CLASS OF '87

Trisha (Tinucci) Rinzel participated in soccer and track & field, and was highly acclaimed for the leadership qualities she brought to those programs. She received All-Conference as well as All-State recognition in both soccer (where she helped lead the team to two section championships) and track & field.

Trisha went on to the University of St. Thomas where she achieved All-American status in soccer and track & field, becoming the first female athlete in the school's history to be named All-American in two sports.

Marci (Olson) Anderson was named All-State in swimming for three years and became the first female athlete from Park High School to receive an athletic scholarship. As an underclassman in 1978, she helped lead her team to the conference championship. At the time of her graduation in 1981, she held six team records, two conference records, and two section records.

After her graduation, Marci competed at the University of Minnesota where she received the Patty Berg Academic Award, set team and Big Ten Conference records, and was named All-American.

CLASS OF '65

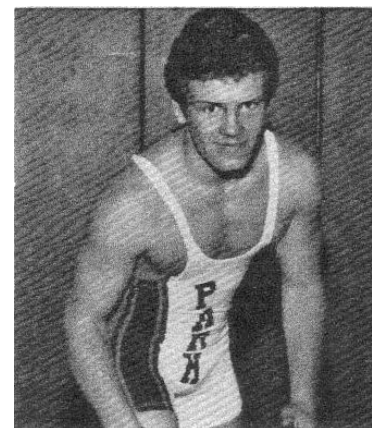

## **PERRY FINK**

CLASS OF '85

Perry Fink earned two letters in football but is best known for his accomplishments in wrestling at Park High School, where he posted a record of 93 – 5 – 2. He was twice named captain, and in 1985 he helped lead the team to a fourth-place finish at the State Tournament. Individually, he was a three-time Section Champion, twice winning third place in the State Tournament, and he was the State Champion in 1984.

Perry went on to wrestle at South Dakota State University where he went 119 – 32, won four conference championships, and was a three-time NCAA All-American.

Since 1993, Perry has been the Head Wrestling Coach at Canby High School (Canby, MN). During his tenure, his teams have gone 328 – 80 and have appeared in the State Tournament eight times, winning three State Championships. He has been named Section Coach of the Year eight times and was named Coach of the Year for the state of Minnesota in 1995.
