## 2018 ALL-STAR CONSIDERATION

During our closing ceremonies for South Kitsap Eastern Little League, our league will be announcing the names of the players that will represent SKELL in the District 2 All-Star Tournaments. Most children ages 8-16 are eligible for consideration to be on an All-Star team.

The team age breakdowns are as follows:

- 8-10 Team (Can be from any division)
- 9-11 Team (Can be from any division)
- 11-12 Team (Must be from Majors rosters)
- 13-14 Team (Juniors)
- 15-16 Team (Seniors)

If you would like your child considered to be part of one of these teams, please be aware that there are requirements to be part of an All-Star team.

- Must have played 60% of the scheduled games for your team, unless injuries are covered by a Doctor.
- Must have an Original Birth Certificate. If you don't have one, you can get one from the Health Department for around \$30.00
- Three different Proofs of residency within our league boundary that is dated between **February 1, 2017 and January 31, 2018**.
- A school waiver form can be obtained from Kent or Brittany and signed by the school IF the school is within our boundaries. Using the school waiver form, you don't need any other proof, but you need it signed before school is out. If you want to go that route, get the form earlier than later. The form must be signed by someone that is authorized to sign on behalf of the school.
- These school qualify:
  - Manchester Elementary School
  - South Colby Elementary School
  - Orchard Heights Elementary School
  - Marcus Whitman Junior High
  - John Sedgwick Junior High
- Practices will start after closing ceremonies, around June 14<sup>th</sup> and teams will probably practice every evening
- The Tournaments will start on June 23<sup>th</sup> and go about 10 days.
- Games during the week could start as early as 9:00 AM

### **COST**

You will be required to purchase an All-Star uniform for you player. The jersey will be kept by the player after the tournament is complete. The jersey cost is around \$50.00. You will need to provide for your player baseball pants of a specific color that is selected by the All-Star Manager, a belt, and socks.

The individual teams may elect to purchase apparel such as a pullover jacket that is optional for the player to purchase. The league will provide the All-Star hat for the players.



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## **IT IS A PRIVILEGE AND AN HONOR TO BE AN ALL-STAR, IT IS NOT A RIGHT !**

### **100% Commitment is needed by the players and parents.**

If you feel that you cannot commit 100% or already have vacation plans during any of the dates, please do not say yes on the sheet that comes around in the coming weeks. Talk to Kent or Brittany about when you are going to be unavailable. It is important for the players to get all the practices in together, as a team, so they can function as a team in such a short amount of time. It is also important for the Manager and Coaches to be able to get the kids playing in proper positions that best suit the team in the same short amount of time. Your player may be the Shortstop on your league team, or the 3<sup>rd</sup> baseman, but for the All-Star team, they may play a different position depending on where the Manager and coaching staff feel will best serve the team. There is minimum play required for All-Star players, but the goal of these teams is to win the games.

**Your manager will have a sheet for you to indicate “YES” or “NO” for All Star consideration. You need to decide prior to May 25, 2018.**

For the three proofs of residency, the following is required:

One form or proof from each category. Each document must contain the Parents name, street address, city, state and zip code and dated between **February 1, 2017 and January 31, 2018**.

#### Group 1

1. Driver's License (Issue date must be between the dates above)
2. School records
3. Vehicle records (registration, lease, etc)
4. Employment records
5. Insurance documents

#### Group 2

1. Welfare/child care records
2. Federal records (Federal Tax, Social Security, etc)
3. State records
4. Local (municipal) records
5. Support Payment records
6. Homeowner or tenant records
7. Military Records

#### Group 3

1. Voter's registration
2. Utility bills (gas, electric, water/sewer, phone, heating, waste disposal, etc)
3. Financial (loan, credit, investments, etc) records
4. Medical records
5. Internet, cable, or satellite records.

NOTE: Three documents from the same Group (utility bill, cable bill, and bank statement) constitute only ONE document.
