MATCH PREVIEW

Indy Eleven returns home this Saturday to square off against Sporting KC II for a fourth and final time in 2021 - and Indiana's Team will do so with a "three points or bust" mentality as it looks to keep up with the playoff pace in the Central Division.

Why such urgency to win with 10 games left on the schedule? Because after Saturday night, it's a nine-game gauntlet to the finish where every match comes against a team Indy is fighting against for the fourth playoff spot or jockeying for position for a top-two slot that will come with homefield advantage in the opening round of the postseason. With five of those nine coming on the road, needing to claim three points at home every time out is starting to become more than just coach speak, it's starting to become a reality for Indy's playoff chances.

If it's possible to enter a match with momentum coming off a loss, Indy could very well do so after controlling traffic for the last 60 minutes of Wednesday night's disappointing 2-1 defeat at FC Tulsa. While the last-minute (and somewhat controversial) nature of the loss left the Boys in Blue stinging, the jumpstart of the squad's attack by Manuel Arteaga's team-leading seventh goal of the season in the 34th minute signaled a surge that resulted in 13 shots on the evening, the second most in a road game this season.

Meanwhile, SKC II will carry their own good feels into the weekend, a 3-0 win over OKC Energy FC at home last Saturday marking perhaps their most comprehensive performance of the season. That triumph - featuring goals by Osvaldo Cisneros (20'), Rojay Smith (72'), and Enoch Mushagalusa (79') - snapped a nine-game winless streak for Sporting dating back to a 1-0 win at Atlanta on July 10. In the two months since that result, SKC II has been outscored 8-3 in three away matches (2 losses, 1 draw) - and their road form could still be rusty, as Saturday night marks their first road trip since a 4-2 defeat at Birmingham exactly one month prior.

In contrast to a season ago when they split their four-game season series down the middle, Indy will look to close out the teams' 2021 slate undefeated on Saturday night. The Boys in Blue have collected a 2W-0L-1D record against the side in the Central Division basement this season, using a 2-0 home win in late May and a 2-1 victory in Interim Head Coach Max Rogers' debut in Kansas on June 20 to gain the upper hand.

The two sides met again just a few weeks ago at Children's Mercy Park on Aug. 22, goals by Wilson Harris and Jordan Hamilton offsetting each other in what was the first draw in the nine-game series to that point. In all, Indy Eleven has dominated the series with SKC II, collecting a 6W-2L-1D mark and 15-9 advantage in goals scored: that includes a 4W-2L-0D (9 GF/6 GA) record in games contested in the Circle City.

INDY ELEVEN FALLS 2-1 AT FC TULSA

A first half equalizer from forward Manuel Arteaga wasn't enough to secure three points as Indy Eleven fell 2-1 on the road at FC Tulsa Wednesday evening.

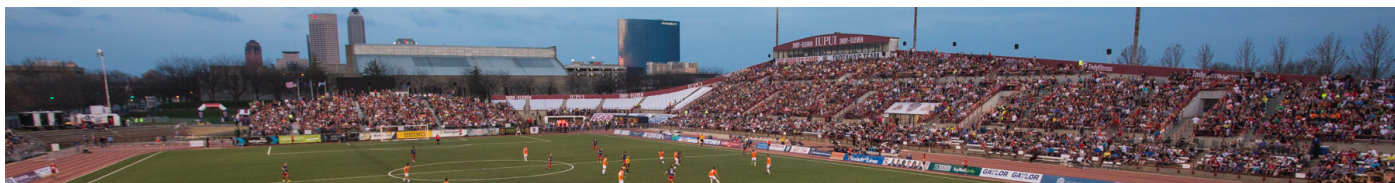
Wednesday's loss changes very little in the current Central Division standings, as Indy Eleven (7W-10L-5D, 26 pts.) still remains within a win of the fourth and final playoff spot with a game in hand on the two teams ahead of in the standings - Atlanta United 2 (5th) and OKC Energy FC (4th).

PETER-LEE VASSELL TO REPRESENT JAMAICAN NATIONAL TEAM IN WORLD CUP QUALIFIERS

Indy Eleven midfielder Peter-Lee Vassell has been called up to the Jamaican Men's National Team ahead of a trio of Concacaf region Final Round Qualifiers for the 2022 FIFA World Cup.

Vassell made his first international appearance since March 2020 as a late-game substitute in Jamaica's 2-1 loss against Mexico last Thursday. The 23-year-old was not on the 18 in his team's 3-0 loss against Panama on Sunday and remained on the bench in Jamaica's 1-1 draw vs. Costa Rica on Wednesday.

The St. James Parish, Jamaica native has turned heads in recent years with the Jamaican National Team, bagging six and four assists in 18 appearances with the "Reggae Boyz" at the senior international level including contests in the 2019 Concacaf Gold Cup and Concacaf Nations League.

INDY ELEVEN SIGNS QUARTET TO USL ACADEMY CONTRACTS

Indy Eleven added four new players to its roster via USL Academy contracts, including the youngest such signing in USL Championship history on Monday, August 9. The four new Boys in Blue are midfielders Diego Sanchez, Alann Torres, and Aiden Benitez and defender Ecris Revolorio, with Benitez taking the title of youngest player in USL Championship history at 14 years, three months and 26 days of age.

All four of Indy Eleven's new academy signings are local products, with each calling Westfield-based Indiana Fire Juniors Academy their home on the club side. Three of the four - Torres (Elkhart, Ind.), Sanchez (Indianapolis, Ind.) and Revolorio (Evansville, Ind.: IUPUI commit for 2022) - have already represented Indiana's Team in USL Academy League play, just part of the groundwork that was laid in working towards signing with the first team.

OFFSEASON OVERHAUL

The longer than usual offseason allowed Indy Eleven's tech staff to tinker with the roster more than usual, resulting in 16 new players on what is now Indy Eleven's 26-man roster. The newcomers include:

WELCOME BACK

Of the 10 returning players to Indy Eleven, only six were regular contributors during the 2020 campaign - GK Jordan Farr, DF Neveal Hackshaw, DF Karl Ouimette, MF Ayoze, MF Carl Haworth, and FW Nick Moon (the other four were Academy Contract returnees GK Alex Svetanoff, DF Matthew Senanou, MF Patrick McDonald, and FW Matthew Roo). Of those six regulars, Farr, Ayoze, and Ouimette will be spending their fourth seasons with Indiana's Team in 2021, Hackshaw his third, and Moon and Haworth their second.

TRANSFERS OF POWER

Part of the offseason makeover came in the form of five transfer transactions, marking what we believe to be the most active season ever for a USL Championship side in the transfer market. Four of those moves saw players sold to Major League Soccer franchises - FW Tyler Pasher (Houston Dynamo), GK Evan Newton (Vancouver Whitecaps), Josh Penn (Inter Miami), and Cal Jennings (LAFC) ... the latter actually never suiting up for the Boys in Blue after signing on a free transfer from Memphis 901 FC in December. Speaking of Memphis, that is where the fifth transfer, MF Mitch Guitar, landed after another transfer deal in March.

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MAXIMUM EFFECT

Indy Eleven welcomed a member of the Missouri side's coaching staff in the person of Max Rogers. Rogers spent 2018-20 USL Championship seasons as an assistant on the Saint Louis FC sidelines, and brings additional experience from time with MLS outfit Orlando City FC and Scottish side St. Mirren FC (read more in Rogers' mini bio later in the notes, or click here to read more at IndyEleven.com).

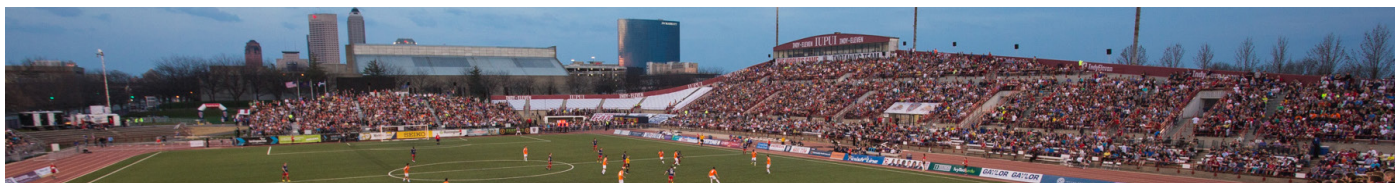

OH CAPTAINS, OUR CAPTAINS

Speaking of Ayoze and Karl Ouimette, the veteran duo were named this week as the team's Captain and Vice-Captain, respectively, for the 2021 season. Ayoze has more than earned the right to wear the captain's armband, the 35-year-old Spaniard serving as the elder-statesman of the squad and the heart of the soul of the team's on-field pulse. Backing him up will be the 28-year-old Quebec native Ouimette, who is taking the field for his tenth professional campaign in 2021. With Ayoze sitting out the season opener in Birmingham, it was Ouimette who was the first to don the armband for the Boys in Blue in 2021. Ayoze made his first appearance as captain after returning to the Starting XI on May 22 vs. Sporting Kansas City II.

WHO WHO WHO'S ... HOOSIERS

This year's squad has plenty of Hoosier State representation, with four players coming "Back Home Again" to Indiana (if you will). The three native Hoosiers new to the team are Auburn's own Rece Buckmaster, Bloomington native Jeremiah Gutjahr, and the pride of "The Region" in Crown Point's Alex Svetanoff. In addition, Jared Timmer is now an "honorary Hoosier" after spending four years at Butler University in Indianapolis from 2015-19, while Gutjahr and Buckmaster were "actual Hoosiers" while attending Indiana University, both attending the Bloomington campus from 2015-18.

STEP (BACK) UP TO "THE MIKE"

The May 8 home opener vs. Tulsa marked Indy Eleven's official return home to IUPUI's Michael A. Carroll Stadium, which Indiana's Team called home for its first four seasons of existence from 2014-17 (marking the squad's entire "NASL era"). In all, more than 620,000 fans and supporters filed into Carroll Stadium for a combined 70 regular season, postseason, Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup, and exhibition contests between 2014-2019, adding a new and electric atmosphere to Indianapolis' thriving sports scene along the way. Though the match was team's official return to "The Mike", it was not its first USL Championship games in the venue, as Indy Eleven hosted a pair of Eastern Conference Playoffs contests at Carroll Stadium in 2019.

CENTRAL FOCUS

After competing against a necessarily condensed slate of competition in 2020, Indy Eleven will expand its opposition horizons this year as a member of the eight-team Central Division, highlighted by the presence of archrival Louisville City FC. The new grouping also includes Atlanta United 2, Birmingham Legion FC, Memphis 901 FC, OKC Energy FC, FC Tulsa, and Sporting Kansas City. Indy Eleven will face each division foe four times throughout the 32-game season.

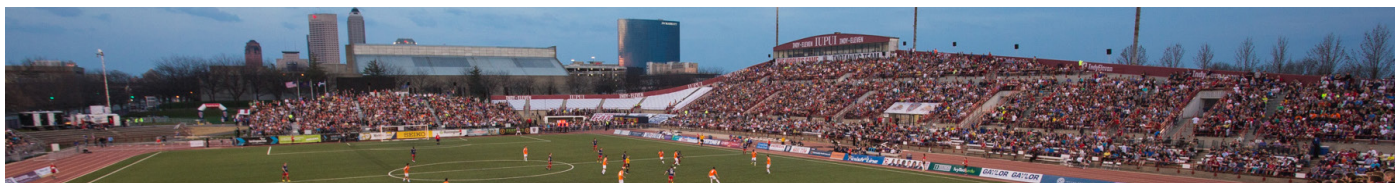
The squad's four match-ups against out-of-division opposition include several marquee matchups, featuring games against 2019 USL Championship title winner Real Monarchs SLC, two-time defending Western Conference runner-up El Paso Locomotive FC, perennial Eastern Conference contender Pittsburgh Riverhounds SC, and Eastern up-and-comer Loudoun United FC.

The season opener at Birmingham on Saturday, May 1 marked 210 days between regular season games for Indiana's Team - nearly SEVEN MONTHS since last year's regular season finale at Saint Louis FC on October 3, marking the longest break ever between games in the Eleven's now eight-season history.
