIS COACH OF THE YEAR  
SHERWOOD HATCH, BROOKINGS

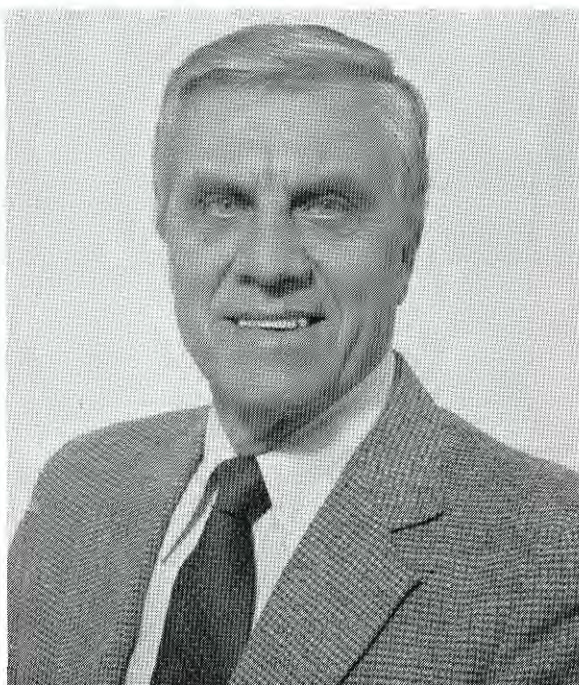


Hatch took a young team of sophomores and one senior and molded them into a team of state contenders. The boys compiled a 10-2 dual record, won the E.S.D. Conference title and capped the season by finishing second in the state tournament.

Hatch has been at the helm for seven years and has led his squad to four E.S.D. championships and two state runner-up finishes. "I've just had outstanding tennis players over the years. And you can attribute that to the city of Brookings as much as anything," he said.



**1985 ATHLETIC DIRECTOR OF THE YEAR  
LLOYD DOBRATZ, SIOUX FALLS**

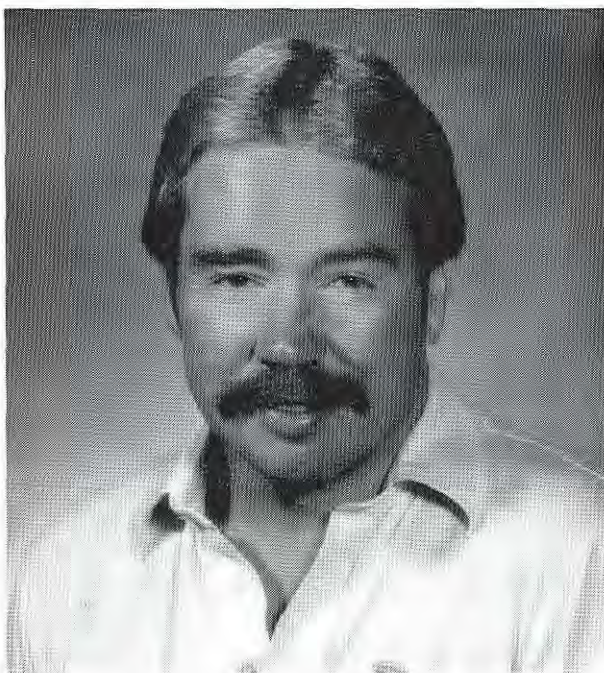


Dobratz has been involved in sports all his life, and he's been in public education for the last 35 years. Following teaching, coaching and administrative experience at Platte, he moved to Sioux Falls in 1965 where he served at Washington High and later Lincoln High before becoming Athletic Director of the public schools.

He said, "In Sioux Falls the coaches are teachers first and coaches second. There's the friendship, fellowship, camaraderie of all the people you work with. As a teacher, administrator and coach, it's great fun working with young people. It's like I'm the old stagecoach and each year I get new, young horses."



1985 DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARD  
THOMAS P. WALSH, SR.



Given for outstanding contributions to high school athletics and dedication to the highest and best in high school athletics.

Walsh is a 1966 O'Gorman graduate, a VISTA volunteer, and a 1972 Augustana graduate. His community involvement includes support of and fund drives for activities such as baseball, soccer, football, gymnastics, bowling, volleyball and Special Olympics. Through his ownership in Burger King, his influence and effort stretch across the state of South Dakota. Five years ago Walsh began the sponsorship of the Coach of the Year rings which are presented by the S.D.H.S.C.A. in nine different sports.



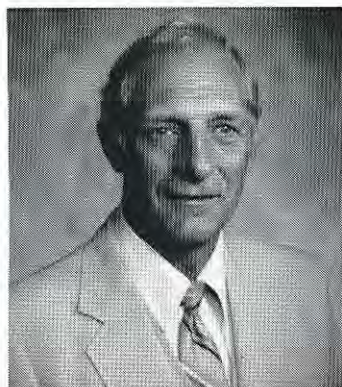
**1985 SPORTSCASTER OF THE YEAR  
JIM BURT, SIOUX FALLS**



Burt is a veteran of forty-five years in the broadcasting and sportscasting field, with thirty-nine of those years at KELO in Sioux Falls. He grew up in Melcher, Iowa, and attended Drake University.

He had thirty-three consecutive years of broadcasting and/or telecasting South Dakota state high school basketball tournaments and was the first to televise the state football championships on KELO-Land TV. He was the first TV sportscaster in the area from the time his station signed on in 1953, and his voice is one of the most recognized of those heard over KELO Radio.

*The high distinction service effort may have been performed in any non-active coaching position either directly or indirectly associated with the conduct of or the promotion of interscholastic athletics and/or the coaching profession.*

Max Hawk received his education at Wessington Springs, Northern State College (B.S. and M.S.) and additional hours at the University of South Dakota. He and his wife, Jane, have two daughters - Mrs. Bill (Lynne) Tramp in Bozeman, Montana, and Jennifer in Dallas, Texas.

His teaching/coaching career began at Scotland in 1957, and he moved to Yankton in 1965, continuing to coach football and track and teach math and physical education. Hawk's coaching record in football is 203-51-2, with eight state championships and eighteen conference championships.

Professional offices held: SDHSCA President 1968; SDHSCA Executive Secretary since 1970; NHSACA Executive Committeeman 1968-76; NHSACA President 1979-80.

Professional honors: District 6 Distinguished Service Award, Three times District 6 Football Coach of the Year, Three times S.D. Football Coach of the Year, Northern State College Hall of Fame, SDHSCA Hall of Fame, N.S.C. Distinguished Alumni, Champion Midwest Football Coach of the Year, establishment of the Max Hawk Award.

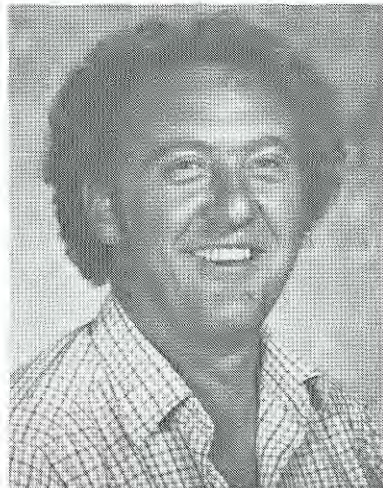

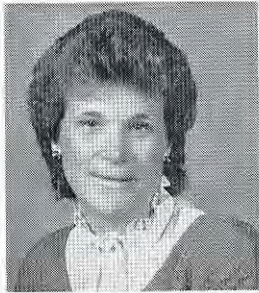
