TODAY'S GAME

Team USA faces Germany here today to open play in the 49th annual IIHF World Junior Hockey Championship. It's the first of four preliminary round games for the U.S. All U.S. games will air live on NHL Network with EJ Hradek and Tony Granato calling the action.

THE LATEST

U.S. VERSUS GERMANY

The U.S. and Germany will meet for the 15th time today in the World Juniors. The U.S. has a 13-0-1-0-0 (W-OTW-OTL-L-T) advantage in the series. The teams last met in the quarterfinals of the 2023 World Juniors in Moncton, with Team USA earning an 11-1 victory on Jan. 2, 2023. A game-by-game look at the all-time series is below.

LEADERSHIP GROUP

Forward **Ryan Leonard** (Amherst, Mass.), who returns to the U.S. National Junior Team after helping the squad earn a gold medal a year ago, is the captain of the 2025 U.S. National Junior Team. Leonard was part of the 2024 U.S. Men's National Team and has a gold and silver medal to his credit in the IIHF U18 Men's World Championship. He scored the OT winner in the 2023 gold-medal game of the U18 Worlds against Sweden. Forwards **Oliver Moore** (Mounds View, Minn.), **Danny Nelson** (Maple Grove, Minn.) and **Gabe Perreault** (Hinsdale, Ill.), along with defenseman **Zeev Buium** (San Diego, Calif.) are serving as alternate captains. All four were part of the 2024 U.S. National Junior Team.

THE JOURNEY TO DATE

The U.S. began its World Juniors journey with a short camp in Plymouth, Mich., at USA Hockey Arena with 29 players looking to gain a spot among the final 25-man U.S. roster for the 2025 IIHF World Junior Championship. Below is a look at some of the key moments to date.

TOURNEY OPENERS

The U.S. is 21-2-1-22-2 (W-OTW-OTL-L-T) all-time in World Juniors opening games. Since 2000, Team USA has won 20 of 25 openers, going 18-2-1-3-1. The U.S. has faced Germany on four previous occasions in its first game of a WJC and has won three of the four contests.

TEAM USA AT THE WORLD JUNIORS

Entering the 2025 IIHF World Junior Championship, the U.S. holds a 162-12-6-121-11 (W-OTW-OTL-L-T) all-time record in the event. Most recently, Team USA went 6-1-0-0-0 in the 2024 tournament and earned the gold medal. To date, Team USA has earned 15 podium finishes, including six gold medals (2004, 2010, 2013, 2017, 2021, 2024), two silver medals (1997, 2019) and seven bronze medals (1986, 1992, 2007, 2011, 2016, 2018, 2023). The United States has medaled in seven of the last nine tournaments, the best medal stretch in the history of the country.

TREY AUGUSTINE

Trey Augustine, the expected starter here today in goal, is playing in his third IIHF World Junior Championship. Augustine is 8-0-0-1 (W-OTW-OTL-L) in the World Juniors with a 2.37 GAA and .911 SVS%. His next win will tie him for second all-time in career victories among Americans with Al Montoya, who played in 12 games and won nine times (2004-05). Augustine has won bronze (2023) and gold (2024) in the World Juniors and is seeking to join Yevgeni Belosheikin (URS), Marc Denis (CAN), Andrei Medvedev (RUS), Jamie Storr (CAN) and Alexander Tyzhnyh (URS) as the only netminders in WJC history to win three medals in the tournament. The South Lyon, Mich., native also has a silver (2022) and gold medal (2023) to his credit in the IIHF U18 Men's World Championship. He was also part of the U.S. Men's National Team for the 2024 IIHF Men's Worlds and played in three games (1.37, .923).

ABOUT THE STAFF

ABOUT VANBIESBROUCK

John Vanbiesbrouck is the general manager of the 2025 U.S. National Junior Team, marking his seventh straight season serving in the capacity. The 2007 U.S. Hockey Hall of Fame inductee has previously represented the United States as a player on nine occasions, including one Olympic Winter Games (1998), two Canada Cups (1987, 1991), four men's world championships (1985, 1987, 1989, 1991) and two world junior championships (1982, 1983). A full-time employee of USA Hockey, Vanbiesbrouck began his duties as assistant executive director of hockey operations for USA Hockey on June 4, 2018. His responsibilities include oversight of all of USA Hockey's international efforts, including its men's, women's and sled programs as well as the National Junior Development Program.

ABOUT CARLE

David Carle is serving as head coach of the U.S. National Junior Team for the second straight year after leading the team to a gold medal in last year's IIHF World Junior Championship. In his seventh season as head coach of the University of Denver's men's ice hockey team in 2024-25, Carle has led the Pioneers to four NCAA tournament appearances overall in his tenure as head coach at DU, including both the 2024 and 2022 NCAA title. Prior to being named head coach, Carle served four-and-a-half seasons as an assistant coach with Denver (2014-18), joining the program in 2014 following a season-and-a-half as an assistant coach (2012-14) with the Green Bay Gamblers of the United States Hockey League. As a player, Carle was recruited to play at Denver and spent four seasons (2008-12) as a graduate assistant coach after a medical diagnosis forced him to retire from his playing career. A 2008 NHL Draft-eligible prospect, Carle was drafted in the fourth round, 203rd overall, by the Tampa Bay Lightning.

ASSISTANT COACHES

USA Hockey has the same group of assistant coaches from last year's gold medal-winning U.S. National Junior Team, including NCAA Division I head coaches **Brett Larson** (St. Cloud State University) and **Garrett Raboin** (Augustana University); University of Minnesota associate head coach **Steve Miller**; and **David Lassonde**, who serves as the national goaltending coach for USA Hockey. The U.S. also returns **Travis Culhane** as video coach and **Brian Gallivan**, the performance coach at USA Hockey's National Team Development Program.
