TONIGHT'S GAME

After opening the tournament with back-to-back wins, Team USA wraps up preliminary-round play of the 2022 IIHF Under-18 Men's World Championship Tuesday evening against host Germany.

Team USA holds an all-time record of 7-0-0-2 (W-OTW-OTL-L) against Germany in U18 Men's World Championship competition. In five preliminary-round matchups, the U.S. is perfect with a 5-0-0-0 record.

All of Team USA's preliminary-round games will take place at Fanatec Arena in Landshut, Germany, home of the DEL2's EV Landshut. The arena holds 4,448 spectators for hockey games.

TALKING POINTS

PRELIM VS. CZECHIA

The U.S. Under-18 Men's National Team used four second-period tallies and a pair of goals from captain **Rutger McGroarty** (Lincoln, Neb.) to beat Czechia, 6-2, and open the 2022 IIHF Under-18 Men's World Championship with back-to-back wins. Goaltender **Tyler Muszelik** (Long Valley, N.J.) turned aside 35 Czech shots on the afternoon to pick up his first IIHF victory in net.

HEAR IT FROM COACH

"We try to stay composed and focus on the things we can control," said head coach **Adam Nightingale** (Cheboygan, Mich.) after the team was down 1-0 after a period against Czechia. "There was no panic in the room, but we knew we had to be better and they went out and had a great finish to the game. It was a good team win and we look forward to our game on Tuesday."

SPECIAL SPECIALS

Team USA has killed off all nine power-play opportunities against them, leaving them as the lone remaining team in the tournament with a perfect penalty kill. In addition, the U.S. is 2-for-6 (33.3%) on its power-play opportunities, getting goals from **Isaac Howard** (Hudson, Wis.) and **Logan Cooley** (Pittsburgh, Pa.) on the man advantage Sunday afternoon.

MOOSE MUNCH

USA netminder **Tyler Muszelik** (Long Valley, N.J.) was stout in net as he made 35 saves in Sunday's 6-2 win over Czechia. The save total is tied for the third-most saves Muszelik has made in a game this season. The University of New Hampshire commit's .946 save percentage leads all goaltenders at the 2022 U18 Men's World Championship.

WELCOME WILL

Team USA added forward **Will Smith** (Lexington, Mass.) to the roster as the 25th player in advance of today's game. The 6-foot, 174-pound Smith will add speed and a scoring punch to the USA lineup, which has already scored the most goals of any team in the tournament.

Smith, a Boston College commit, skated in Team USA's second pre-tournament game against Finland last week. On the regular season, the Massachusetts native scored 29 goals and added 31 helpers for 60 total points in 59 games played. Smith netted eight goals in an eight-game span from January 22-March 12, all in contests with the Under-18 Team. The forward collected four scores in the U17s' 9-1 win over the Soo Eagles on October 21, the most goals for a USA skater since **Chaz Lucius** (Grant, Minn.) dropped in five at the Minnesota Elite League in 2019.

TOURNAMENT INFO

The 2022 International Ice Hockey Federation Under-18 Men's World Championship will take place April 23 - May 1, 2022, in Landshut and Kaufbeuren, Germany. The U.S. enters the tournament off of a fifth-place finish at the 2021 event in Texas. Team USA has 10 gold medals in tournament history, the most of any competing country.

Team USA will play its preliminary-round games in Landshut at Fanatec Arena against Group A opponents Canada, Czechia and Germany. The quarterfinal round will be split between Landshut and Kaufbeuren while both semifinals and medal-round games will all take place in Landshut.

Group B consists of Finland, Latvia, Sweden and Switzerland and will play their games at Erdgas Schwaben Arena in Kaufbeuren.

WATCH ON NHL NETWORK

NHL Network will provide exclusive telecasts of all Team USA games at the 2022 IIHF Under-18 Men's World Championship. The network will air 11 total games throughout the tournament, which begins Saturday (April 23) and runs through May 1 in Landshut and Kaufbeuren, Germany.

NHL Network will broadcast the United States' first preliminary game against Canada on Saturday (April 23) at 3:30 p.m. ET (delayed broadcast/available live on ESPN+). All other Team USA games will broadcast live on NHL Network.

ADDITIONAL NOTES

TOP OF THE LEADERBOARD

Team USA has a handful of skaters at the top of the leaderboards through two games of the World Championship. Forward **Isaac Howard** (Hudson, Wis.) leads the tournament with both five goals and six overall points, while **Logan Cooley** (Pittsburgh, Pa.) follows in third with four points (2-2--4). **Cutter Gauthier** (Scottsdale, Ariz.) and **Frank Nazar III** (Mount Clemens, Mich.) are two of four skaters that have a trio of assists, which is currently the top number of any player. Team USA has a clean sweep in the +/- department with defenseman **Ryan Chesley** (Mahtomedi, Minn.) leading the way with a +7 rating. **Lane Hutson** (North Barrington, Ill.) is next with a +6 through a pair of games while Howard and **Devin Kaplan** (Bridgewater, N.J.) are tied for third with a +4 rating.

LEADERSHIP GROUP

Team USA announced its leadership group in advance of the round-robin games. **Rutger McGroarty** (Lincoln, Neb.) will captain the squad while **Ryan Chesley** (Mahtomedi, Minn.) and **Cutter Gauthier** (Scottsdale, Ariz.) will serve as alternate captains for the tournament. Chesley and McGroarty are returners from last year's team that finished in fifth place, while Gauthier is making his IIHF debut as a player.

"The team voted me in and it means the world to me," McGroarty said after the appointment. "It's a great group of guys. But there are a lot of leaders on our team who aren't wearing a letter, too. For me, I just have to stay true to who I am."

"It's a huge honor to wear a letter for your country. It's something special and something I've never done before," said Gauthier. "It's a pretty cool opportunity and I'm looking forward to it."

THE OUTSIDER

Only one player on Team USA's roster comes from outside USA Hockey's National Team Development Program - forward **Gavin Brindley** (Estero, Fla.), who skated this season for the USHL's Anderson Cup-winning Tri-City Storm. In his second season in Nebraska, Brindley scored 14 times and added 28 assists for 42 points in 51 games with the Storm. The University of Michigan commit also skated with Team USA for portions of the season, appearing in three NCAA contests, where he collected two helpers. He was also a member of the team that traveled to Monthey, Switzerland, where they won the 2021 Under-18 Five Nations tournament. Brindley had a goal and two assists over those five games. Prior to leaving for the USHL, Brindley skated with teammate **Seamus Casey** (Fort Myers, Fla.) for the Florida Alliance 16U team for the 2019-20 season.

PRELIM VS CANADA

The U.S. Under-18 Men's National Team used a four-goal, one-assist performance from **Isaac Howard** (Hudson, Wis.) to top Canada, 8-3, Saturday evening in its opening game of the 2022 IIHF Under-18 Men's World Championship. Howard's four goals tied the tournament and U.S. record for most goals in a single game at the IIHF U18 Men's World Championship.

PRE-TOURNAMENT VS. FINLAND

The U.S. used six unanswered goals from six different scorers to push past Finland, 6-1, in its final pre-tournament game ahead of the 2022 IIHF U18 Men's World Championship. **Trey Augustine** (South Lyon, Mich.) surrendered a goal 1:46 into the game and then stood tall to turn pitch the rest of the way, finishing with 26 saves. **Isaac Howard** (Hudson, Wis.), **Ryan Chesley** (Mahtomedi, Minn.) and **Logan Cooley** (Pittsburgh, Pa.) netted first-period goals while **Jimmy Snuggerud** (Chaska, Minn.), **Devin Kaplan** (Bridgewater, N.J.) and **Cole Spicer** (Grand Forks, N.D.) collected second-period markers for the U.S. in its final tune-up game.

PRE-TOURNAMENT VS. SWEDEN

Team USA got goals from **Ryan Leonard** (Amherst, Mass.) and **Isaac Howard** (Hudson, Wis.), but the U.S. Under-18 Men's National Team fell to Sweden, 3-2 in a shootout, Monday evening at Erdgas Schwaben Arena in Germany in its first of two pre-tournament games ahead of the 2022 IIHF Under-18 Men's World Championship.

NHL CENTRAL SCOUTING

Fifteen players on the Team USA roster were named to the NHL Central Scouting midseason rankings, released on January 12, including eight skaters ranked in the top-85 of all North American skaters. **Logan Cooley** (Pittsburgh, Pa.) leads Team USA at number two overall, while **Cutter Gauthier** (Scottsdale, Ariz.), at number six, and **Jimmy Snuggerud** (Chaska, Minn.), at number eight overall, cracked the top-10. **Isaac Howard** (Hudson, Wis.) came in at number 12, with **Frank Nazar** (Mount Clemens, Mich.) and **Rutger McGroarty** (Lincoln, Neb.) followed close behind at 17 and 18, respectively. The defensive triumvirate of **Ryan Chesley** (Mahtomedi, Minn.), **Lane Hutson** (North Barrington, Ill.) and **Seamus Casey** (Fort Myers, Fla.) all placed themselves in the top-32 skaters. **Devin Kaplan** (Bridgewater, N.J.) followed as the 65th ranked skater, followed by **Charlie Leddy** (Fairfield, Conn.) at 84 and **Marek Hejduk** (Parker, Colo.) at 110. **Cole Spicer** (Grand Forks, N.D.) entered the rankings at 122nd while **Seamus Powell** (Marcellus, N.Y.) at 166 rounded out Team USA's ranked skaters. Forward **Cruz Lucius** (Grant, Minn.) received a limited viewing (LV) ranking, having not played enough games at the time of the rankings.

In the cage, **Tyler Muszelik** (Long Valley, N.J.) was ranked as the fifth-best draft-eligible goalie in North America.

Aside from the five 2005 birth-year players on the roster, forwards **Charlie Stramel** (Rosemount, Minn.) and **Gavin Brindley** (Estero, Fla.), along with defenseman **Hunter Brzustewicz** (Washington Twp., Mich.) are not age-eligible for this year's draft as they are born after the September 15 cut-off date.
