As the official provider of medical services for this event, we look forward to working with your team for a safe and healthy weekend. Included within this handbook you will find information regarding our services should you need them over the course of the tournament.

## OUR STAFF

Several members of our team will be available throughout the tournament to provide care for your athletes. The following providers will be available to your team on site at the PWSB Soccer Park, Rotary and Fusion each day:



### **Kyle Scharer, MS, LAT**

Kyle Scharer is a nationally certified and state-licensed athletic trainer with Children's Wisconsin Sports Medicine Program. Kyle earned a bachelor's degree in Athletic Training from Bowling Green State University and a master's degree in Exercise Science from the University of Georgia. He completed an internship with a minor league baseball team and a residency program in Athletic Training with UW Health Sports Medicine in Madison, Wisconsin. Prior to completing his residency, Kyle served on staff at East Carolina University, Greenville, N.C., assisting with the health care needs of a variety of college athletes.



### **Drew Hacker, LAT**

Drew Hacker is a nationally certified and state-licensed athletic trainer who joined Children's Wisconsin in 2014. He has served as the Ambulatory Supervisor for the clinical athletic training team since 2016 and works across all specialty areas within pediatric orthopedics. Before Children's, Drew worked as an athletic trainer at Froedtert & the Medical College of Wisconsin Sports Medicine Center. At Froedtert, Drew held the position of Director of Sports Medicine for a Division III college. Before that, he completed six seasons as the head football athletic trainer. While in graduate school Amanda's master's thesis focused on researching the effects of neuromuscular electrical stimulation in the management of delayed onset muscle soreness in a physically active population.



### **Jaclyn Young, MS, LAT**

Jaclyn is a nationally certified and state-licensed athletic trainer within the Sports Medicine Program at Children's Wisconsin. She currently assists in the care of youth athletes with sports-related injuries. She also assists in the care of patients with upper extremity injuries and congenital differences within our Orthopedic Hand and Upper Extremity Program. Throughout her high school and collegiate years, she was a multi-sport athlete and had always had an interest in athletics. She also knew early on that she wanted a career in the medical field. Jaclyn went on to earn a Bachelor's of Science degree in Exercise Science and Master's degree in Athletic Training from Adrian College in Adrian, MI. After graduate school, she was employed at the University of Michigan as a Fellow Athletic Trainer working primarily with the Cross Country and Track teams. Following her fellowship she was employed by the University of Michigan Health System and worked in their Sports Medicine and Orthopedic clinic. Danielle Fallon is a nationally certified and state-licensed athletic trainer with Children's Wisconsin's Sports Medicine Program. She currently serves as an athletic trainer-physician extender within the Sports Medicine program, assisting in the care of young athletes with sports-related injuries, including concussions. Danielle earned a bachelor's degree in Athletic Training from George Washington University in Washington, D.C., where she was also a member of the gymnastics team. Following graduation, she completed a Physician Extender Residency program through the Orthopaedic Teaching and Research Foundation in Westmont, Ill. During her yearlong residency, she strengthened her clinical skills and gained valuable experience assisting in both the clinic and operating room. Danielle is certified as an orthopedic technologist, as well as a surgery-certified orthopedic technologist, which has allowed her to expand her duties as an athletic trainer in the clinical setting. ## SCHEDULE OF SERVICES

- **ON-SITE COVERAGE:** One (1) certified athletic trainer (ATC) will be on-site at PWSB Soccer Park, one (1) ATC at the Rotary Park fields, and one (1) at Fusion Soccer Park location at all times during tournament hours. **On Friday 09/16 there will be no medical staff at Rotary/Fusion. Any emergencies should follow emergency action plan outlined below. Non-emergent injuries can be transported and evaluated at PWSB. There will be no athletic training medical staff at Zaun Soccer Park throughout the weekend.** If medical services are required outside of tournament hours, care can be received at the CW Emergency Room (please see attached Map for location).
- **PHYSICIANS:** Primary care sports medicine physicians will remain on-call throughout the entirety of the tournament. Services of the on call physician will be accessed at the discretion of the certified athletic trainer on site.
- **EMERGENCY TRANSPORT:** Emergency transport services can be accessed via the athletic trainer on site at PWSB Park, Rotary, and Fusion. ***In the event that an ATC or first aid volunteer cannot be located, EMS should be activated by dialing 911.***
- **COMMUNICATION:** The certified athletic trainers will be using radios for communication with field marshals and staff throughout the tournament. Non-emergent injuries should be sent to the CW Medical tent. Athlete's participation and injury status will remain updated in real time to the NSU tournament coordinators via the radios as well. ***You should call 9-1-1 if any life threatening or emergent injuries are suspected.***
- **EMERGENCY ROOM RESPONSE:** The Children's Wisconsin emergency department will remain open throughout the entirety of the tournament. Services can be coordinated via the on-site athletic trainer during tournament hours or as a walk-in patient after hours. Emergency facilities outside of CW may be utilized depending on the scope of the injury.

## SCOPE OF MEDICAL SERVICES

- **ON-SITE CARE WILL BE PROVIDED FOR ATHLETES PARTICIPATING IN THE TOURNAMENT ONLY:** In regards to care for non-participating athletes and other members of the team's travel party, the CW Emergency Room (age < 18 years old) or the Froedtert Hospital Emergency Room (age > 18 years old) are recommended.
- Services provided on site will include first aid, acute injury evaluation and care, and emergency services.

- **COVID-19:** All camp participants are required to abide by the tournament and county policies regarding COVID-19. Any athlete exhibiting signs of illness, symptomatic individuals who tested positive for COVID-19 or athletes exposed to a recently positive COVID-19 individual in their same household should not attend or participate. CW Medical staff will not be providing any COVID testing or general medical or illness evaluations. They will be available for emergent care, sports related injury evaluation and sports related injury advice only.
- **PRE-GAME CARE:** Taping, wrapping, and other preventative measures will be provided by the athletic trainer on site as needed. Athletes are encouraged to arrive at the CW Sports Medicine tent **a minimum of fifteen (15) minutes prior to the start of competition** for these services if required.
- **INJURED ATHLETES:** Athletes evaluated for acute injuries during the tournament will be encouraged to check in for clearance prior the start of their next game following the injury. The on-site athletic trainer reserves the right to **restrict any athlete** from play if deemed unsafe to return to competition. Please note that tournament officials as well as match officials may be asked to intervene if an athlete attempts to play against the recommendation of the on-site athletic trainer. In this circumstance, the on call physician may also be contacted for further guidance.
- **CONCUSSION POLICY:** In 2011, the enactment of Wisconsin Act 172 specified the following requirements in regards to head injury and concussion:
  - At the beginning of a season for youth athletic activity, coaches as well as athletes and their parent / guardian must sign a concussion information sheet indicating that they understand what a concussion is, and that they understand signs, symptoms and behaviors associated with concussion.
  - By signing this sheet, the athlete agrees to report suspected concussion to parents / coaches. Parents and coaches in turn agree to remove the child from play if concussion is suspected.
  - If concussion is suspected in the athlete, the athlete is to be removed from play until cleared for participation by a health care professional.
    - Considering this, if an athlete is suspected to have signs, symptoms and/or behaviors consistent with concussion by the CW Sports Medicine staff, the athlete will be removed from play immediately, and not permitted to return until cleared by the CW Sports Medicine staff.
- **SPECTATOR POLICY:** The on-site athletic trainer will **not** be responsible for the care of injured / sick spectators or team staff, however may assist in providing care if possible.

## LOCATION OF SERVICES

- **LOCATION:** The onsite athletic trainer will remain at the at the CW Sports Medicine tent located near the pavilion at PWSB Park, the pavilion at Rotary Park and \*\*\* at Fusion Park unless evaluating an injured athlete on the field in an emergency. As noted above, that athletic trainer can be reached at the tent. ***All injuries not considered to be an emergency should be evaluated at the Sports Medicine tent, not on the field.*** The field marshal and /or first aid volunteers can arrange for golf cart transportation to the Sports Medicine tent if required.
- **PRIVACY: Examination on field or on the benches will be limited to emergency situations, or situations deemed appropriate by the on-site athletic trainer or first aid staff.** An adult presence (parent/coach / guardian) is recommended during the examination, and may be requested by the ATC depending on the scope / location of the injury.

### **INCLEMENT WEATHER POLICY**

- **LIGHTNING POLICY:** All play will be suspended in the event that lightning approaches a 6 mile radius from the site. Play will not be allowed to resume until 30 minutes following the last strike within that radius. In the event that play is suspended due to lightning / severe weather, athletes, coaches and spectators will be directed to their vehicles for shelter.
- **SEVERE WEATHER POLICY:** If a severe thunderstorm or tornado warning is in effect, play will be immediately stopped with all attendees directed to a safe area. Play will not resume until 30 minutes following the discontinuation of the warning.

### **EMERGENCY PROCEDURES**

- **EMERGENCY ACTION PLANS:** Venue specific emergency action plans have been created for each site involved in the tournament and are included within this packet. Please review these prior to the start of competition.
- **PWSB PARK, ROTARY PARK & FUSION PARK:** The on-site athletic trainer will be available to carry out emergency procedures regarding injured athletes at PWSB Park, Rotary Park & Fusion Park throughout the entirety of the tournament.
- **DURING AN EMERGENCY:** The CW Sports Medicine staff respectfully asks that care is left to appropriately trained personnel and facility staff only. The assistance of coaches and team staff may be necessary as required by the situation. Player family members, teammates and chaperones should remain off the field / away from the injured athlete until directed by venue staff members.
- **CHAPERONE POLICY:** In the event that an injured athlete is transported to the Emergency Room, a team staff member or chaperone is suggested to

accompany the injured athlete. CW Sports Medicine staff **WILL NOT** be available to accompany the injured athlete, but will be happy to provide the chaperones and/or team representatives with hospital information and directions as appropriate.

- **AED:** One (1) Automated External Defibrillator (AED) will be located at the Sports Medicine tent at PWSB Park, one (1) at the Rotary Park, and one (1) at Fusion Park at all times during the tournament **EXCEPT 09/16 WHEN NO ATC WILL BE ONSITE AT ROTARY OR FUSION.**

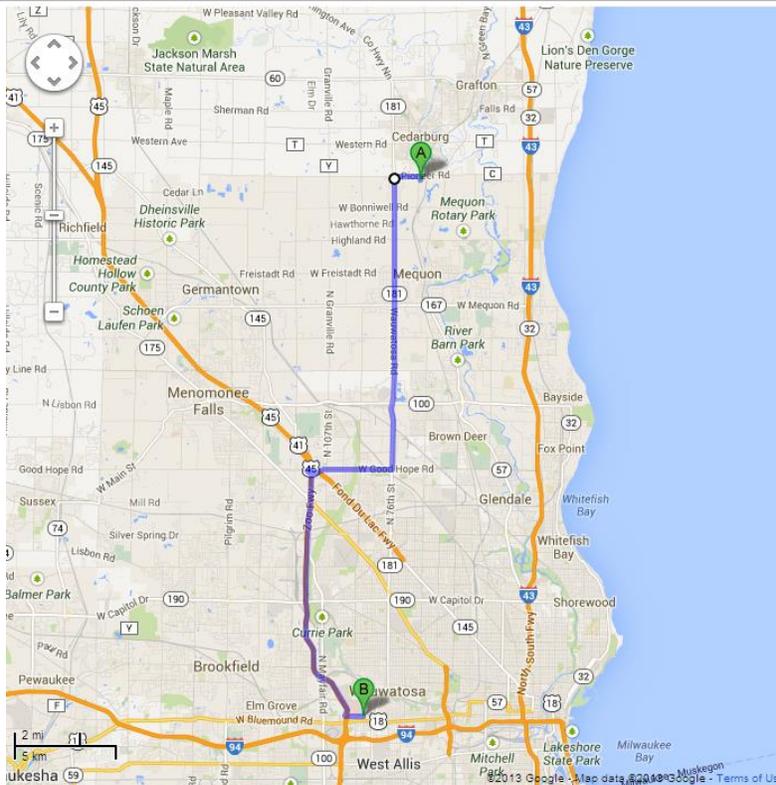

**Address:** **N143 W6499 LAYTON ST., CEDARBURG, WI 53012**

**VENUE DIRECTIONS:** PWSB Park is located just west of Cedarburg Rd. off of Layton Street, and Just South of Pioneer Road.

- **From the south end of Cedarburg at Washington Ave and Pioneer (County Road C):** continue south on Washington for one block, take a right on LAYTON ST and it dead ends in our parking lot.

- **From 43:** take the Cedarburg exit and head west on County C for about 5 miles. At the stop light at Washington Ave, turn left on Washington (also called Cedarburg Rd), head south for one block and turn right on LAYTON St. Dead ends into the parking lot.

- **From Route 60:** take 181 (Wauwatosa Rd) south for about 2 miles to the stop light at Pioneer (county Rd C). Turn left and head east to the stop light with Washington Ave. Turn right on Washington head south for one block and turn right on LAYTON St. Dead ends into the parking lot.

**EMS Access:**

- *Field 1-4 (EMS Access #1):* Access to PWSB Park will be directly off Layton Street through the field's parking lot. EMS should meet first responder / designated personnel near the park pavilion for further direction.

- *Field 1-4 (EMS Access #3):* Access to PWSB Park will be directly off Layton Street through the pathway behind the trees along the trail that runs behind the pavilion. EMS should meet first responder / designated personnel near the park pavilion for further direction.

- *Field 5 (EMS Access #2):* Access to the 5<sup>th</sup> PWSB Park is off of the south side of Pioneer Rd at the west parking lot entrance of the Cedar Mills Clinic. EMS should meet first responder / designated personnel near the Cedar Mills Clinic parking lot entrance for further direction.

**Emergency Personnel:** One (1) Certified Athletic Trainer (ATC) on site for entirety of the tournament. The ATC will be located at the CW Sports Medicine Tent. The athletic trainer will have a cell phone for emergency communication. First Aid volunteers will also be on site at the First Aid / CW Sports Medicine Tent.

**Emergency Equipment:** AED and splints with ATC at Sports Medicine Tent

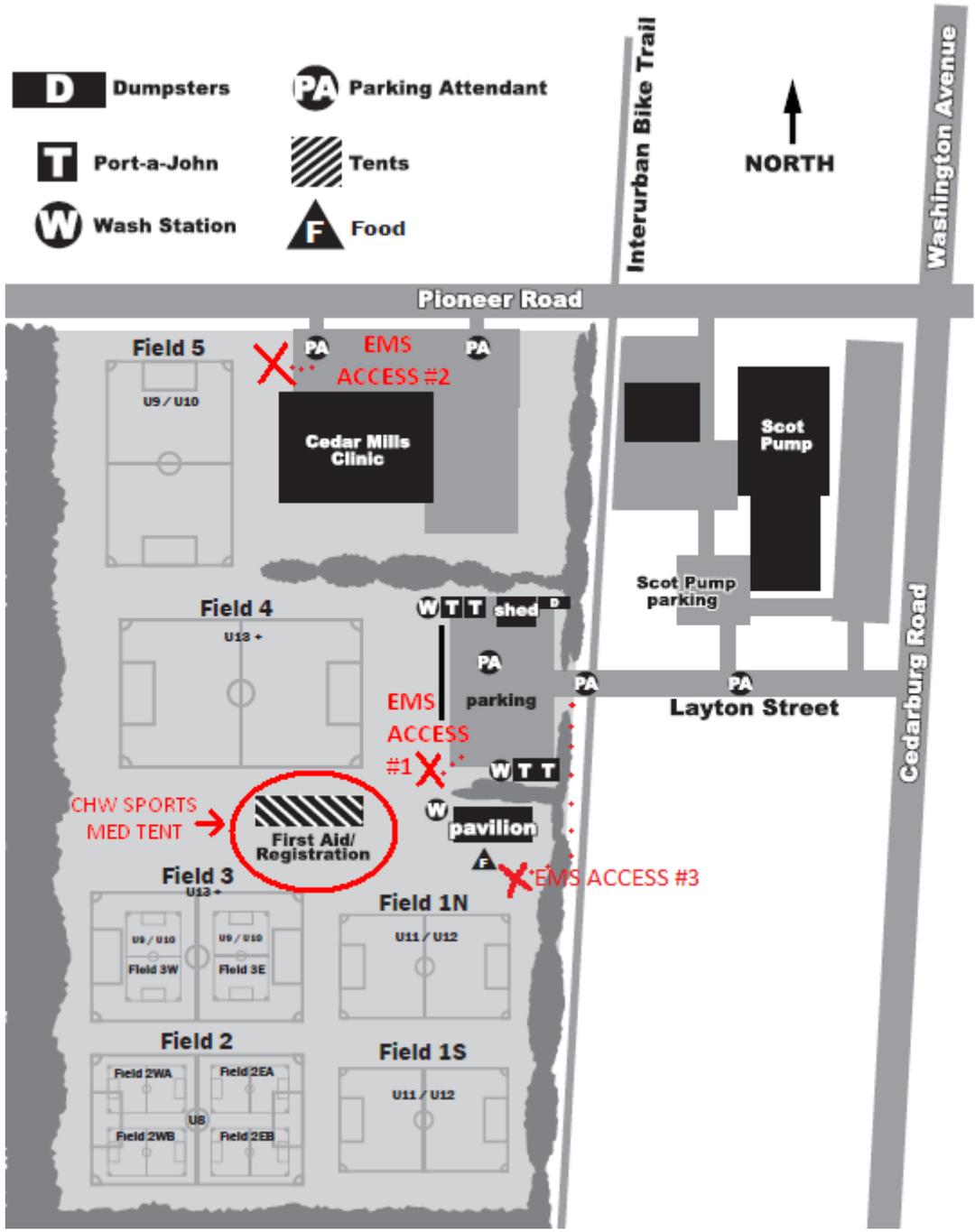
**Role of First Responder:**

**VENUE DIRECTIONS:**

- **From 43:** Exit from 43 and go west until reach Port Washington Rd. Take Port Washington Rd to Highland Road and go west. Rotary Park is located on the right (north) side of Highland Road approximately 2 miles west of Port Washington Rd.

- **From 181/Wauwatosa Rd:** Take 181/Wauwatosa Rd to Highland Rd. Go east for approximately 2.5 miles and the field will be located on the north (left) side of the street.

**EMS Access:**

- EMS accesses through the park entrance road off Highland towards the pavilion and pulls into parking lot. The main soccer field space is east of the parking lot with a few additional fields on the west side of the parking lot.

- Main soccer fields: Access point #1 via gravel pathway on the southeast side of parking area for the main fields.

- Additional soccer fields: Access point #2 via gravel path on the northwest side of parking lot (near the pavilion) for the additional fields.

**Emergency Personnel / Equipment:** One (1) ATC or one (1) First Aid- Volunteer will be on site with basic first aid supplies. Basic splints and AED available with ATC at Sports Medicine Tent when on site.

**Role of First Responder:**

1. Immediate care of athlete
2. Activate EMS (call 911 from cell phone)
3. Prepare for EMS arrival
4. Scene control – limit scene to first aid responders only

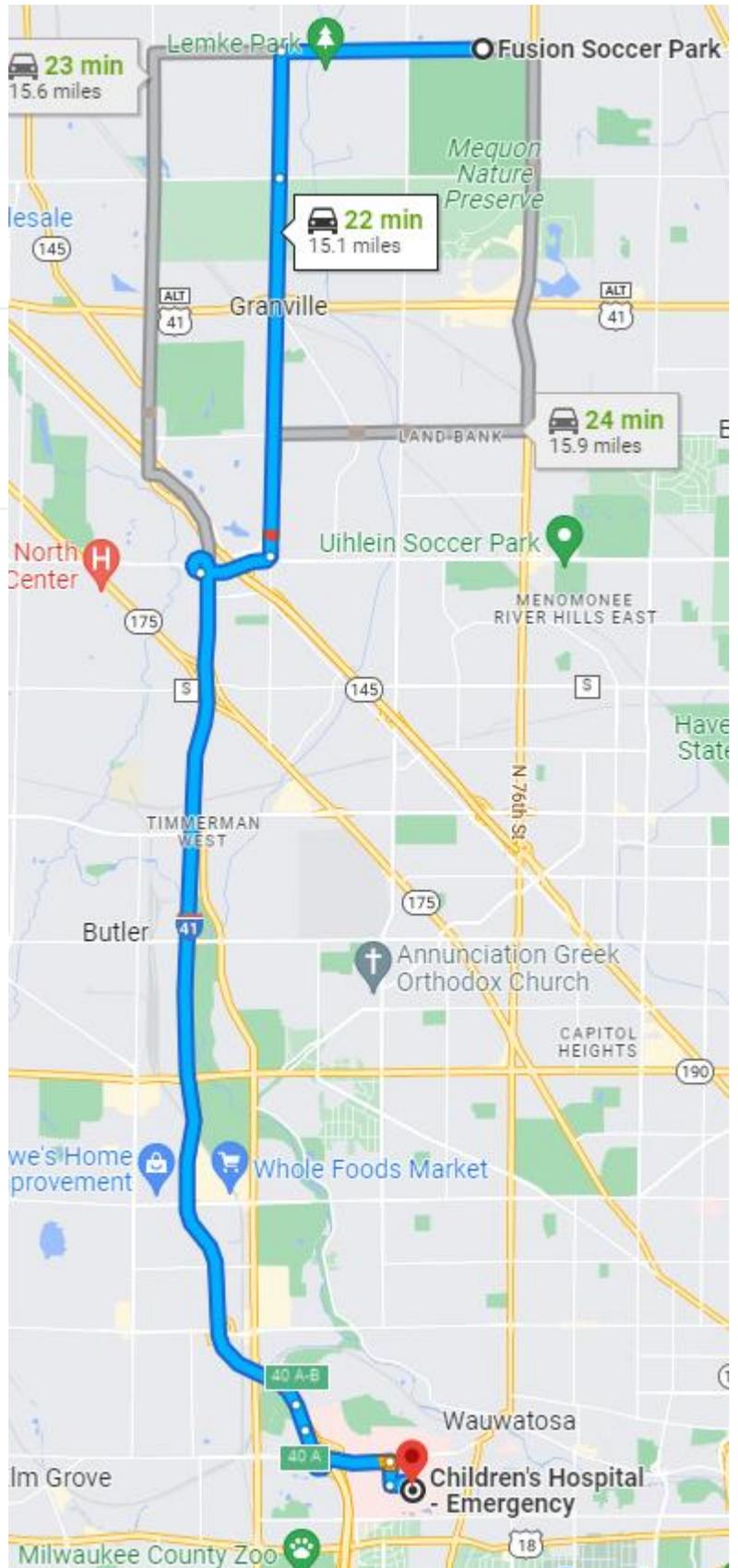

- **From 41:** Take exit 47B east bound on Good Hope Rd. Turn left (north) on N 107<sup>th</sup> St. Take a right (east) on W Donges Bay Rd. Fusion park will be on the left (north).

**EMS Access:**

- EMS will access Fusion Park via south entrance off of West Donges Bay Rd. EMS will be able to access all fields via the parking lot. A space will be reserved for all emergency medical services in the parking lot

**Emergency Personnel:** One (1) Certified Athletic Trainer (ATC) on site for entirety of the tournament **EXCEPT 09/16**. The ATC will be located at the CW Sports Medicine Tent. The athletic trainer will have a cell phone for emergency communication. First Aid volunteers will also be on site at the First Aid / CW Sports Medicine Tent.

**Emergency Equipment:** AED and splints with ATC at Sports Medicine Tent

**Role of First Responder:**

1. Immediate care of athlete
2. Activate EMS (call 911 from cell phone)
3. Prepare for EMS arrival
4. Scene control – limit scene to first aid responders only

## SUPPLIES AVAILABLE THROUGHOUT TOURNAMENT

- The athletic trainer on site will have supplies required for first aid, as well as for the care and management of acute injuries. Available supplies will include:
  - Ace Wraps
  - Crutches
  - Ice bags / Ice
  - Tape
  - Wound care materials
- **MEDICATION POLICY:** The on-site athletic trainer **will not** have medication for administration, with the exception of those medications that may be required in an emergency situation.
- **HYDRATION:** All teams will be responsible for their own hydration needs throughout the entirety of the tournament.

## INJURY DOCUMENTATION

- **MEDICAL RECORDS** will be kept and maintained by the Children's Wisconsin Medical staff to appropriately document injuries evaluated on site. A sample of this form is provided in the following pages.
