TODAY'S GAME

For the third consecutive U18 World Championship, Team USA has advanced to the gold medal-game. After playing Sweden the previous two years, the tilt tonight is against Canada.

The U.S. took down Slovakia in yesterday's first semifinal by a 7-2 final. In the second contest, Canada held on to top Sweden by a 5-4 final. Both teams enter the game undefeated.

All of Team USA's games at the U18 Championship will take place at Metro Arena in Espoo, home of the Elite League's Kiekko-Espoo. The arena seats 6,982 fans for hockey games.

TALKING POINTS

SEMIFINALS VS. SLOVAKIA

Max Plante (Hermantown, Minn.) scored twice and added two assists and **James Hagens** (Hauppauge, N.Y.) collected three points to help lead the U.S. Under-18 Men's National Team to a 7-2 win over Slovakia in the semifinals of the U18 World Championship.

BOSS TALK

"When you get to this point in the tournament, nothing is going to be easy and it was a tough match-up today," said **Nick Fohr**, head coach of the U.S. Under-18 Men's National Team. "We were able to get to our style of play in the second and finish out really strong. I'm proud of our guys for working their way into the gold medal-game and we'll be ready to go tomorrow."

NEW LEADER IN THE CLUBHOUSE

Team USA forward **James Hagens**'s historic tournament continued in yesterday's semifinal win over Slovakia as he picked up a trio of assists to give him 22 points in six games played, the most ever recorded in a single U18 Championship with a game to play.

Hagens has collected three-or-more points in every game of this year's tournament, including a six-point night in the 9-4 win over Finland.

The future BC Eagle is no stranger to international success as he set the all-time single-tournament points record at the 2022 World Under-17 Hockey Challenge with 21, where he posted eight goals and 13 assists.

Hagens' three-point night also gave him 102 points on the year, making him the ninth player in USA Hockey National Team Development Program history to hit the century mark in a single season. His 187 career points ranks fifth all-time at the NTDP, and if he can find three more tonight, can pass Clayton Keller (189 pts) for fourth most by any NTDP player.

BATTLE OF NORTH AMERICA

The United States and Canada both come into tonight's action with perfect slates at the 2024 IIHF U18 World Championship, each having won their first six games of the competition.

In the all-time series history between the two nations, Team USA holds an 11-2-2-2 (W-OTW-OTL-L) record and are winners of nine of the last 11 matchups. In the most recent battle, the U.S. took a 7-3 decision in the prelims of the 2022 tournament.

In two gold medal-games, the teams have split. USA won in 2005 (5-1) and Canada returned serve with a 3-2 win in 2013.

TOURNAMENT INFO

The 2024 International Ice Hockey Federation Under-18 Men's World Championship will take place April 25 - May 5, 2024, in Espoo and Vantaa, Finland. The U.S. enters the tournament off of a gold-medal finish at the 2023 event in Switzerland. Team USA has earned 11 gold medals in tournament history, the most of any competing country.

Team USA will play its preliminary-round games in Espoo at Metro Arena against Group A opponents Finland, Latvia, Norway and Slovakia. The quarterfinal round will be split between Espoo and Vantaa, while both semifinals and medal-round games will all take place in Espoo.

Group A on the opposite side of the bracket consists of Canada, Czechia, Germany, Kazastan and Sweden and they will play their games at Vantaa Trio Arena in Vantaa.

WATCH ON NHL NETWORK

NHL Network will provide exclusive telecasts of all Team USA games at the 2024 IIHF Under-18 Men's World Championship. The network will air all Team USA games live throughout the tournament, which begins Thursday (April 25) and runs through May 5 in Espoo and Vantaa, Finland.

ONE MORE SCORE

Forward **Cole Eiserman** delivered two power-play goals in yesterday's 7-2 semifinal win over Slovakia to bring his two-year total at USA Hockey's National Team Development Program to 126, tying Cole Caufield (2017-19) for the most all-time in program history.

With a score in his final game tonight, Eiserman can take sole possession of the career record in four fewer games played. Eiserman's 17 goals in U18 World Championship history are also one off the all-time U.S. mark, set by Caufield in 2018 and 2019.

KING KEMPF

Team USA has been riding goaltender **Nick Kempf** throughout the U18 Championship and that will continue tonight as he draws the start in the gold medal-game. Kempf has been the top netminder of the tournament, leading all qualified goaltenders in goals-against average (1.15), save percentage (.950), goals allowed (5) and shutouts (2), picking up wins in all five games started. Kempf has yet to allow a power-play goal against.

The University of Notre Dame commit's run currently has him tied for the third-best all-time GAA by a USA goaltender (1.15) and fifth in terms of save percentage (.950) in the history of the U18 Championship. With his fifth game played yesterday, Kempf qualifies for all-time goaltender records at the tournament, where he ranks tied for fourth in GAA and seventh in save percentage.

With the impressive run, Kempf has upped his season-long totals to a 23-6-0-2 record, 2.93 GAA and climbed back to a .900 SV% in 36 appearances with the NTDP.

GET UNDER THEIR SKIN

Special teams is going to play a huge factor in the outcome of tonight's gold medal-game. Canada enters action as the most penalized team in the tournament, having taken a tournament-high 149 penalty minutes through their first six games, an average of 24:50 per game, which includes 33 PIM in yesterday's semifinal win. Team USA has converted 13 times at a 52.0% clip on the power play, both tops amongst all 10 teams here.

BEEN HERE BEFORE

Team USA is no stranger to playing in the final game of the Under-18 Men's World Championship, as they have a tournament-high 16 appearances in the gold medal-game coming into tonight's contest.

The United States has won the most gold medals in tournament history, garnering its 11th last year with a come-from-behind, 3-2 overtime win over Sweden, courtesy of Ryan Leonard's golden goal. Cole Eiserman, James Hagens and Cole Hutson are all returners looking for their second gold medal.

THREE BEST PLAYERS

After the conclusion of yesterday's semifinal win, Team USA announced its three best players of the tournament. They were **James Hagens** (9g-13a--22pts), **Teddy Stiga** (6g-5a--11pts) and **Cole Hutson** (3g-7a--10pts).

NHL CENTRAL SCOUTING

Eighteen members of the 2024 U.S. Under-18 Men's National Team were named to the National Hockey League Central Scouting's Final Rankings ahead of the 2024 NHL Draft, set to take place June 28-29 at The Sphere in Las Vegas.

Trevor Connelly (Manhattan Beach, Calif.) was the highest-rated USA skater and finished at the number six overall ranking on the final report. **Cole Eiserman** (Newburyport, Mass.) sits in the 12th overall spot for North American skaters, while **Kamil Bednarik** (Chicago, Ill.) was also rated as a possible first-round selection at 28th overall.

Team USA was highly populated in the 2nd-3rd round projections, beginning with defenseman **EJ Emery** (Compton, Calif.) in at 39. He was followed closely behind by **Max Plante** (Hermantown, Minn.) at 43, and **Teddy Stiga** (Sudbury, Mass.) right behind at 44. A pair of defenseman were also given back-to-back rankings with **Cole Hutson** (Chicago, Ill.) at 55 and **Will Skahan** (Woodbury, Minn.) one spot behind at 56. Team USA captain **Brodie Ziemer** (Hutchinson, Minn.) rounded out the projected second-round choices with his ranking of 59.

Next up were **Christian Humphreys** (Pittsburgh, Pa.) and **Lucas Van Vliet** (Livonia, Minn.), who were named the 71st and 75th ranked North American skaters, respectively.

Austin Baker (White Lake, Mich.) was listed at 104, while **John Whipple** (Minnetonka, Minn.), **Brendan McMorro** (Lakeville, Minn.) and **Sam Laurila** (Moorhead, Minn.) were all tight together at 145, 147 and 148.

In net, all three Team USA netminders were ranked among North America's best. **Nick Kempf** (Chicago, Ill.) was the fourth-ranked netminder, **Jack Parsons** (Ithaca, N.Y.) came in at 13th and **Caleb Heil** (Victoria, Minn.) finished in the 23rd slot.

The other five members of Team USA - defensemen **Logan Hensler** (Woodbury, Minn.) and **Dakoda Rheume-Mullen** (Northville, Mich.), along with forwards **James Hagens** (Hauppauge, N.Y.), **LJ Mooney** (West Mifflin, Pa.) and **Shane Vansaghi** (St. Louis, Mo.) are not age eligible for this year's draft and will be available for the 2025 NHL Draft.
