The Ontario Volleyball Association (OVA) is a non-profit member-based provincial sports organization where dedicated volunteers and professional staff provide leadership in the growth and development of indoor and beach volleyball for all Ontarians.

It is our vision to be recognized as a leading sport organization in Canada. To that end, the OVA works with its partners to support athletes through excellent customer service and by offering inclusive programming on a foundation of physical literacy for all ages and abilities. The OVA will provide athletes with quality opportunities for meaningful competition and will support coaches and officials with professional development opportunities.

CANADA GAMES

The Canada Games are the biggest multisport event in Canada and have been the stepping-stone for many indoor and beach volleyball players in their progression to the international level.

The 2021 Canada Games will be the event's 28th edition. It will be hosted across all twelve Niagara Region municipalities and will attract over 5,000 athletes and coaches to the Niagara Region in the summer of 2021. The Games are a catalyst and will provide transformative social and economic legacy for the entire Niagara Region, Ontario, and Canada.

COACHES SELECTION TIMELINE

The coach selection process will start three years prior to the Canada Games to allow for professional development and familiarization with the Team Ontario program. Head Coaches will be selected in February 2019 and will be part of the Assistant Coaches selection process in the fall of 2019. An early start to this process is important to ensure proper coach certification and long-term athlete identification. The coaching staff will work closely with the OVA High Performance staff in the planning of the Canada Games Team Ontario program.

JOB SUMMARY

The OVA will be hiring Team Ontario Head Coaches for the following program:

- Beach Volleyball Team Ontario Head Coaches for Canada Games
 - 3-year process focused on the identification and the development of beach volleyball athletes born in January 2001 or later.
 - The goal is to achieve the best possible performance at the 2021 Canada Games through purposeful athlete and coach development

Each Team Ontario Coach holds a key leadership position within the Ontario Volleyball Association's High Performance program.

KEY RESPONSIBILITIES FOR TEAM ONTARIO HEAD COACHES

The duties of the Team Ontario Canada Games Head Coaches will include, but are not necessarily limited to the following:

2019

- Actively take part in the identification and selection of athletes for Team Ontario programs at the Team Ontario Beach selection camp
- Take part in the selection process of Team Ontario Canada Games Assistant coaches by sitting on the Coach Selection Committee
- Develop a coach development plan with the help of the OVA Senior Beach Development Coach

2020

- Actively take part in the identification and selection of athletes for Team Ontario programs at the Team Ontario Beach selection camp
- Successfully achieve Performance Coach certification status by August 2020
- Develop and implement an effective and holistic training for Team Ontario athletes
- Plan & lead training sessions of assigned training group
- Teach technical and tactical aspects consistent with that of Team Ontario Beach
- Coach athletes during all Toronto OVA Beach Tour events, Provincials, and Nationals on weekends
- Track, monitor, document, and guide athletes in their progress for training, competitions, and partnerships
- Submit Athlete, Team and Program Evaluations including the completion of a written athlete evaluation using the OVA grading template
- Complete holistic debriefs with coaches, athletes and OVA following the program

2021

- Actively take part in the identification and selection of athletes for Team Ontario programs at the Team Ontario Beach selection camp
- Develop and implement an effective and holistic training for Team Ontario athletes
- Plan & lead training sessions of assigned training group
- Teach technical and tactical aspects consistent with that of Team Ontario Beach
- Coach athletes during all Toronto OVA Beach Tour events, Provincials, Nationals and at the 2021 Canada Games
- Track, monitor, document, and guide athletes in their progress for training, competitions, and partnerships
- Submit Athlete, Team and Program Evaluations including the completion of a written athlete evaluation using the OVA grading template
- Complete holistic debriefs with coaches, athletes and OVA following the program

Throughout the entire program

- Abide by the Team Ontario Selection policy, the OVA Screening Policy, the OVA Recruiting Policy and the OVA Person In Authority Code of Conduct
- Participate in required professional development activities as per the coach development plan
- Perform administrative duties as needed

ACCOUNTABILITY

Team Ontario Coaches have a direct reporting line to the OVA Senior Beach Development Coach and the OVA High Performance Director

COACH ELIGIBILITY

- Registered member in good standing with the Ontario Volleyball Association and Volleyball Canada
- Meet all requirements of the OVA's Screening Policy including a Valid Vulnerable Sector Screening & Police Record Check as well as a completed OVA Screening Disclosure Form
- Head Coaches must have achieved a minimum NCCP status of "in-training" for the Performance Coach context. The Level 3 or Performance Coach "certified" status is preferable. ([Beach Pathway](#))
 - Head coaches will have to be trained in the Performance Coach context by August 2019
 - The deadline to be fully certified Performance Coach is August 2020

QUALIFICATIONS

- Practical understanding of Volleyball Canada's Long-term Athlete Development (LTAD) model and of positive youth development principles
- Ability to create effective learning environments and to develop meaningful relationships with athletes
- Extensive experience in player development at the Learn to Compete and Train to Compete levels
- Demonstrated ability to develop and adapt holistic player/team training plans to various training conditions
- Practical understanding of elite volleyball principles and systems due to exposure to post-secondary and/or international volleyball
- Demonstrated ability to meet the highest standards of practice planning, delivery and performance analysis
- Have a strong knowledge and understanding of the high performance athlete development pathway in Ontario/Canada
- Desire and willingness to improve as a coach

COACH SELECTION PROCESS

The selection of Team Ontario Beach coaches is done in accordance with the Team Ontario Coaches Selection Guidelines. For the purpose of this selection process, the Coach Selection Criteria will be assessed through the candidates' ability to demonstrate they possess the above qualifications.

The selection process will be done through multiple steps:

1. Application process (January 25th to February 10th)
2. Phone interview (February 11th to 18th)
 - All candidates invited for a phone interview should expect to be at the in-person practice evaluation
3. In-person practice evaluation
 - February 19th-24th. Coaches will have to submit a video of them coaching Train to Compete athletes.
 - Details about the session will be given to successful applicants. The session will consist of 45 minutes of on-court training based on guidelines provided by the selection committee

HONORARIUM

The Head Coach will receive an honorarium yearly based on the plan specific to each season. This aspect will be discussed with the successful applicant.

The incumbent must also demonstrate the following personal attributes that reflect the OVA's Organizational Values:

SUSTAINABLE: by building organizational capacity, partnerships, innovative funding, sharing and economizing of resources to achieve the strategic objectives and sport mandate.

INTEGRITY & RESPECT: by interacting with all our stakeholders by fostering trust in all our relationships as consistently demonstrated by our actions and promoting inclusivity for all Ontarians in fair manner.
