As part of a 50-year reunion celebration in 2014 and in memory of fellow classmates who have passed away, the Class of 1964 funded five RHS Foundation scholarships. The hope was to continue the tradition, even though a major reunion was not

Where Your Money Went: Grants to the School and Staff

In the fall newsletter the scholarships provided with your money were published. In addition to scholarships, grants are awarded to staff and school to help our students receive some of the educational benefits available to those in other districts and some Minneapolis schools, but which are not covered by district funds.

This fall grants totalling \$58,359 were awarded. Applicants write a request, explaining what they need, why it would benefit their students, and how much it would cost. Often the cost of an activity includes sub service and a bus, which the school cannot cover. This fall 37 requests were granted by the Foundation Board.

The PE department received \$5,600 for treadmills. The science teachers were awarded \$2,705 for science equipment. World language students received \$1,500 for a trip to the Concordia Language Village. The French Club was awarded \$500 for club expenses.

Many donors designate arts for their donation. The spring and fall plays needed \$5,000 for sets, props, scripts, etc. The band director received \$3,000 for band wear. The improv group Teddy, Set Go! was awarded \$300. The arts coordinator was given \$1,150 to help sup-

port the three Art Crawls. A senior class theater field trip received \$1,043. English teachers were awarded \$3,450 to take the entire ninth grade to two plays. Geography books were purchased.

The math teachers received \$1,231 for math software. The History Day advisers were given \$1,500 to help send students to the city and state History Day competitions. The librarian needed a camcorder. The AVID staff was awarded \$1,200 for calculators. The Special Ed. teachers received \$1,000 for rope activity equipment. The summer golf program was given \$500.

Students making costly educational trips were also given scholarships. Students going to France, Spain, Mexico and several Southern colleges were helped out with from \$60-\$250, a very small fraction of the cost.

A lift was awarded to the school engineers to help them work more efficiently and safely. Unlike some other schools Roosevelt did not own one, which kept workers from taking care of things promptly. Used to access high areas, it allows the engineers to change lightbulbs, clean windows, work high in the gym, etc.

Greetings to all Roosevelt alumni! With this newsletter I want to recognize a few individuals and teams that did well on the playing field and in the classroom at Roosevelt High School.

Wrestling: Six wrestlers placed and received medals in Sections. Of the six who placed, four received an academic award for having a GPA [Grade point average] of 3.4 or higher, with one wrestler, Ben Oman, having a 4.0 GPA two years in a row. The wrestlers will be returning 22 of the 28 wrestlers for next year. Sophomore Larry Sanchez made it to State at 152 lbs.

Gymnastics: Freshmen Sophia Nelson made it to State on the uneven parallel bars. I am not sure when the last Roosevelt gymnast made it to State.

Boys Basketball: Senior Elijah Hannah scored his 1,000th point. Elijah, who has a GPA of 3.51, will attend and play basketball at St. Thomas University.

Volleyball: Coach Silvia Zavaleta-Ihme had an excellent season earning a first round home match and a victory vs. Calvin Christian High School.

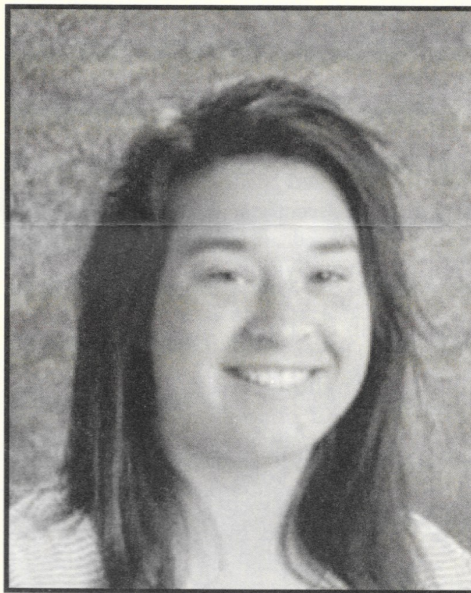
Adapted soccer: The team made it to State and placed 5th. We had two players make the all-state team: Elijah Jackson and Allen Chalmers.

Congratulations, 2016 Hall of Fame Members

Dr. Bruce Adams '62: Dr. Adams is one of the first board-certified emergency doctors in Minnesota. He developed a rural first responder program to improve emergency care in rural areas. He was on the staff of the Emergency Department at North Memorial Hospital and later became its Medical Director and then Vice President of Medical Affairs. Since his retirement, he continues to volunteer at a neighborhood health service.

Dr. Carol M. Anderson '57 (Deceased): A scholar in the field of psychiatry, Dr. Anderson is noted for developing the psychoeducation model for individuals with schizophrenia and their families. Her accomplishments revolutionized the field of family therapy. She was chief psychiatric social worker at Yale and a professor of psychiatry at Pitt from 1973-2010. Dr. Anderson was an editor of the *Family Process Journal* and president of the American Family Therapy Academy. She has received many honors, including an award for Distinguished Contribution to Family Therapy.

Dr. James Ehlen '62: A clinical professor of medicine at the University of Minnesota for over 25 years, Dr. Ehlen is certified in Internal Medicine-Endocrinology. He has been St. Mary's Hospital Medical Staff President and has served on over 20 boards of directors. He was one of the creators of Medica and served as its CEO. He was President of Allina Health System, CEO of EPIEN Medical and currently is CEO and Chairman of Respiratory Technologies in St. Paul.

Kathryn "Peggy" Marz Englund-Nevers '34: Peggy Nevers was a trailblazer and champion of women, an early example of how women can excel in the business sector. A wife, mother of four boys, a grandmother of nine, and great-grandmother of twenty, she began as a part-time telephone operator and eventually, over the course of 37 years, was one of the highest ranking woman at Northwestern Bell. At the time of her retirement, she worked as a lobbyist representing NWB at the state legislature and the Public Service Commission, one of the first women to lobby for a large corporation. She has mentored many women, and made a second career of volunteering for community and church.

Al Gowans -Teacher and Coach (Deceased): Al Gowans was a beloved teacher and coach for over 25 years. An athlete in both high school and in college, he coached at the college level. After receiving his Master's from the U, he came to RHS in 1937 to teach social studies and coach football. He stepped down as head coach, but continued teaching and coaching until he retired in '65. He won the city championship three times, including the '56 team, which was unbeaten, unscored upon, and untied. Gowans Field was dedicated in fall of 1966.

Douglas Hanson '46--Teacher and Counselor (Deceased): Doug Hanson graduated from RHS, graduated from the U, and then spent his entire career at Roosevelt, first as an industrial arts teacher and then as counselor. He literally wrote the book on Drivers Ed, his thesis being the model for the city drivers training program. He was involved in community activities, as a member of the Police Advisory Commission, Teacher Retirement Fund Trustee, and as a 32nd degree Mason. Most of all, he was a Teddy through and through, being recognized by his students and recognizing them wherever he went. He was an involved Teddy for almost 60 years.

Robert J. Hoyle '57: Robert Hoyle spent his entire life serving humanity. He was one of the first three Minnesotans accepted into the Peace Corps. His first assignment was in the Philippines. After that he worked with Lutheran World Federation in Jerusalem and then served as director of food distribution to refugees in Zambia. Following this, he served as Executive Director of the International Institute of Minnesota, which assists refugees and immigrants in resettling in Minnesota, a position he held for 35 years. He also was active in Rotary, and 4-H exchange programs, hosting 27 students. He exemplified the admonition to "Love thy neighbor as thyself."

Robert Jenkins '56: A musician and composer, Bob Jenkins has won many regional, national international awards, including a CLIO award and a Gold Lion Award from the Cannes Film Festival. He made worldwide tours as the principal trombonist with Woody Herman, the Glenn Miller Orchestra, the Jimmy Dorsey Orchestra, and many others. Bob served as the principal trombonist with the Omaha Symphony Orchestra. He was a studio musician in Los Angeles, New York, and Chicago. He has composed musical scores for films. Currently he is a teacher at the Institute of Production and Recording.

Richard F. Lack '46 (Deceased): An accomplished, versatile, and influential representational artist, Richard Lack studied at the Minneapolis School of Art and then in Boston where he studied under Ives Grammel. He returned to Minneapolis and built a studio where he painted a variety of art, still life, portrait, landscape and imaginative paintings based on myth, history and the psychology of C.G. Jung. Later years were devoted to painting large works based on Jungian psychology. His works hang in museums and private collections around the world. He authored many works, exhibited across the United States, and has won many honors.

Congratulations, 2016 Hall of Fame Members

Reed Larson '74: Reed Larson is one of the top hockey players ever to have come from Minnesota. He played in the NHL for 14 years and was elected into the NHL Hall of Fame in 1996. During his years in the NHL he recorded five 20-goal seasons, eight 60-point campaigns, and was the first American-born player to score 200 career goals. After ten seasons as a Detroit Red Wing, he joined the Bruins, the Oilers, Islanders, North Stars, and Sabres. Reed headed to Europe to play and coach in Italy for four years, retiring after a brief stint with the Moose. He is active in charity hockey activities.

Estelita Malicsi-Teacher and Theater Director: Lita Malicsi taught English and was theater director at RHS for 25 years. Lita brought fame to Roosevelt and pride and satisfaction to student performers with her near-professional musical theater productions. She began the Arts Initiative at Roosevelt in 2000, helped produce the first Mosaic, and began the popular Coffee Houses. She was a respected leader in the school and served on the Foundation Board. She is also a major figure in the Asian community, having been president of Fil-Minnesota for 10 years and serving in almost every leadership position. She is a world citizen, lending her expertise to educators in the Philippines. She currently translates Tagalog in courts and medical facilities. Her newest project is as director of a cultural and language school for Filipino-American children. Many of her students still keep in touch with her.

Monte Moir '76: The son of a jazz trumpeter, Monte Moir was active in all RHS instrumental music programs. Early on he became keyboardist with Flyte Tyme, and later The Time. He appeared in *Purple Rain*, *Graffiti Bridge* and other films and worked with Jimmy Jam and Flyte Tyme as a writer and producer. He has produced six Top-40 hits, received two platinum records and six gold records. He has appeared on TV on *American Bandstand*, *Saturday Night Live*, *50th Grammy Awards*, *the Tonight Show*, *Jimmy Kimmel* and others. He currently tours with Morris Day and The Time.

Dave Mona '61: Dave Mona is known as a radio, television and newspaper reporter and titan in the public relations field. In college Mona served as an editor for WCCO TV. After graduation he worked as a reporter for the Minneapolis *Tribune*, as well as served as a color analyst of Gopher football for 14 years. He can be heard on his weekly radio show, *Sports Huddle*. He won Edward R. Murrow and Associated Press awards for his work. His PR firm, Mona Meyer McGrath, and Gavin, became a giant in the Midwest, with clients including many worldwide corporations. He has been on numerous boards, including chairing the U of M Alumni Association. He was leader in raising funds for the TCF Bank stadium and in bringing the Super Bowl to Minnesota.

Ronald Naslund '61: Ron Naslund went from winning the Twin City Hockey championship with Roosevelt to play at the University of Denver and was on the US National team for three world tournaments. He was the oldest player on the US Olympic team in 1972. He played pro hockey for the Rochester Mustangs and Parkers for 7 years. In 1980 he founded Insurance and Financial Services, a multi-million-dollar company. He is active in charities for homeless and abused children. He is a member of the Gull Lake Chain Association for clean water. He started a Teddy luncheon seven years ago, in which over 60 alums meet on the Tuesday before Thanksgiving.

Bettye Johnson Olson J'41: Bettye Olson is an internationally prominent artist and painter. She brought drive and talent to her successful 65-year career bringing beauty and joy to the canvas. Her works are in collections of corporations, private individuals, colleges, universities and international museums, including our own Weisman Art Museum, the Minnesota Museum of Art, and the Minnesota Historical Society. A pioneering feminist, she founded the West Lake Gallery. Her watercolors show her own style of colorful, upbeat imagery under the inspiration of abstractionists.

Dr. Gail Omvedt '59: Dr. Omvedt graduated from Carleton Magna Cum Laude and earned her PhD with Distinction from UC Berkley in sociology in 1973. She has been a consultant for UN agencies and NGOs. She has been a visiting professor in Denmark and several universities in India. Her academic writing includes numerous books and articles on class, caste, and gender issues. Most of her work has been on behalf of social movements in India, including anti-caste movements, environmental movements, farmers movements, and work with rural women. Recently she has been a consulting sociologist on gender, environmental and rural development for the United Nations Developmental Program.

Bruce Paulson '63 and Music Teacher: Bruce Paulson began playing the trombone at 11, continued through Roosevelt groups and received his Master's from the University of Minnesota. He taught band and orchestra at RHS for two years. He played lead trombone in the Glenn Miller Orchestra, and in the Buddy Rich Band. He was trombonist in the Doc Severinson's *Tonight Show Band* for 20 years. His recording credits include those with the *Tonight Show Band*, the Buddy Rich Band, and artists including Frank Sinatra, Natalie Cole, Bette Midler, Steve Miller, Stevie Wonder, Smokey Robinson, Louis Bellson, Ringo Starr and many others.

Congratulations, 2016 Hall of Fame Members

Joel Sandberg '82 and RHS Liaison Officer: Sgt. Joey Sandberg has worked the streets of south Minneapolis in patrol, as a SWAT officer, in the school Resource Program and in Property Crimes Investigation. In 2007 he was honored by the Police Department as Investigator of the Year. He has forged solid relationships with students, community members, and law enforcement peers who have assisted him in making the community safer by helping him solve an inordinate number of crimes. His friendships and the trust he has gained from others allow him to reach out to those on the fringe and in need and enable him to resolve issues with compassion and dignity. Above all, he has mentored hundreds of students, making a positive direct impact on their lives.

Robert Sheran '32 (Deceased): A graduate of St. Thomas and the University Law School, Robert Sheran has worn many hats. He has not only practiced law, but was an FBI Special Agent, served in the Minnesota House of Representatives, was appointed an Associate Justice of the Minnesota Supreme Court, and for eight years was Chief Justice of the Minnesota Supreme Court. He served two separate tenures on the court, appointed by two different governors, one a Democrat and one a Republican. Named by Minnesota Law and Politics as one of the 100 most influential lawyers in Minnesota, he acted as interim Dean of the Hamline Law School and was instrumental in organizing the Minnesota Court of Appeals.

Charles Stenvig '46 (Deceased): After graduating from Roosevelt and then from Augsburg with a sociology degree, Charles Stenvig joined the Minneapolis Police Department. He worked his way up to the rank of detective, when he decided to run for mayor. In 1969, as an Independent running on a law and order platform during the unrest of the 60s, he defeated the major party candidates in the primary and went on to win the general election with a whopping 62% of the vote. He won re-election in '71 and was defeated two years later. He went back to the police department, but ran again in 1975 and was returned to the mayor's office by a wide margin. He returned to the police department until his retirement.

Gloria Harris Tew '41: After graduation from Roosevelt Gloria Tew attended the Minneapolis College of Art and Design. In 1969 she enrolled at Gustavus Adolphus and studied under sculptor Paul Granlund. She became an abstract sculptor, known internationally for her work in marble, bronze and steel. Her sculptures are found throughout the world. She has won the President's National League of Cities Award, and many other competitions, including the Governor Rudy Perpich Memorial. Her Caring Art Prize winner, an eight-foot bronze sculpture, is in Vaxjo, Sweden. Her carrara marble statue was presented to Sweden's King Carl XVI on a US visit. Her "Reflections," a 15-foot outdoor stainless steel sculpture, sits at the Minnetonka Civic Center. She won a Women of Achievement Award in 1980.
