This individual demonstrates initiative, leadership, and commitment to the sport of volleyball in Ontario and is a positive role model for others in their community.

Ontario Volleyball annually recognizes the outstanding accomplishments and contributions of volunteers, coaches, officials, and corporate partners who have distinguished themselves through the years by providing their time, effort and support to the promotion and development of volleyball in Ontario.

History:

Doug Robbie is a prime example of an extremely committed volunteer who provided his time, effort, and support to the promotion of volleyball in Ontario. Doug was the OVA President from 1976-1984, but also sat as Volleyball Canada's past president and NORCECA's Vice President. Doug's impressive resume includes National Official, clinician, Club Coach, former Volunteer of the Year, and Region 5 Executive. His unwavering dedication and passion to the growth and development of volleyball truly embodies what the OVA Volunteer of the Year represents.

Eligibility & Selection Criteria:

- The nominee must be an individual who has made significant strides within the sport of volleyball in two or more of the following categories over a minimum of 10 years:
 - a. Building and promoting the sport of volleyball at the Regional, Provincial, or National level
 - b. History of committed involvement in the sport and performance as a Coach, Official, staff, or administrator, and/or event promoter/director
 - c. Contributes to the development and/or advancement of volleyball
- Commitment to the sport of volleyball as demonstrated by years of service and activity
- Must be a registered member in good standing with the OVA
- An individual may only receive this award once in their lifetime
- Nominators may only submit one nomination in this category.
- Nominee must reside in Ontario

Submission Requirements:

- A fully completed nomination form. **Must be submitted electronically.**
- Nominator must provide contact information for the nominee.
- A digital head & shoulders photograph of the nominee (jpeg with 300 dpi).
- A volleyball CV or highlight of accomplishments
