

USA SOFTBALL OF HAWAII/OAHU JUNIOR OLYMPICS (OJO)

COVID-19 Mandatory Reporting Policy

- If you or anyone in your immediate family/household tests positive or is under investigation for possible COVID-19 exposure, you are required to notify your head coach and team health manager immediately.
- Shortly thereafter, the head coach or team health manager shall contact OJO's Health Officer (Andrew Garrett) at andrew@usasoftballhawaii.org or (808) 354-1108 and share as much information possible about the situation.
- OJO will contact the Department of Health (DOH) to discuss the situation and initiate contact tracing. OJO will notify the parents of all registered players and coaches on the team of this development (while protecting the privacy of the player/coach in question) and lay out next steps.
- The player or member of the coaching staff in question shall not participate in any team activities until cleared to do so by the DOH.
- If the DOH determines that COVID-19 transmission may have occurred within a team or between two teams, that team/those teams shall immediately halt all activities. Activities may resume only when the DOH determines that it is safe to do so.
- Coaches or players who test positive must quarantine for a minimum of 10 calendar days and receive proof from the DOH that they have been released from isolation before returning to any OJO sanctioned activities (includes practices and games). In accordance with DOH Guidance for Youth Sports (issued 2/10/2021), players who have recovered from COVID-19 must be cleared by their physician before returning to play. A physician's note shall be made available for review by OJO.
- Coaches or players who are awaiting the results of a COVID-19 test shall not participate in any team activities until a negative test result is received.
- OJO takes its responsibility to ensure a safe playing environment seriously. As such, violations of this mandatory reporting policy may result in the suspension or expulsion of the player and coaching staff.
