LAST TIME OUT

Hilary Knight opened the game's scoring just under 12 minutes into the game, capitalizing on a backhand from right outside the crease on a power play. Following a scoreless second, Canada found the net with 2:20 remaining in the third to knot the game at 1-1 and send it to overtime. Both teams saw chances in the extra frame, but no team scored. In the shootout, Knight, Hannah Bilka and Kelly Pannek scored in the shootout, while Gwyneth Philips blanked all three Canadian attempts.

QUICK SHOTS

TONIGHT'S MATCH UP

Today's game marks the fifth and final game of the 2024-25 Rivalry Series, presented by Discover and is the second game in two days. The two teams last met on Thursday, Feb. 6, 2025, in Halifax, Nova Scotia.

IN THE 2024-25 RIVALRY SERIES...

Heading into game five, the series is tied at 2-2. The U.S. won game one, 7-2, and game four, 2-1 (SO), while Canada took game two, 5-4 (SO) and game three, 4-1.

IN THE RIVALRY SERIES...

Started during the 2018-19 season by USA Hockey and Hockey Canada, the Rivalry Series is in its fifth season (2018-19, 2019-20, 2022-23, 2023-24), with the U.S. holding a slight 9-4-4-8 (W-OTW-OTL-L) advantage.

IT ALL COMES DOWN TO THIS...AGAIN

For the third straight Rivalry Series and fourth time in the series all-time, the winner will be decided in the final game.

PHILIPS STANDS TALL IN NET

In just her second career start for Team USA, **Gwyneth Philips** dominated between the pipes, earning her first career victory. Philips stopped 32 of 33 shots in the game before blanking all three Canadian shootout attempts.

SHOOTOUT WINS

The U.S.' 2-1 shootout victory over Canada is the second shootout of the 2024-25 Rivalry Series and Team USA's first shootout win in the Rivalry Series since game one of the 2022-23 Rivalry Series when the U.S. took a 4-3 victory in Kelowna, B.C.

FIRST TIME IN P.E.I.

Today marks the first time the U.S. Women's National Team has faced Canada in the province of Prince Edward Island. The U.S. has never skated in the province previously.

FIRST FEBRUARY WIN SINCE 2020

Thursday's win marked the first Rivalry Series victory in the month of February for Team USA in almost five years and was the first February victory since a 4-3 overtime win in Anaheim, Calif., on February 8, 2020.

KNIGHT TIME

Once again, Hilary Knight showed up in the clutch for Team USA. She has a team-leading four goals in the 2024-25 Rivalry Series and has scored in 11 of the last 24 meetings between the two teams dating back to the 2022 IIHF Women's World Championship.

RIVALRY SERIES, PRESENTED BY DISCOVER

One of the fiercest rivalries in all of sports returns as the U.S. Women's National Team and Canada face off in the 2024-25 Rivalry Series, presented by Discover. Slated for five games, the series opens up with three games in the United States in November, followed by the final two games of the series in February in Canada.

Established by USA Hockey and Hockey Canada during the 2018-2019 season, the Rivalry Series is an annual showcase of the highest level of women's hockey at varying locations in the United States and Canada.

Hilary Knight (Sun Valley, Idaho) is the captain of Team USA for the 2024-25 Rivalry Series. **Megan Keller** (Farmington Hills, Mich.) returns as alternate captain.

John Wroblewski is the head coach of the 2024-25 U.S. Women's National Team. **Shari Dickerman**, **Brent Hill** and **Josh Sciba** are serving as assistant coaches, while **Alli Altmann** is the team's goaltending coach.

TEAM TIDBITS

2024 WOMEN'S WORLDS RETURNEES

The November Rivalry Series roster returns 12 players from the 2024 edition of the team that took home silver at the IIHF Women's World Championship in April 2024. Returners include Cayla Barnes, Hannah Bilka, Kendall Coyne Schofield, Britta Curl-Salemme, Aerin Frankel, Savannah Harmon, Taylor Heise, Nicole Hensley, Megan Keller, Hilary Knight, Kelly Pannek and Gwyneth Philips.

2022 U.S. OLYMPIC TEAM RETURNEES

In total, eight players on the February roster of the Rivalry Series were members of the 2022 U.S. Olympic Team that took home silver in Beijing in February 2022. Olympians include, Cayla Barnes, Jesse Compher, Kendall Coyne Schofield, Savannah Harmon, Nicole Hensley, Megan Keller, Hilary Knight and Kelly Pannek.

PATTY KAZMAIER MEMORIAL AWARD HONOREES

Four members of the team have been honored with the Patty Kazmaier Memorial Award, bestowed annually to the best women's player in NCAA Division I college hockey: **Taylor Heise** (2022), **Aerin Frankel** (2021), **Kendall Coyne Schofield** (2016) and **Izzy Daniel** (2024).

COLLEGE CONNECTION

All 21 athletes on the Team USA roster have competed as women's hockey student-athletes at a U.S. college or university. Northeastern University and the University of Wisconsin lead the way with four players, while Ohio State University has three. Colgate University, the University of Minnesota and the University of Minnesota Duluth have two players on the roster, while Boston College, Cornell University, Clarkson University and Lindenwood University has one.

U18 WOMEN'S WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP ALUMNI

All but eight of the 21 players on the roster have represented the U.S. at an IIHF Under-18 Women's World Championship. Most recently, Hannah Bilka skated in the 2019 IIHF Under-18 Women's World Championship in Obihiro, Japan, where the U.S. took home silver.

PWHL REPRESENTATION

All 21 players representing Team USA play professionally for the Professional Women's Hockey League. Five players skate for the defending Walter Cup Champions, Minnesota Frost, while another five are members of the Boston Fleet. Four skate for the Montreal Victoire, three skate for both the Toronto Sceptres and Ottawa Charge, while one skates for the New York Sirens. Kendall Coyne Schofield serves as the captain of the Frost and Hilary Knight serves as the captain of the Fleet.

STATUS UPDATE

Alex Carpenter, Hayley Scamurra, Grace Zumwinkle and Gabby Rosenthal were invited to join Team USA at the February Rivalry Series. Due to injury all four were unable to attend.

LIFE UPDATES FROM THE U.S. WOMEN'S NATIONAL TEAM

Forward Britta Curl-Salemme got married in September to Andrew Salemme. The pair met in 2020 on the campus of the University of Wisconsin where Andrew was a wrestling student-athlete ... Harmon also recently moved to Toronto as she was part of a blockbuster trade that sent her and Team USA teammate Hayley Scamurra to the Toronto Sceptres ... Forward Taylor Heise purchased her first house in St. Paul, Minnesota this summer. Word on the street is that Heise is an expert interior decorator ... Forward Hilary Knight also purchased a house in Salt Lake City, where she will now spend her offseason training.

2025 IIHF UNDER-18 MEN'S WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP

It's a year of hosting for USA Hockey as the organization will host the 2025 IIHF Under-18 Men's World Championship in Frisco and Allen, Texas from April 23-May 3, 2025.

2025 WORLD PARA ICE HOCKEY CHAMPIONSHIPS

For the first time since 2015, the World Para Ice Hockey Championships will return to the United States. Buffalo will host this year's event at the LECOM Harborcenter from May 24-31.

2026 IIHF WORLD JUNIOR CHAMPIONSHIP

USA Hockey announced that Saint Paul and Minneapolis, will serve as host of the 2026 IIHF World Junior Championship. The 2026 event marks the 50th anniversary of the IIHF World Junior Championship. Xcel Energy Center, home of the NHL's Minnesota Wild in Saint Paul, and 3M Arena at Mariucci on the University of Minnesota campus in Minneapolis, will serve as the competition venues. Tickets are on sale for the World Junior Championship now.

USA HOCKEY ANNOUNCES PARTNERSHIP WITH DISCOVER®

JOHN WROBLEWSKI, HEAD COACH

John Wroblewski is serving as the head coach of the U.S. Women's National Team for the 2024-25 season after leading Team USA to a gold medal at the 2023 IIHF Women's World Championship and silver at the 2022 WWC and 2024 WWC.

Wroblewski joined the U.S. Women's National Team following two years (2020-22) as the head coach of the Ontario (Calif.) Reign, the AHL affiliate of the LA Kings, and four seasons (2016-20) as the bench boss of the USA Hockey National Team Development Program.

Over his four years with the NTDP, the program reached its first USHL playoff berth since 2012 and finished top-three in all 12 international tournaments played. He led his team to 33-consecutive international victories from 2016-18, and also oversaw the development of 29 NHL Draft picks, including Jack Hughes, who was selected first overall by the New Jersey Devils in 2019.

At the IIHF level, Wroblewski guided the U.S. Under-18 Men's National Team twice, resulting in a gold in 2017 and bronze in 2019.

The Neenah, Wisconsin, native began his coaching career as an intern assistant coach with the NTDP and was promoted to a full-time assistant coach the following season, a position he held from 2008-10.

Wroblewski, a player on the inaugural NTDP roster in 1997, skated four years with the University of Notre Dame (1999-2003). He went on to play four years (2003-07) professionally with the ECHL's Fresno Falcons, recording 125 points (65-60) in 273 career games.

ASSISTANT COACHES

SHARI DICKERMAN, ASSISTANT COACH

Shari Dickerman is returning as an assistant coach for the U.S. Women's National Team during the 2024-25 season, after serving in the same capacity since the 2022-23 season.

Dickerman, who is in her first season as head coach at Minnesota State University, previously served as assistant coach of the 2022 U.S. Collegiate Women's Select Team, that competed at the 2022 Collegiate Series against Canada in August. Prior to her appointment to the USA Hockey staff, Dickerman served as an evaluator at numerous USA Hockey camps.

A member of the Mavericks staff since 2009, Dickerman has helped lead Minnesota State for the last 15 seasons and was named head coach in March 2024.

As a player, Dickerman was an All-American goaltender for the Mavericks.

BRENT HILL, ASSISTANT COACH

Brent Hill is returning as an assistant coach for the U.S. Women's National Team during the 2024-25 season, after serving in the same capacity since the 2022-23 season.

Hill is currently serving as an assistant coach of the Quinnipiac Women's Ice Hockey team, a role he's held for the last two seasons.

Hill was on the bench as an assistant coach for the 2015 U.S. Under-18 Women's World Championship, leading the squad to a gold medal at the 2015 IIHF Under-18 Women's World Championship.

Prior to Quinnipiac, Hill spent four seasons at the helm of Bishop Kearny Selects Academy, following a season as an assistant coach at Merrimack University and four seasons as an assistant coach at RPI.

JOSH SCIBA, ASSISTANT COACH

Josh Sciba is reprising his role on the U.S. Women's National Team staff during the 2024-25 season, after serving in the same capacity since the 2022-23 season.

As an assistant coach, Sciba helped lead the U.S. Under-18 Women's National Team to a gold medal at the 2022 IIHF Under-18 Women's World Championship, after serving in the same capacity for the 2019 U.S. Under-18 Women's National Team.

Sciba is in his first season as assistant coach for the New York Sirens, following a six-year stint as head coach of Union College.

As a player, Sciba was a member of the USA Hockey National Team Development Program from 2001-03, prior to playing four years at the University of Notre Dame.

ALLI ALTMANN, GOALTENDING COACH

Alli Altmann returns as the goaltending coach of the U.S. Women's National Team after serving on the U.S. Women's National Team staff for the last four seasons (2021-2025).

Altmann also guided the U.S. Under-18 Women's National Team for four seasons, having served in the goaltending coach role from 2017-22. She guided the U.S. to two golds and two silvers during that time.

Altmann is currently the co-owner and vice president of DEVENIR Goaltenders. She played four seasons for Minnesota State University, recording a career .901 save percentage.
