WHO IS NORTH MARIN UNITED

North Marin United is a competitive youth soccer club serving players in Novato and the surrounding communities who are seeking a more advanced playing environment. The club is committed to fostering player development by emphasizing both technical proficiency and tactical understanding, supporting growth at the individual and team levels.

The program offers teams across a range of ages and competitive tiers, including Premier, Gold, Silver, and Bronze levels, allowing players to participate at an appropriate level for their development. All teams are guided by a staff of professionally licensed coaches, under the leadership of the Director of Coaching, Yasert Ortega, and Assistant Director of Coaching, Lauren Byrd, who provide consistent oversight and a structured developmental framework.

TRYOUTS 2026/2027

Why are there tryouts for North Marin United teams?

Tryouts will be conducted by the NMU staff to assess each player's current technical and tactical abilities. The players that are selected for NMU teams will be placed on teams based on the assessment at tryouts. Key features for team formation include:

- Age level
- Team development level
- Player skill level
- Player coachability
- Player attitude
- Commitment for year
- Space availability- each team has a set number of roster spots



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NMU Player Placement Policy: Playing Up in Age Group

At North Marin United, our mission is to provide each player with the best possible environment for long-term development. Occasionally, this may involve evaluating a player for placement in an older age group—commonly referred to as “*playing up*.”

Definition

“Playing up” is the assignment of a player to a team that competes in an age group older than the player’s grade year (August 1- July 31).

Purpose

This policy is designed to ensure that any decision to allow a player to play up is:

- Developmentally appropriate
- Consistent with NMU’s player-first philosophy
- Fair to all players within the club

Eligibility Criteria

A player may be considered for playing up only if they demonstrate the following:

- **Technical Proficiency:** Mastery of ball control, passing, receiving, and other key skills at a level beyond their current age group
- **Tactical Understanding:** Strong decision-making and awareness suited for the older age group’s game model
- **Physical Readiness:** Ability to handle the physical demands of older players, including speed, strength, and endurance
- **Emotional & Social Maturity:** Confidence, resilience, and the ability to integrate and communicate within an older peer group

Evaluation Process

Playing up is not automatic or requested by parents, it is initiated by NMU’s technical staff and:

- Reviewed by the Director of Coaching.
- Informed by coach observations, tryout performance, and development history.
- Involves direct communication with the player’s family when appropriate.



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Policy Notes

- Players are only placed up if it benefits their individual development.
- Playing up must not displace age-appropriate players or disrupt team dynamics.
- All players are subject to ongoing review to ensure the placement remains appropriate.

Grade-Year Alignment (August Birthdays)

North Marin United recognizes that US Club Soccer's transition to a **Grade-Year model** (August 1 – July 31) separates players from their classmates. Specifically, players born in **August** may fall into a birth-year bracket that is younger than their actual school grade level.

To foster a positive social and competitive environment, NMU offers the following provision for players born between **August 1 and August 31**:

- **Eligibility to Try Out:** Any player born in August is eligible to try out for the age group corresponding with their school grade year.
- **Exemption from Standard Play-Up Criteria:** August-born players seeking grade alignment are **not** required to demonstrate "mastery beyond their age group." Instead, they must simply meet the standard competitive requirements to make the roster of the older team during tryouts.
- **Registration Process:** Players will be flagged as an August birthday when registering and asked preference.
- **Final Placement:** Placement is not guaranteed and is subject to roster availability and the technical staff's assessment of the player's ability to compete safely and effectively at the older level.

Tryout Implication

During tryouts, players may be evaluated across multiple age groups if identified by coaches or technical staff. However, final placement will prioritize each player's developmental needs, team fit, and long-term growth.



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What can I expect from tryouts?

Tryouts will consist of several days of on-field activity. These activities would include technical exercises, small-sided games, and scrimmages.

How many sessions does my child need to attend?

We recommend attending as many sessions as possible. A minimum of two sessions is recommended to allow the coaches to get the most accurate assessment of your player's current ability level. If for any reason a player is unable to attend more than one session, please inform the coaching staff on the tryout date. *Makeup tryout sessions will not be offered.*

Do I need to register my child to participate in tryouts?

Yes, we do require that all players that intend to participate in the 2026/27 NMU Tryouts register in advance. There is no charge to participate in the tryouts, but we do need to know in advance that your child will be joining us. TEAM FORMATION

What happens after tryouts?

After the completion of tryouts, the NMU staff will get together to discuss team placement for the players that attended tryouts. Upon confirmation of who will be offered a position on a team, the coach will then reach out to the players and families to discuss options.

What should I be prepared for if my child is offered a spot on a team?

We appreciate that this can be a stressful time and that families need some time to decide. We will place each child in what we deem to be the most appropriate environment for their development and for them to reach their full potential.



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We hope that all players will be able to accept or decline their offer immediately, but ultimately *you have 48 hours to decide*. We will provide all the team information so that players and parents will be informed and hopefully *prepared to make a final decision no matter what team is offered*.

JOINING NORTH MARIN UNITED

What does my acceptance mean?

When you accept the honor of becoming part of the NMU family, you are making a commitment to your child, and to the other children on your team, that you will be present at team activities (training and games) to provide the most positive experience for all.

What is the commitment?

First commitment is **our** commitment to you for the year to provide your child with a positive learning environment. The second is **your commitment to your team for the full season**. Your commitment would include attending a minimum of two training sessions per week, league games, and any tournaments that

your team elects to attend. The season begins June 2026 and runs through May 2027, with holidays and school breaks taken into consideration.

August Commitment: Families should plan for possible tournament participation in August, especially for competitive teams.

- **Participation Factors:** Attendance in August tournaments is not guaranteed for every team; participation depends on team readiness, roster availability, and league/tournament alignment.
- **Expectation of Availability:** Availability during August should be expected as part of NMU's competitive commitment.

*See **appendix A** for calendar details. A team schedule can be obtained from your team coach, outlining the year's events, tournaments, vacation breaks and expectations.



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NORTH MARIN UNITED COACHING STAFF

How are coaches assigned to teams?

Coach placement with teams is based on a variety of factors which include coaching experience, licensing, DOC and Assistant DOC assessment, parent feedback, number of years with a specific team, among other factors.

How long will a coach stay with a team?

In general, a coach will only be with a team for a two-year cycle. There may be exceptions where a coach stays for a third year, or possibly longer with our oldest age groups.

What should I expect my coach to provide?

As a parent here are the things you can expect from your coach:

- a positive training environment
- two trainings per week
- participation in league play and tournaments
- punctuality
- communication regarding the team and your child
- an evaluation of your child in the second half of the season.
- professionalism on the sideline

NORTH MARIN UNITED FEES AND FINANCIAL OBLIGATIONS

In a typical season, NMU Tryouts take place in May, and training begins in June. The teams may elect to participate in:

- NorCal Playdate Soccer Events (U8-U11)
- NorCal Fall Season (U9-U19)
- NorCal State Cup Tournament (U9-U19)
- NorCal Spring Season (U9-U19)
- Regional Tournaments (U8-U19)
- Local Spring / Fall Seasons (U8)



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In a typical season, teams will train twice per week and will offer special training events on Fridays over the course of the season. These training events may include special focus on goalkeeper training and position focused training.

Our Director of Coaching works each day to ensure that our program offerings meet the needs of our players, aligning our training curriculum and working with our coaches to provide high quality training, and positive instructional techniques at both training and games.

North Marin United hires licensed professional coaches and requires the continuation of education and licensing to ensure that our coaches are not only qualified, but up to date with the training skills required for our ever-evolving game.

DEFINITION OF FEES

All families should be made clear of the financial responsibility that is expected when participating with a competitive team.

There are 5 types of fees that are included in the overall cost of the season: **Registration Fees, NorCal Fees, Training Fees, Team Participation Fees and Uniform Kits.**

1) Registration Fees are paid to Novato Youth Soccer Association and are due at the time of registration. The registration fee for the 2026/27 season is **\$515.00**. Your registration fee covers:

- Player Insurance and Registration Fees with US Club Soccer
- Field Rental for tryouts, games, special events and training
- Compensation for Referees
- Field Equipment such as goals, nets, flags, first aid kits, goal stakes, field boxes, locks
- Field lining labor and paint
- Club and Board of Director Insurance
- Administrative Fees



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2) NorCal Fees are due upon registration and used by Novato Youth Soccer Association to pay the registration fees for teams to compete in NorCal league competitions. This fee has traditionally been a part of the **Team Participation Fees** and has been moved out as a standalone fee to provide players and their families better transparency and cost expectations.

- **NorCal fees for U8 – U9** are **\$30.00** for the 2026/27 Season
- **NorCal fees for U10 – U12** are **\$135.00** for the 2026/27 Season
- **NorCal fees for U13 – U18** are **\$95.00** for the 2026/27 Season

Additional fees for tournaments and additional NorCal events will still be collected through **4) Team Participation Fees**.

3) Training fees are paid to Novato Youth Soccer Association and are used to pay expenses related to coaching, professional staff, licensing/certifications, compliance requirements, and overall player development programming. The training fees may be paid in full at the time of registration or parents may elect to choose a 5-month installment payment plan.

- **Training fees for U8 – U9** are **\$1,850.00** for the 2026/27 Season
- **Training fees for U10 – U12** are **\$1,950.00** for the 2026/27 Season
- **Training fees for U13 – U18** are **\$2,050.00** for the 2026/27 Season

4) Team Participation Fees are determined by the budget your coach submits for the season. All team budgets are reviewed and approved by NMU prior to being shared and invoiced to families. Team participation fees should be paid upon receipt. Payment plans are allowed with limitations and are finalized with prior approval from the League Treasurer.

Please note - failure to fundraise or pay your Team Participation Fee may result in your son or daughter being suspended from playing for that team, by North Marin United. Team participation fees are used to cover:



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- Play-date registration fees
- Tournament fees
- Team associated fees such as a team bench or team canopy, or other equipment related to the needs of that team.
- Coach reimbursement for travel to and from games, as well as lodging at tournaments.

Parents will work closely with their team treasurer to ensure all team expenses are paid and parent donations are managed appropriately. NYSA provides banking software (SnapSpend) for which all teams must use and must direct all funds through.

Payment & Communication

Invoices will be sent through the SnapSpend app. Please monitor your email (including your junk folder) for messages from SnapSpend. After registering, you may download the mobile app; if you experience login issues, please access your account first from a desktop or laptop.

Team Fees

Team participation fees are separate from league registration and coaching fees. These fees are due before September 1. The team treasurer and coach will provide the amount and payment details at the first team meeting.

The League Treasurer will retain oversight of your funds and is available to you for questions.

Typically, one can anticipate additional team fees to be approximately \$250 - \$350 per player for the season.

5) Uniform Kits for the 2026/27 season range between **\$140.00 - \$350.00**. More information on how to order will be provided at the first team meeting.



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2026/27 REGISTRATION

Each player will be required to register and pay the registration fee using our online registration platform. Prior to accessing the on-line registration system prepare the following documents. All players, new and returning, will be required to upload these documents at the time of registration.

Player photo

Take a photo of your player, ***this must be a recent photo and a headshot only***. Think of this as a driver license photo, it will become part of the player pass card. No hats, sunglasses or additional background images may be included. You will be uploading this photo during the registration process.

Birth certificate or current passport

A birth certificate (clear and legible only) or a current passport is required for all players. Have a copy of this document saved as a PDF prepared to upload. Documents that are not clear and or expired passports will not be accepted and delay your registration approval.

Debit or credit card

All registration fees require payment with a debit or credit card to complete the process.

What is a pass card?

Once you have completed your on-line registration it will be submitted to US Club Soccer, our governing agency, for approval. Upon their approval your player is added to the roster and a US Club Player Pass card is issued. This card is required for all events, and it will include the photo of your player as you submitted it at the time of registration.

All player pass cards are retained by the Team Manager and/or Coach and are property of North Marin United.



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Sexual Abuse and Safe Sport Authorization Act of 2017

If your player is 18 years of age and older or will be turning 18 during this season, please review:

The Protecting Young Victims from Sexual Abuse and Safe Sport Authorization Act of 2017 (the "SafeSport Act") requires players 18 years of age and older and any player that turns 18 years of age during any given season, to complete the US Club Soccer SafeSport training. Per this Act a player's pass card will not be issued, and the player will not appear on an Official Roster until these requirements are complete and approved.

North Marin United Financial Assistance Program

At Novato Youth Soccer, we believe that all children, regardless of their family's financial status, should be able to participate in programs that enrich their lives, encourage physical fitness, and provide them with life skills for the future. Each year NYSA offers financial assistance to those in need so that they may participate in our programs.

Financial assistance approval is based upon financial need and availability of scholarship funds. Not all applications are approved. Previous awards of aid are not necessarily a direct indicator of a potential award in the coming season.

Financial assistance awards will not cover the full fees required to participate in North Marin United.

Transferring from NYSA Recreation program to North Marin United

Paid registration fees for our Recreation league for a player that is selected to be on one of our competitive team rosters will be refunded in full. In all cases, a player can only be registered for one or the other, either play on a Recreational NYSA team or a competitive North Marin United team.

If you are considering having your child try out for a North Marin United team, we encourage you to first register for the Recreation league during our open Recreation registration period. NMU tryouts occur after our Recreation league registration closes. By registering your child for Recreation soccer, you will ensure that your child has an opportunity to play soccer if they do not make an NMU team roster.

PLAYER PARTICIPATION AND EXPECTATIONS

Players are expected to come to training and games and participate in all exercises and activities as instructed by the coach.

Players should be respectful of coaches, officials, opponents, and teammates. Excessive talking and other disruptive behaviors during training sessions and games will not be tolerated.

A coach has the right to remove a player from a training session or game if behavior problems become serious. The coach will then contact the parents and try to work out a solution. If a player's behavior problems continue to where the team is seriously disrupted, the coach will discuss the problem with the DOC, or the North Marin United Competitive Sub Committee.



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Attendance policy and playing time

North Marin United recognizes that as players progress, the competitive environment changes. Our playing time policy is now tiered to reflect the level of play:

7v7 Format (All Levels)

- **Minimum Playing Time:** These teams follow the standard developmental guideline of receiving fair playing time, averaging approximately **40% of total available game minutes** over the course of a season.
- **Core Objectives:** Development, confidence, and meaningful match exposure remain the primary priorities at this stage.

9v9 and Above

- **Gold, Silver, Bronze, and Copper Teams:** These teams continue to follow the standard developmental guideline of receiving fair playing time, averaging approximately **40% of total available game minutes**.
- **Higher Level Teams (Pre-NPL, NPL, etc.):** For these high-level competitive environments, coaches are granted greater discretion over playing time. While the goal remains player development, playing time is not guaranteed to meet a specific percentage and is earned based on the competitive needs of the team.

Tournaments and State Cup (All Ages and Levels)

- **Policy Exemption:** Standard playing time allocations do not apply during tournament play or State Cup "knockout" matches.
- **Tactical Rotation:** While the club's philosophy is that all rostered players should participate in every game, coaches have the authority to manage rotations more strictly to meet the tactical demands of knockout or championship-style play.



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Factors Influencing Playing Time: Across all levels, a coach's decision regarding minutes played is informed by:

- Attendance and commitment.
- Player behavior and attitude during training and games.
- Technical skill level and tactical execution.
- Real-time game decisions and tactical requirements.

Suspension from games

A coach may suspend a player for all or a portion of one game for a serious breach of conduct (for example, direct defiance of the coach, intentionally striking another player, or bullying). It is mandatory that both the player and the parents be notified of the reason for the full or partial suspension prior to the day of the game unless the problem occurs during the game.

Striking a coach or an official will lead to an automatic suspension and loss of NYSA membership. A parent or spectator may be suspended from a game by a North Marin United coach, and this suspension may be perpetuated by the League upon review of circumstances.

PARENT PARTICIPATION AND EXPECTATIONS

While each parent has a different level of expectation with respect to their child's ability, parents should attend team training sessions, games, etc., regularly. Additionally, parents should maintain an open line of communication using the protocols set forth by the coach, understanding the overall strategic plan for not only their player but their team.

Coach/parent communications should be scheduled between the coach and parent. It is never appropriate for the coach/parent to have a discussion immediately following a training or game unless it has been previously scheduled.



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NMU has a 24-Hour Respect Window allowing all parties ample time to assess issue validity, etc. Additionally, this 24-Hour Respect Window allows the coach ample time to evaluate the entire game.

A coach has the right to enact the 24-hour rule, requesting that the parent wait 24 hrs. before communicating with the coach. Multiple breaches of the 24-hour rule will result in a parent suspension from team activities and games until meeting with the club VP for further discussion.

*** Please note** that the 24-hour Respect Window includes all communication including but not limited to: Sideline Visits, Parking Lot Visits, Cell / Home Phone Calls, Messages, Emails and Text Messages.

Parent Sideline Behavior

While there are many circumstances that can cause extreme frustration at a sporting event, these are youth soccer events. In most cases the players, and referees, are children or teenagers. In **ALL** cases, parents should act respectfully and in a gracious manner. Parents should encourage their players and the opposing players. Parents are never allowed to enter the field of play, before, during, or after a game, and shall never address a referee or opposing coach under any circumstance.

Sideline Coaching

Coaching from the sideline is prohibited. Coaches are instructing based on NMU Methodology and team development. Learning is a process and mistakes are expected. Players should be encouraged and not given instruction from spectators. A spectator coaching from the sideline can be asked to leave the game and field. Continued sideline coaching can potentially result in suspension of the parent and meeting with the club VP.

Alcohol and Substance Policy

To ensure a safe, family-friendly environment for our youth athletes, the possession or consumption of alcohol is strictly prohibited at all NMU facilities and NMU matches.

- **Enforcement:** Any parent or spectator found in possession of alcohol or appearing inebriated will be asked to leave the field and game premises immediately.



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- **Disciplinary Action:** All incidents involving alcohol will be forwarded to the NMU Board of Directors for further review and potential disciplinary action, which may include suspension from future events.

Field Rules & Parent Presence During Training

- **Facility Compliance:** NMU is required to follow all city, school, and facility field rules and restrictions.
- **Training Access:** Parents are not permitted on the field during training sessions, unless explicitly approved by the club or coaching staff.
- **Policy Support:** This policy ensures player safety, maintains coach effectiveness and session flow, and ensures compliance with facility agreements and insurance requirements.
- **Observation:** Parents are welcome to observe from designated viewing areas when available.

Parent Volunteer Expectations

Each North Marin United family is required to contribute volunteer hours to their team each season. The success of each team relies heavily on the number of volunteers and follow through of these volunteer positions. North Marin United team volunteering opportunities are as follows. It is required that each team family volunteer for one of these positions for the 2026/27 season.

- **Team Manager**
- **Assistant Team Manager**
- **Team Treasurer**
- **Travel Coordinator**
- **Home Field Coordinator/Set Up Crew**
- **Team Historian**
- **Fundraising Coordinator**



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Every successful team fills its positions with key personnel interested and qualified as they see fit. There is NO volunteer opt out fee, and/or excusable circumstance related to not volunteering. NYSA/NMU reserves the right to suspend Player Pass Cards if parent volunteering requirements are not met.

The head coach for each team will assign parents to any position not filled.

Parent Mentoring

In all cases, parents are expected to be supportive of the coach, referees, and tournament officials. We hope that parents realize that organized youth sports teach life lessons, and our own behavior is the behavior we will be teaching our children.

Suspension From Games, Season, Lifetime Bans

NYSA, NorCal and/or US Club Soccer may suspend a parent for one or more games, including lifetime bans, based on a specific incident, or an accumulation of incidents. Additionally, Novato Youth Soccer Association shall reserve the right to include local Police Municipalities in cases of threat or violence against players, referees, spectators, league or tournament officials, or any party involved in a team sanctioned event. The Novato Youth Soccer Association Board of Directors shall determine a course of action based on the specific incident and severity of that said incident.

Issue Resolution

Over the course of the season, families may take issue either with a coach, or the league. In all cases, North Marin United requires that all parties wait 24 hours prior to speaking with a coach or contacting the league. This time allows all parties to gain clarity and calm prior to discussing the issue. Following the 24-hour cooling off period, we suggest that the concerned party contact the coach directly. There is no need for the manager to be involved in an issue that concerns a parent with respect to their son or daughter. If a parent is unable to resolve an issue directly with a coach, the concerned parent should contact our Vice President of the Competitive program work to resolve the issue directing it to the appropriate party.



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COMMUNICATIONS

Coach To Team Communication

The team coach is the main conduit of communication for team schedules, and events, etc.

Coach Attendance

If a coach is unable to attend training or a game, it is the sole responsibility of the Head Coach to find an approved and certified replacement. North Marin United also requires that the Head Coach notify the VP of NMU, DOC and Team Manager confirming all details of the temporary fill-in.

A Successful Season

Thank you for becoming a valued member of the North Marin United Family! We are genuinely excited about the upcoming 2025/26 season and are committed to providing your son or daughter with an exceptional experience as they engage with the beautiful game of soccer. Our dedicated team is focused on fostering a nurturing environment where young athletes can develop their skills, build lasting friendships, and enjoy the thrill of teamwork. 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Appendix: 2026–2027 Fee Structure (NMU)

Fee Definitions

Registration Fee

An administrative fee that supports the yearly operational costs associated with being a player in the club.

NorCal Fees

Covers league participation including Fall League, Spring League, and State Cup. State Cup fees are included for U10 and older age groups.

Training Fees

Covers expenses related to coaching, professional staff, field usage, league games, referees, and overall player development programming.

Team Fees

An additional, team-specific fee that varies depending on each team’s planned activities and events throughout the year.

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Team Fees & Budget Overview

Team fees are determined at the team level and are based on planned activities for the season. These are invoiced separately from club fees.

Typical Team Budget Components

Category	Description
Tournaments	Most teams participate in 2–3 tournaments per year.
Team Equipment	Includes balls, pinnies, cones, and other needs.
Coach Travel	Varies based on travel distance and hotel needs.

Additional Notes

- The average team fee ranges from \$250–\$350 per player, but may vary depending on
 - Number of players on the roster
 - Tournament selection
 - Travel requirements
- All team budgets are reviewed and approved by NMU prior to being shared and invoiced to families.
- Tournament, team equipment, and coach travel expenses are not included in club registration, NorCal, or training fees.
- State Cup is included for U10 and older age groups as part of NorCal fees.
- U8–U9 teams choosing to participate in State Cup will include it as one of their tournaments within team fees.
- Uniforms can be purchased as a package or individual pieces. A full uniform package costs around \$140 +tax.
