The Lee Community Center is currently facing a major update and we are asking community members to support us so we can continue to provide opportunities to the surrounding area.

Our Major Project

NEW Compressor system

A **compressor system** is the heart of the refrigeration system that keeps the ice rink frozen and safe for skating and hockey. It works by **circulating coolant through pipes beneath the ice**, which absorbs heat and keeps the ice surface solid and smooth—even during warm weather or when the arena is full of people.

Estimated Cost: \$400,000



Our current compressor system is aging, becoming unreliable and creating more expenses to keep it running. Replacing it will ensure the arena stays open, safe, and sustainable for years to come. Your support helps preserve a space that brings our community together through sports, recreation, and fun.

Here's how it helps the community:

- **Keeps the Ice Frozen:** No compressors, no ice. These machines make it possible for our community to enjoy hockey, private events, and public skating.
- **Supports Youth Programs and Recreation:** A reliable compressor allows us to run our hockey season, skating lessons, and free skates. That means more opportunities for kids and families to be active and engaged.
- **Saves Energy and Costs:** Newer compressor systems are more efficient. That means **lower utility bills** for the arena and **less impact on the environment**.
- **Protects Our Investment:** The ice surface and arena infrastructure depend on consistent temperatures. Without a good compressor system, the ice can melt or become unsafe—putting our programs and revenue at risk.

What We Provide

The Lee Community Center is used for many activities throughout the entire year, and it is one of the few places in Morris to hold large events. These events held throughout the year include the following:

The Morris Hockey Association offers varying levels of hockey comprising 12 teams and nearly 170 players.

The walking track is open to the public year-round.

Open to a wide variety of community sponsored events:

- Free Skating Events:

Spook-n-Skate, Skate with Santa, Sweetheart Skate, and open skate / open hockey

- Community Expo's:
Spring Expo and Stevens County Fair

- Community Events: Post Prom, 4H events, Safety Day Camp, Relay for Life, Easter Egg Hunt, Baseball Practices, School PE Classes, Circus and Community Meals

Individuals may also rent the rink for family celebrations, parties and wedding receptions.
