## 2021-2022 COVID-19 Mitigation Plan

**Updated: January 21, 2021** – NOTE: This document is subject to periodic updating as new guidance from the St. Louis Park School District, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, and the Minnesota Department of Health becomes available.

The St. Louis Park Traveling Basketball program is committed to providing safe and healthy spaces for our coaches, volunteers, and participants. We have and will continue to follow COVID-19 guidance from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), the Minnesota Department of Health (MDH), and St. Louis Park Public Schools.

### GENERAL:

- If a player, coach or volunteer is exhibiting ANY symptoms of COVID-19 (as defined by the [Centers for Disease Control and Prevention](#)), he or she should stay home from all basketball activities.
- Per instructions from the St. Louis Park School District, masks are to be worn by **everyone** who enters a St. Louis Park school or practice facility. Players will be allowed to remove their masks (should they so choose) after gearing up and prior to stepping on the floor.
- Players may choose to wear a face mask while practicing or competing if they are so inclined. (Note: see below for instances where players are **required** to wear masks.)
- Players should bring their own water bottles.

### ABOUT COVID-19 EXPOSURES:

- Practices and games are considered close contact.
- Close contact extends 48 hours prior to the onset of symptoms or a positive COVID test.
- As outlined by the [St. Louis Park Public Schools COVID Updates & Information Guide](#) and the [Minnesota Department of Health](#), youth who have been in close contact with a positive COVID-19 case **DO NOT NEED TO QUARANTINE...**
  - If the person has no COVID-19 symptoms, and has received [all recommended doses of a vaccine](#), OR
  - If the person has no COVID-19 symptoms, and has recovered from COVID-19 in the past 90 days, OR
  - If the person has no COVID-19 symptoms, and the exposure does not require him to remain home from school.
  - Note: even if you have received [all recommended doses of a vaccine](#), if you are a close contact with a positive COVID-19 case, you must wear a non-cloth, well-fitting mask for five days and test after five days.
  - Note: verification of vaccination or previous exposure may be requested.
- As outlined by the [St. Louis Park Public Schools COVID Updates & Information Guide](#) and the [Minnesota Department of Health](#), youth who have been in close contact with a positive COVID-19 case **DO NEED TO QUARANTINE...**
  - If the person exposed exhibits any COVID-19 symptoms, OR
  - If the person has not received [all recommended doses of a vaccine](#), OR
  - If the exposure requires the person to remain home from school.
- In general, as outlined by [St. Louis Park Public Schools COVID Updates & Information Guide](#), when quarantine is warranted, a minimum of 5 days are required.
- In general, if the exposed player is allowed to return to school, he is permitted to return to the court the same day. If the exposed player is not permitted to return to school, he cannot return to the court.
- As outlined by the [St. Louis Park Public Schools COVID Updates & Information Guide](#) and the [Minnesota Department of Health](#), youth returning from a quarantine after a positive COVID diagnosis must wear a non-cloth, well-fitting mask for days 6-10.
