HOME SWEET HOME

Reno's opened up the season with a seven-match undefeated streak at Greater Nevada Field. The team has three victories and three draws. Most recently, 1868 topped LA Galaxy II 4-2. The team will look to keep the home momentum, with three of their next four matches coming at Greater Nevada Field. Since the team's inaugural season in 2017, 1868 FC is 22-7-11 at home. The team's last home loss was August 25, 2018, and since then the Reno has gone 9-0-4. In their last 20 home matches, Reno's record is 13-2-6.

EVEN HISTORY

Reno and Phoenix have met four times, with neither side gaining an advantage. The series record is 1-1-2, with Reno's lone win coming on May 6, 2017. The win was a 4-0 road victory, and gives 1868 FC a +3 goal differential in the series.

Phoenix comes to Reno with a 26 points thanks to a 7-2-5 record that has them in first in the west. Phoenix also sports a +20 goal differential. Reno enters the match in fourth place in the western conference with 23 points, just three point babck of Phoenix.

Phoenix is riding a five-match winning streak, but Reno has yet to lose at home this season, going 4-0-3 to begin the year.

1868 FC TO FACE PHOENIX RISING FC IN TUESDAY SHOWDOWN

RENO HOPES TO KEEP HOME UNBEATEN STREAK ALIVE

RENO, Nev. – Fresh off Saturday night's 4-2 home win over LA Galaxy II, Reno 1868 FC is set to host Phoenix Rising FC on Tuesday at 7:15 p.m. PT. Phoenix enters the match as the first-place team in the western conference, while Reno sits just three points back in fourth place. Phoenix will bring its five-match winning streak into Greater Nevada Field, where 1868 FC is undefeated this season.

"We want to play the best teams," said head coach Ian Russell. "We've done really well against some of the top teams, and Phoenix is one of the better teams."

Both teams will be coming off of quick turnarounds, with each winning on Saturday.

Reno moved to 4-0-3 at home this season with the 4-2 win over LA, while Phoenix extended their winning streak to five games with a 3-0 win at home against Orange County. Phoenix's five-match winning streak is the longest active in the USL.

"They've been good for the last three years, they're a pretty athletic team. Tactically we've got to be sound" said head coach Ian Russell. "We've got to attack and we've got to get it right. Mentally we've got to be prepared."

Reno's four goal performance tied their season high in goals, and was the ninth time this season the team outshot their opponent. Reno finished with 20 shots to LA's 16. Corey Hertzog, Danny Musovski, Sam Gleadle and Aidan Apodaca all scored for 1868 FC. Hertzog's goal was his seventh, putting him one behind Brian Brown for the team lead. The total has him tied for 12th in the USL as well.

Hertzog's goal came in the seventh minute to tie up the match after a successful penalty kick by LA in the third minute. Not long after, Musovski put one in the net to give 1868 FC a 2-1 lead. In the 30th minute, LA again scored to send the match into halftime tied. Gleadle and Apodaca would post two unanswered goals in the second half to secure three points for Reno.

The action kicks off at 7:15 p.m. PT from Greater Nevada Field. The match will be nationally aired on ESPN3, and tickets are still available at reno1868fc.com. Match festivities will include Reno 1868 FC's first ever \$1 beer night for fans.

TECHNICAL STAFF



IAN RUSSELL HEAD COACH

Russell played for the University of Washington and later started his professional career with the Seattle Sounders of the USL First Division in 1998 and 1999. Russell was drafted by the San Jose Earthquakes in 2000 and continued to play seven seasons in MLS. Six of those seasons came with the Earthquakes, where Russell helped the team win two MLS Cups in 2001 and 2003. In 2008, Russell returned to the Earthquakes as an assistant coach, a position he held for eight seasons. He helped lead the club to the postseason twice, while earning the Supporters' Shield for best regular season record (19-6-9) in 2012. Russell was also instrumental in the Quakes' international and collegiate scouting efforts, and briefly helped oversee the club's youth development as the academy's technical director. He served as the Earthquakes interim head coach for the final two games of the 2014 season and holds a U.S. Soccer Federation "A" coaching license.



CASEY TATE ASSISTANT COACH

Tate joined the Reno 1868 FC staff in 2017 and served as an Assistant Coach under Head Coach Ian Russell for the inaugural season. He came to Reno 1868 from the University of Nevada where he spent 8 seasons as the Assistant Coach for the Wolf Pack Soccer program, being promoted to Head Coach Interim for the 2016 season. Tate helped lead the Pack to two postseason appearances and in 2016 posted the program's highest win total since its inaugural season in the Mountain West Conference. He has also been involved in the Reno/Tahoe youth soccer community for the past eight years and was the Director for several elite local clubs.



CHRIS MALENAB Assistant Coach

Malenab joined Reno 1868 FC in 2018 after spending four years as an assistant coach and video analyst at Sacramento Republic FC. During the 2014 inaugural season of the Sacramento Republic FC, Malenab served as an assistant coach to Predrag Radosavljević (Preki) during the club's championship campaign. From 2015 to 2017 Malenab served as video analyst for the Sacramento Republic FC under head coach Paul Buckle. Malenab started his coaching career coaching and serving as technical director at various youth clubs in the greater Sacramento area while coaching high school soccer. Along with his youth coaching experience, Malenab has served as an assistant coach at the college level, at Cosumnes River College (NJCAA), California State University Stanislaus (NCAA D-II) and San Joaquin Delta College (NJCAA).

The forward was selected 55th overall in the 2018 MLS SuperDraft by the Philadelphia Union. He later signed with the club's USL affiliate, Bethlehem Steel FC, where he spent the 2018 season. He had 17 appearances for the club, scored two goals and had two assists.

HEIGHT: 6'1:" WEIGHT: 182 DOB: 05/09/1997 Marcinkowski, 21, will spend time with Reno 1868 FC for the second season in a row. Signed to the San Jose Earthquakes as a Homegrown Player in 2017, the goalkeeper spent time with both the Earthquakes and Reno in 2018. Marcinkowski started five times for San Jose and 24 for Reno. Marcinkowski was selected to USL's Team of the Week in week two of the 2018 season and was named Reno 1868 FC's Rookie of the Year in 2018.
