Does Cornerstone Athletic Center Require Face Coverings?

The short answer is no. Given the CDC's updated guidance, Cornerstone Athletic Center no longer requires fully vaccinated guests and team members to wear face coverings. Face coverings continue to be recommended for guests and team members who are not fully vaccinated.

We Continue to Invest Significantly in Expanded Safety, Social Distancing and Cleaning Routines:

- Frequently disinfecting and cleaning our facility.
- Frequently cleaning high touch areas and providing hand sanitizer for our guests.
- Providing team members with face masks and gloves.
- Recommending face coverings for unvaccinated guests and team members.

How are We Monitoring the Health and Symptoms of Our Team Members and Guests?

We've provided all team members with a health checklist to track and monitor for any signs or symptoms of illness before coming to work. If team members are experiencing symptoms, we help them access the health resources they need and support them to stay home until they are healthy.

What do We do About Cases of the Coronavirus Among Team Members?

We treat every positive case of the coronavirus with care and maintain a variety of cleaning, social distancing, and safety measures. We are transparent and share the steps we take after learning about a positive case. We encourage our team to come to us with any questions or concerns, so that we can quickly support and address them.

Over the past year+, we have taken a number of steps in support of our team and guests including increased safety, disinfecting measures, and operational changes. It is our honor to serve each of our families. Our hope is that while the end is in sight, we still take all the appropriate precautions and follow the recommendations made by the City of Worthington and the CDC to make sure those entering our facility are safe.

Worthington's local ordinance states: Worthington City Council recently voted to repeal the face covering ordinance to conform with the new State of Ohio and CDC guidance. Worthington's health agency, Columbus Public Health, supports the decision to terminate face covering requirements. The CDC has released guidance that people who are fully vaccinated no longer need to wear face coverings or remain physically distant in most settings. Governor Mike DeWine issued a revised order that eliminates the state face covering mandate for fully vaccinated people and conforms to CDC guidance. With the repeal of Worthington's ordinance, people are required to follow State orders, which will remain in effect until June 2 when Governor DeWine states all orders will be lifted. State orders require people who are not fully vaccinated to wear a face covering and maintain social distancing. Ohio's order also reflects the CDC's recommendation that everyone wear face coverings in a healthcare setting, when traveling on public transportation, and when at a business or employer that chooses to require them.

CDC Guidelines Regarding Use of Face Coverings:

- If you are fully vaccinated, you can resume activities that you did before the pandemic without wearing a face covering or physically distancing, except where required by federal, state local rules and regulations.
- If you haven't been vaccinated, wear a face covering that covers your nose and mouth to help protect yourself and others. Face coverings should be worn in addition to staying at least 6 feet apart, especially around people who do not live with you.
