**1990 FOOTBALL COACH OF THE YEAR  
CLARENCE KOOISTRA, Garretson**



In Clarence Kooistra's 23 years as the coach of the Garretson High School football team he had never coached a losing team - but he had never coached a state champion either. His 1990 edition of the Blue Dragons, although a young team, finally fulfilled his dream to become a state titleholder. Kooistra was named South Dakota High School Coach of the Year following the great 12-0 season.

A hands-on teaching coach who has always stressed confidence, team work and dedication, Kooistra brought his team back from a disappointing loss to Sully Buttes in the final game of 1989 by stressing a 'never quit' philosophy.

A Salem native, he graduated from Sioux Falls College and has spent his teaching and coaching career in Garretson.



1990 BOYS CROSS COUNTRY COACH OF THE YEAR  
JOHN HOUSKA, Rapid City



John Houska, who has developed state teams in both cross country and track and field, was named the boys Cross country coach of the year after his Cobblers won their fourth state title in the six years he has coached the sport. His other teams finished second in the big-school division.

The versatile Houska's track and field teams have strung a pair of state "AA" championships together the past two years also. Houska has coached at Rapid City for the past fifteen years.



1990 GIRLS CROSS COUNTRY COACH OF THE YEAR  
MIKE OLTMANN'S, Lennox



A perfect four-for-four, that's the enviable record posted by Mike Oltmanns' girls cross country team -- four state Class "A" titles in the past four years. For this great feat Oltmanns was named Girls Cross Country Coach of the Year.

An avid runner himself, this 35-year-old veteran coach attributed a great deal of his success to parent involvement. "With the parents' support," he said, "our girls really put in a hard-working fall, but it was worth it when we won state again."



1990 GIRLS BASKETBALL COACH OF THE YEAR  
CHERYL JENNER, Sisseton



Sisseton earned their first-ever trip to the girls' state Class "A" Tournament last year, and they made it pay off with a state championship. For guiding the Sisseton girls to the title, Cheryl was named the Girls Basketball Coach of the Year. She has coached at Sisseton for eleven years.

"Our team wanted the championship very much," said the successful coach. "You can do anything, if you really put your heart into it. The girls did this year."



**1991 GYMNASTICS COACH OF THE YEAR**  
**LOLLY FORSETH, Sioux Falls**

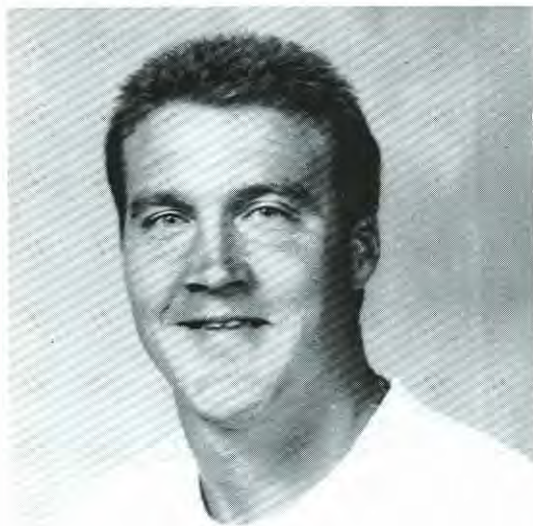

ANDY TATE, Mitchell

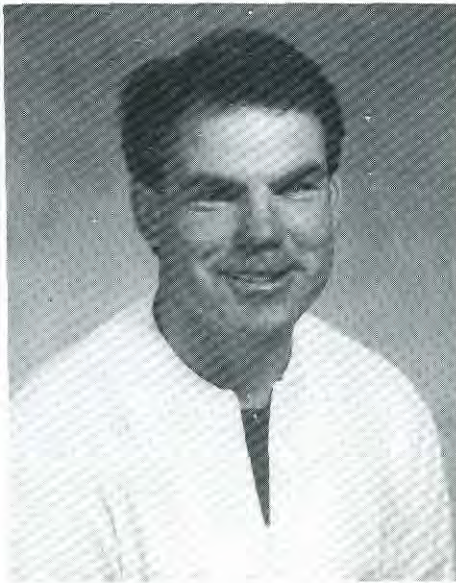

**1991 BOYS BASKETBALL COACH OF THE YEAR  
TIM HOOTEN, Lennox**



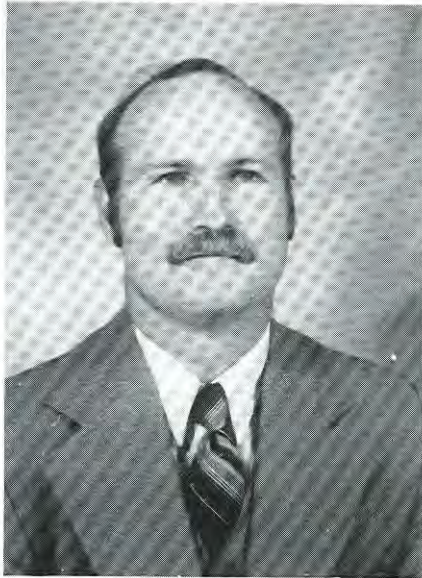
Tim Hooten, who has coached the Lennox Orioles boys' basketball team for eleven years, led his talented team to the state Class "A" championship. "It was a wire-to-wire year," he said. "We were put in the top spot after the first week of the year and stayed there until it was over. We decided early that we were number one, so let's prove it - and we did."

A South Dakota State University graduate, he has coached only at Lennox. "I think that a team becomes a reflection of the coach," he stated. "So if you coach with intensity and mental toughness, your team will play the same way."

The Orioles' superb play during the state tourney captured the fancy of the state's basketball fans.



1991 GOLF COACH OF THE YEAR  
MARV BOHNET, Hayti



Hamlin's boy and girl golf teams came close to a rare double this past spring, as the boys won the Class "B" golf title, and the girls were a solid second in their bid for the title. For this great effort Marv Bohnet was named South Dakota Golf Coach of the Year.

For the sixth year in a row a Hamlin girl was the Class "B" individual champion as Darla Christopherson won her third crown. In the boys' event Dean Miller led the Chargers to the crown in 1991 with a first place finish, and he was also top individual in 1989.



**1991 GIRLS TRACK COACH OF THE YEAR  
KLARK THOMPSEN, Lake Preston**



Klark Thompsen, who coached the Lake Preston Divers to the state Class "B" girls track championship for the second straight year, has been named Girls Track Coach of the Year for the second time.

A Lake Preston native, Thompsen taught and coached in Hitchcock for twelve years before returning to his home town, where he has coached for the past six years. He also has experience in coaching volleyball. Thompsen is a graduate of Dakota State in Madison.

JERRY KIPPES, Marion**



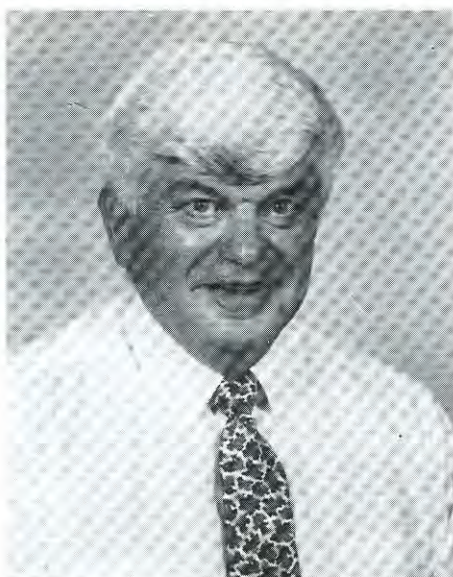

Kippes, who has taught in Marion for the past fourteen years has been the head track coach for the past five years. He began his teaching career in McIntosh eighteen years ago, after graduating from Dakota State College.

The championship won by the Bears this year was the first. Two members of this year's squad were his sons, and he also has a daughter on the girls' team.



**1991 VOLLEYBALL COACH OF THE YEAR  
SPENCER BRENDE, Elk Point**



Veteran Spencer Brende, whose volleyball program has been alive and well in Elk Point for the past thirteen years, finally made it to the top with this past season's team. His Lady Pointers won 29 and lost only eight during the year, then cruised to their first Class "B" volleyball crown.

Brende, named Volleyball Coach of the Year, complimented his championship team. "This team had everything - power, speed and defense," he said. "I have been fortunate. We really have an interest here, and the girls worked hard."

This was Brende's fifth state tournament team. "Our reputation is growing. Everyone wants to play us, if only to check to see how their own programs are coming," he said. "We are proud of that."



**1991 TENNIS COACH OF THE YEAR  
CHRIS DUMMERMUTH, Sioux Falls**



Five years ago some folks were wondering how the Sioux Falls Lincoln boys' tennis team would respond to a woman coach. That is no longer an enigma, since Chris Dummermuth has just been selected as the South Dakota Boys' Tennis Coach of the year for the second time in three years.

Her 1990-91 team reigns as the state champion - a fact that "gives me a great deal of satisfaction." the Patriots had been knocking on the door for the coveted title but fell just short until this past spring.



**1991 ASSISTANT COACH OF THE YEAR  
VERN MILLER, Pierre**



Vern Miller is a 29-year veteran of South Dakota coaching wars, but he rarely gets star billing. The long-time assistant basketball coach for the Pierre Governors has been named as the Assistant Coach of the Year, an honor that puts him in a well-deserved spot in the limelight.

The Wessington Springs native has worked with Francis Zacher at Ft. Pierre and at Gettysburg, then with Roger Pries, Bob Judson and Skip Kurth at Pierre Riggs High. As sophomore coach he had a big hand in developing the state championship teams in 1979 and 1982.

Miller stresses "hard work, dedication, and a desire to excell" as his coaching philosophy.



1991 ATHLETIC DIRECTOR OF THE YEAR  
KEN KECK, Clark



Ken Keck, who has served the Clark schools as Athletic Director for eighteen years has been named Athletic Director of the Year by the state coaches association.

Keck, an outstanding leader and a public-spirited educator, has served the state's A.D. Association, the Coaches Association, and the SDHSAA in a number of capacities and has been an influential voice in the constantly-changing world of high school athletics.

His broadcast experience includes football, basketball, some baseball, track and field, and other sports.

### **DODIE BEMIS, Watertown**



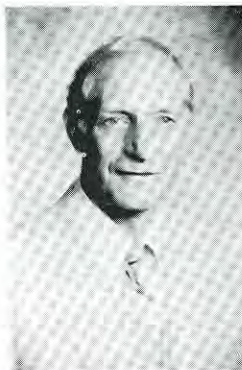

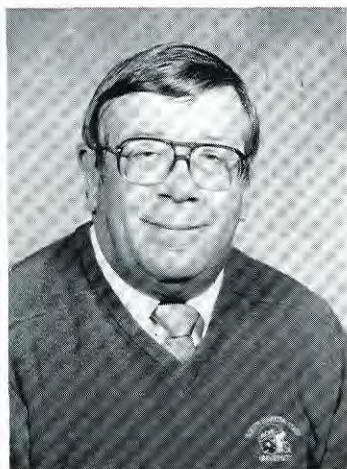
