g) President’s Address

Welcome to our 2017 AGM. We have a busy two days of SHSAA work ahead of us, and I wish to thank our host committee for having every detail organized so efficiently.

I also must take some time to thank our SHSAA office staff...Jessica Blair and Stefanie Lewis. If you’ve ever had to call the office, you will have experienced their professionalism and helpfulness (and patience).

An organization can only run effectively with strong leadership. How lucky we are to have Dave Sandomirsky and Lyle McKellar manning the helm! I am struck by how thoughtful and decisive you both are with decisions that you must make on a daily basis. On behalf of the province, I’d like to thank you for your continued dedication and passion for our Association.

The people you see sitting before you are the executive members of the Association. I can’t thank them enough for all they do and how they constantly go above and beyond with their time commitment to the Association.

The office staff and executive are people who truly care about the athletes of this province, but we also have policies to follow and uphold as charged by the membership. Decisions are sometimes difficult, but the office and executive examine each appeal fully. Last year I stood in front of you and stated that our Association is strong, and that is something that I still do believe. Though, now, we are heading into uncertain times. There are many questions about funding for education (and in turn extra-curricular athletics). The only thing that isn’t in question is the commitment of our SHSAA members. There is still the belief that we can have “Education through Athletics” and that athletics are an integral part of a child’s

education. Being involved with kids is amazing and fulfilling. It is challenging, dynamic, energizing, and draining. The joys far outweigh the frustrations and our impact extends far beyond anything we can imagine.

Some of our decisions will need to take into account our changing climate of budget restraint. Each school division has its own financial challenges, and we must start to listen to the concerns of all of our members. It will be a challenge to find a way to include all schools in athletic opportunities, while being respectful of teacher contact days and budgets. Our first job is to be in the classroom teaching. The time away from the classroom to coach is something we have to now be even more mindful of. Times are changing and I know we will find a way to change along with them.

At last year's AGM, I was fortunate enough to spend a little bit of time with the person who influenced me most during my high school years. Doug Lyon was my physical education teacher and basketball coach in Melfort, and I had not seen him in over 30 years. I don't think he realized what an impact he had on the educator and coach I have finally become, and I was later disappointed that I was not articulate enough to let him clearly know that, in the short time we had to visit.

I tell you this because over the course of this year, I have reflected a lot on legacy and mentorship. Sadly, and far too soon, we have lost some amazing coaches within our organization. They were mentors to many and left a positive legacy in their schools, communities and across the province. What will people remember about each of us as we finish our teaching and coaching careers? What will your legacy be?

Are we concerned with the well-being of all our athletes? Are we role-models for our athletes on and off the courts and fields? Are we thinking about the greater good of students participating in athletics or is our view limited by simply concentrating on wins and losses? These are questions that only you can answer. While I am near the end of my career and can reflect back, what about those of you in the middle of your teaching and coaching careers? Is it time to step up and be that leader in your school, your district, in this Association?

What about those beginning their careers? How do we reach out to these young people and develop the type of mentors and coaches that we had? It will be difficult in these changed financial times to create the opportunities many of us took for granted. So we need to make an extra effort in helping our young teachers and coaches develop into mentors and give them the opportunities to step forward.

Be sounding boards for each other; share your gift of experience and wisdom. It will bring out the best in others – and in turn, bring out the best in you.

Each Executive member chairs a sport specific advisory group and each of them has found that to be a rewarding experience. From these activities and championships we have heard stories of empathy, compassion, and support shown by members of our Association to schools grieving the loss of a student; we have heard of great fundraising and charity work being done by school teams across the province; we witnessed the volunteers shivering in the rain at provincial golf; we acknowledge the tremendous work done by the host committee at provincial cross country to get the course ready for competition following the October snowstorm; we appreciate the tremendous crowds that attended those provincial football championships on spring like days in November; we were made aware of a celebration of 50 years of coaching school sport, and the list goes on through all of our activities including the afternoon of June 2 where Provincial Track & Field was interrupted by mother nature's force. For those of you that were at Griffiths Stadium that day it will not soon be forgotten but what I want to share with you is the stories of teachers being teachers, selflessly standing over and protecting their students while taking the brunt of the storm, and that folks is who you are...a caring, compassionate group of individuals that give freely of yourself in order that students are provided with school sport opportunities in an environment that they find reassuring and safe.

Looking ahead, the Coaches Symposium is once again scheduled for August and we encourage all of you to promote that opportunity not just to teacher-coaches but all coaches that will be involved in school sport. The CIAAA looks to offer an in-province PD opportunity for athletic directors when the national conference will be hosted in Regina in April 2018. Forward planning for the Association could very well include continued education on the importance of multi-sport participation and a move away from sport specialization, looking at ways to reach out to more students to have them involved in the school sport experience whether that be the willingness to take on new activities to reach out to the diverse population of our ever growing province or connecting with those with special needs and/or those who might benefit from the unified sport and para-sport movements. Growth for the Association is important as it will allow us to reach more students.

Finally, a personal thank you to Dave, Stef, and Jess for once again making my arrival at the office something I look forward to each day. Your commitment and enthusiasm for the schools, teachers, and students of the SHSAA will never be taken for granted. In closing, I am once again humbled to have

had the opportunity to serve you the membership and the students of our province. I wish you a successful annual meeting.
