THE LINE-UP: SPEAKER BIOS

PETER J. FADDE, PH.D.

(PROFESSOR, SOUTHERN ILLINOIS UNIVERSITY)

Dr. Fadde researches training of perceptual and decision skills in high-speed, high-stress performance domains including military and sports. His e-book *The Sixth Tool: Training Baseball Pitch Recognition* is available on Amazon. Dr. Fadde consults with major league baseball organizations and college baseball teams; he is Chief Science Officer of game Sense Sports, LLC.

PAUL BABCOCK

A 1993 College Captain on Gordie Gillespie's St. Francis, National Championship team, Babcock also was a Grad Assistant Coach under this baseball legend. He was a Head Baseball Coach in Illinois for 15 years and now assists at Victor J. Andrew High School in Orland Hills, Illinois.

JUSTIN DEHMER

A former college player at Kansas State University and Grand Canyon University, Dehmer became Baseball Coach at Martensdale-St. Mary's, where he put together an impressive 203-48 (.809) winning record and was selected as the Coach of the Year in Iowa in 2010, 2011, and 2012. His team was nationally recognized for their 88-game winning streak, which is the 2nd best ever in high school baseball.

After winning back-to-back-to-back State Championships in 2010 (43-0), 2011 (44-0), 2012 (40-5), Coach Dehmer left coaching high school baseball to invest in what means more to him than any championship, his family.

He continues to stay close to the game as a clinic speaker, writing books/articles about the mental game and planning for excellence with the 1-Pitch Warrior System. He has helped countless organizations reach new heights and teams win regional, state, and national championships.

BOB MORGAN

Bob Morgan began his coaching career at the high school level, but moved to the college ranks and Indiana University, where is the coach with the most wins in Indiana history, regardless of the sport. After thirty years at the collegiate level, Coach Morgan compiled a record of 1,074 wins and 586 losses. He is just one of 40 baseball coaches to reach 1,000 wins and is the 34th winningest baseball coach in NCAA history. Bob played and graduated from Ohio University prior to pitching professionally in the Detroit Tigers' organization. He is a much sought after Clinician.

ERIC CRUISE (RIPON COLLEGE)

A native of Oregon, Wis., Cruise graduated from Oregon High School in 1995, where he received the Jack Statz award as a senior, which is given to the senior that shows the most commitment to the program with hard work and dedication.

On May 21, 2012, the Ripon College athletic department announced Eric Cruise as its 14th head baseball coach in school history. He spent the previous 11 years as an assistant coach for the Red Hawks.

The 2019 season saw Cruise lead the Red Hawks to their first MWC Tournament appearance in four years, advancing to the MWC Championship Game. They finished that year with a 24-18 record.

KEVIN TOMASIEWICZ (UW-OSHKOSH)

A pitcher at UW-Whitewater from 2002-05, Tomasiewicz is the WIAC's career leader with 35 victories against only five defeats. He received All-America awards in 2003 and 2005, while being named the Most Valuable Player at the 2005 NCAA Division III World Series..

The New York Mets selected Tomasiewicz in the 26th round of the 2005 MLB Draft. He pitched four years in the minor leagues, totaling a 17-8 record and 4.04 ERA. Tomasiewicz compiled 19 saves and a 2.60 ERA for the Hagerstown (Md.) Suns during 2006.

Kevin Tomasiewicz came to UW-Oshkosh from North Park University (Ill.), where he served as associate head coach from 2012-13. He enters his seventh season as UW-Oshkosh's head baseball coach.

HIGH SCHOOL COACHES BOB JOHNSON (EAU CLAIRE NORTH), RYAN MCGINNIS (KIMBERLY) AND SCOTT FARMER (ANTIGO)

Each of these coaches has won a State Title and each has been named the "Wisconsin Coach of the Year" at sometime in their career. Some of Wisconsin's best, they will share some of their secrets.

TOM WILSON (ST. NORBERT COLLEGE)

A Wisconsin High School Hall of Fame Coach, Tom retired from his job at Seymour High School in 2014, after 330 career victories, and became an extremely valuable Assistant College Coach at St. Norbert. An outstanding college catcher, Tom will share his knowledge about the game and this important position.

KYLE NELSON (BURLINGTON CENTRAL HS IN ILLINOIS)

Kyle holds many important positions at Burlington, including Strength and Conditioning Director, Head Girls Golf Coach and Head Baseball Coach. An excellent coach, He is also the Clinic Director of the Illinois High School Baseball Coaches Association.
