Coaches applying for these positions must commit for a term of **two years**. The Head Coach position requires a significant time commitment to scout and identify players, as well as coach Team Saskatchewan at the Women's U18 National Championship. In addition, the Head Coach, with the assistance of Football Saskatchewan staff, is responsible for selecting all assistant coaches. **If you are interested in consideration for the Head Coach position** with Team Saskatchewan, please complete and submit the attached application form & other required documents.

Football Saskatchewan will forward the information to the successful female U18 Team Sask head coach. The head coach will consider these applications but is not obligated to select the staff from those submissions.
