



BLACK HISTORY MUSEUM

History lives in the Richmond Region. Walk among the earliest settlers at Henricus Historical Park and sit in the church where Patrick Henry gave his famous "Give Me Liberty, or Give Me Death" speech during the American Revolution. Historic Tredegar chronicles Richmond's place in the Civil War and the Richmond Slave Trail narrates the troubled times before the war and the hope that came with Emancipation. The Valentine tells the story of Richmond's people through an expansive permanent collection and creative special exhibits.
