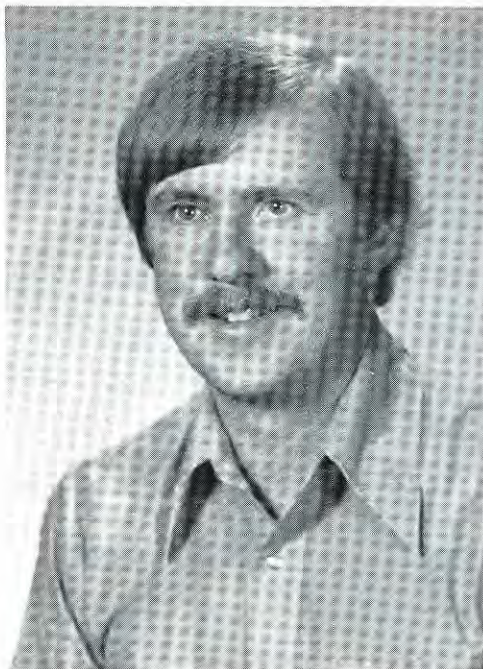

1985 FOOTBALL COACH OF THE YEAR  
STEVE ENTRINGER, TRIPP

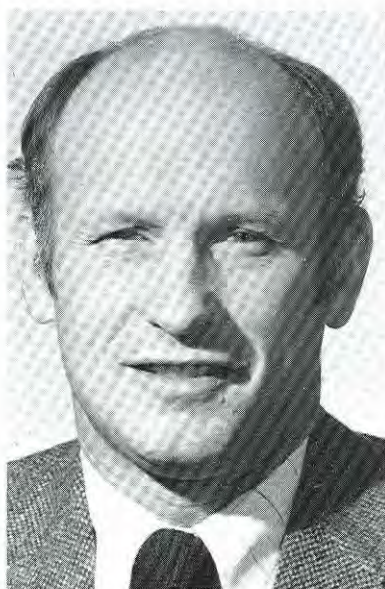


Entringer has directed the Tripp Wildcats to three consecutive state Class 9B football titles. Under his guidance they won conference titles in 1975, 1979, 1983 and 1985, going unbeaten twice.

A graduate of Dakota State College in 1969, Entringer coached in Letcher and Wolsey prior to coming to Tripp in 1974. "We've always had a team-oriented group of kids. We've had years where we've not had the super talent, yet we were successful because the kids played together as a team."



**1985 BOYS CROSS COUNTRY COACH OF THE YEAR  
JOHN HOUSKA, RAPID CITY CENTRAL**

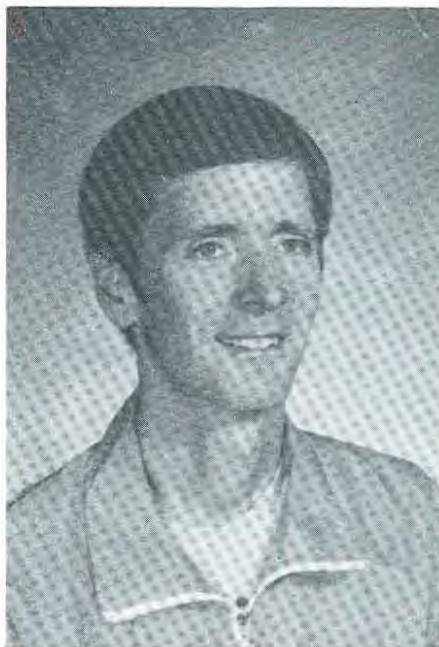


Houska's 1985 team won the school's first state title since 1964. "This team had a lot of closeness, and they combined this with talent and competitiveness."

A graduate of Chamberlain High School and Black Hills State College, Houska coached wrestling at Huron and Gregory. In 1976 he moved to Central and became their head cross country coach in 1984.



1985 GIRLS CROSS COUNTRY COACH OF THE YEAR  
ROGER LOECKER, HURON



Loecker's girls cross country teams have won a state title and finished as runnerup three times. They also have Eastern South Dakota Conference titles from 1981, 1984 and 1985. Loecker was named boys cross country coach at Huron in 1969 and took over the girls team as well in 1979.

1985 GIRLS BASKETBALL COACH OF THE YEAR  
CHARLIE SIZER, MILLER



Sizer, completing his sixth season at Miller, guided his 1985 team to a 25-1 record. His teams have compiled an 86-52 record at Miller. "Not only are they good basketball players, but they're also class ladies."

He taught and coached three years at Herried before joining the Miller staff in 1978.



1986 GYMNASTICS COACH OF THE YEAR  
LOLLY FORSETH, SIOUX FALLS



Forseth guided her team to a second straight Class A championship - her eleventh state champion team. Her gymnastics record is 118 - 8, and she has coached 24 individual state champions in her fourteen years in Sioux Falls.

1986 WRESTLING COACH OF THE YEAR  
BOB JOHNSON, KIMBALL



Johnson coached the Kiotes to the state Class B championship, with two individual champions. "It took a lot of hard work and a bunch of awful good kids to win the title."

A graduate of Sisseton High School and Augustana College, he has coached five years at Kimball and is the state director of the South Dakota Youth Wrestling Program.



1986 BOYS BASKETBALL COACH OF THE YEAR  
LARRY HESSING, NEW HOLLAND DAKOTA CHRISTIAN



Hessing directed the Cadets to the State B championship, with a 22-3 record. "We set our goals as we went along - just moved our goals up a notch at a time."

Hessing, from Oskaloosa, Iowa, graduated from Dordt College and has been at Dakota Christian for six years. He also serves as Athletic Director.



1986 VOLLEYBALL COACH OF THE YEAR  
JIM MITCHELL, ST. FRANCIS



Mitchell coached St. Francis to the Class B crown, coming from behind in the championship game. He credited senior leadership and support from the juniors as the key to victory.

Mitchell is a native of Phoenix and was a three-time collegiate All-American wrestler. His career at St. Francis began in 1979.



1986 BOYS TRACK COACH OF THE YEAR  
VERN MILLER, PIERRE

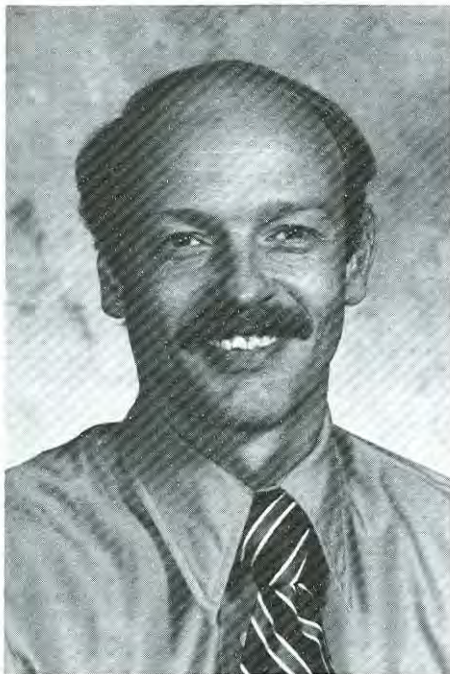


Miller, a Wessington Springs native, graduated from Northern State College in 1962 and coached in Fort Pierre and Gettysburg before moving to Pierre. His philosophy is "Hard work brings success. But there's also some luck involved."

The Governors won their first-ever E.S.D. Conference title this year, then the Region crown, and placed sixth in the state meet. "This award goes to our athletes, coaching staff and our community for their support."



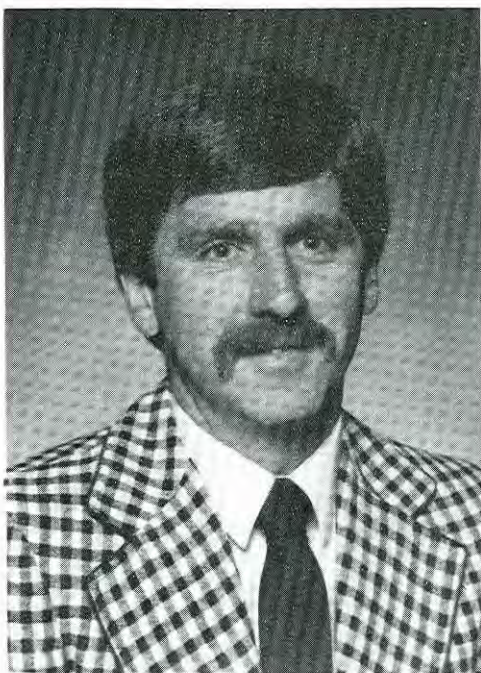
1986 GIRLS TRACK COACH OF THE YEAR  
JOHN HUTH, ABERDEEN



Huth of Aberdeen Central, was chosen for this honor for the second year in a row. His team won the school's first E.S.D. Conference title and second consecutive Region title. They placed seventh in the state meet this year and won all other meets where team points were kept.



1986 GOLF COACH OF THE YEAR  
DARYL FLETCHER, ELK POINT



Fletcher graduated from Dakota State College in 1973 and has coached at Elk Point since then, becoming golf coach in 1974. This year the boys' team placed fourth and the girls' team sixth in the state meets.

Fletcher said he relies on his ability to motivate young people to help him through his lack of golf expertise. "Elk Point is a golfing community - we have a tradition going here."



1986 TENNIS COACH OF THE YEAR  
PHIL TRAUTNER, PIERRE



Trautner's team went 10-1 in duals this year, making the Governors 46 - 2 over the last four years. His 21-year coaching record is 193 - 22, including four state titles.



1986 ATHLETIC DIRECTOR OF THE YEAR  
BARRY HUITEMA, HURON



"It's a great honor. There are a lot of other people tied into it outside of this position - coaching staff, faculty, administration, the community, and the encouragement of my family."

Huitema is a graduate of Yankton High School and Northern State College and coached in Colorado and Michigan before coming to Huron in 1983. In addition to his duties with the public schools, he doubles as the manager of the Huron Arena.



1986 DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARD  
WILLIAM "BILL" TIMMINS, MITCHELL



Given for outstanding contributions to high school athletics and dedication to the highest and best in high school athletics.

Timmins graduated from Mitchell High School and Dakota Wesleyan University and is in his 30th year of teaching at the high school. "I was born and raised in Mitchell, and I guess I've been athletically-minded all my life."

He serves as a timer and scorer, filmed football and basketball games for 28 years, and has helped with the baseball and track programs in Mitchell. One of his biggest contributions to Mitchell athletics is the trophy case for the high school. You name it, and Bill is around to help out.



1986 SPORTSWRITER OF THE YEAR  
BRUCE CONLEY, SIOUX FALLS



Bruce Conley has been covering the sports beat for the Sioux Falls Argus Leader for almost a quarter of a century - and has enjoyed every minute of it. Born in Sioux Falls, he is a graduate of Cathedral High School and South Dakota State University, joining the Argus Leader in 1962.

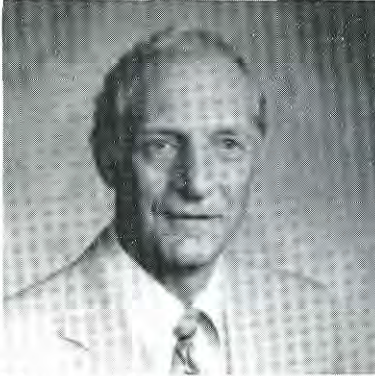

### WRESTLING

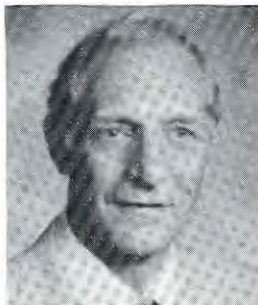
MARV SHERRILL, Watertown

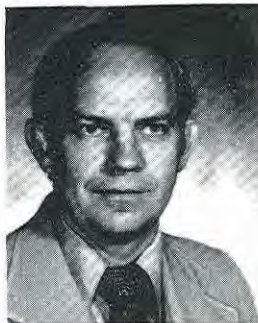
