



MOUND WESTONKA HOCKEY ASSOCIATION FUNDRAISING POLICY

MWHA fundraising plays an important role in the associations financial standings. It is the goal of MWHA's fundraising efforts to supplement the associations operating costs, build a financially sustainable association, and maintain a registration fee that makes is competitive with area associations; enabling many kids a chance to play hockey. This goal is only possible with the support and participation of all members of the association.

1. Association Fundraising

- a. MWHA requires that all members, with a registered child in the association, participate in the fundraising activities set forth by the Fundraising Committee and the Board of Directors.
- b. MWHA Board of Directors and the Fundraising Committee will determine the fundraising activities for its members.
- c. The MWHA Board of Directors reserves the right to add, remove, or change any approved fundraising activity.
- d. Members that do not meet the minimum fundraising requirements set forth by the MWHA Board of Directors and Fundraising Committee will be considered a member not in good standing. This could result in player removal from the MWHA sponsored functions until requirements are fulfilled.
 - i. For the 2019-20 season, a raffle will be mandatory association fundraiser.
 - ii. Each **family** will be required to sell a minimum of 10 tickets. Alternatively, a family may buyout of the mandatory fundraiser by paying a \$75.00 buyout at registration.
- e. MWHA fundraising activities and minimum requirement for the year will be set in place prior to the start of the season.

2. Individual Fundraising

- a. The MWHA Board of Directors and Fundraising Committee recommends individual sponsored fundraising to help defer overall costs incurred during the season and build unity amongst its players, coaches, parents and managers.
- b. MWHA will offer fundraising options to players, and administer the program campaigns. Individual fundraising activities will promote team competitions and monies earned will be counted against a player's registrations fees for the following year. If a player is not returning, arrangements will be made case-by-case.
- c. Other fundraising activities must be approved by the Board of Directors and Fundraising committee.
- d. Certain types of fundraisers may be prohibited by state or federal law.
