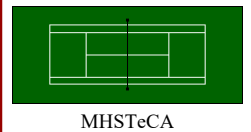

## JACK JOHNSON—DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARD

### Honoring a Legacy of Excellence

The Jack Johnson Distinguished Service Award is named in honor of Coach Jack Johnson, a revered figure in Michigan high school athletics. As a past president of the Michigan High School Coaches Association (MHSCA) and the third Executive Director, Coach Johnson's contributions were profound. He was not only a successful coach with five state championship swim teams but also a dedicated leader in sports administration, serving as the Swim Coaches Association Treasurer, President of the Michigan Interscholastic Athletic Administrators Association, and a Conference Committee organizer for 34 years. His unwavering commitment to interscholastic athletics and his exemplary service set a high standard for all who work with student-athletes.

This award is presented each year to someone who has done an outstanding job supporting and promoting athletics in general, and has shown consideration and assistance to the high school scene and the Michigan High School Coaches Association.

# JACK JOHNSON—DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARD

## Celebrating Jerry Lasceski

It is with immense pride and admiration that we present the inaugural Jack Johnson Distinguished Service Award to Jerry Lasceski. Jerry's exceptional career at Akron-Fairgrove Schools, MI, spans over four decades, embodying the spirit of dedication and excellence that Coach Johnson championed.

## A Legacy of Teaching and Coaching

Jerry began his impactful career in 1965, teaching Business Education until 2006 and coaching Boys Varsity Track and Field from 1965 to 2008. He founded and developed the Cross Country program in 1970, coaching the boys' team until 2007 and the girls' team intermittently from 1980 to 1988.

## Achievements in Track and Field

Jerry's contributions to Boys Track and Field are remarkable:

- 12 Conference Championships, 6 Regional Championships, 2 State Championships (1978 & 1993), 2 State Runner-Up Finishes (1968 & 1983), 63 All-State Athletes, 2 State Champions
- His excellence was recognized with the Michigan Interscholastic Track Coaches Association (MITCA) Coach of the Year awards in 1978 and 1993, and the Michigan High School Athletic Association (MHSAA) Coach of the Year award in 1978.

## Excellence in Cross Country

In Boys Cross Country, Jerry's accomplishments include:

- 10 Top Ten State Meet Finishes, 1977 State Runner-Up, 1978 State Championship Team, 15 All-State Runners, 1 State Champion
- He earned the MITCA Coach of the Year award in 1978 for Boys Cross Country.

For Girls Cross Country, Jerry led:

- 7 Top Ten State Meet Finishes, 1991 State Championship Team, 8 All-State Runners, 1 State Champion
- He was named MITCA Coach of the Year in 1991, and in 1998, he received the MHSAA Coach of the Year and NFHS, Section 4 Cross Country Coach of the Year awards.

## Recognitions and Awards

Jerry's coaching prowess has been acknowledged with numerous honors, including:

- 1992 Thumb of Michigan Sports Leader Award, 1992 MITCA Ambrose Award, 1998 Michigan High School Coaches Association Hall of Fame, 2010 Akron-Fairgrove Jr./Sr. School Track & Field named "Lasceski Track and Field", 2016 National High School Athletic Coaches Association Hall of Fame

## A Pillar of Service

Jerry's service extends beyond coaching:

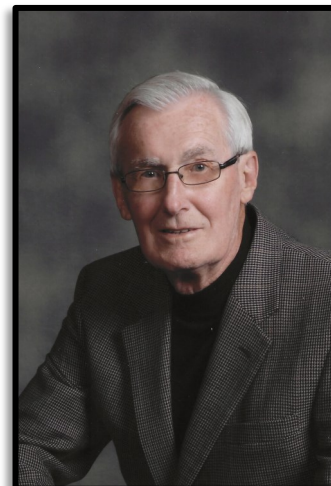

## HALL OF FAME INDUCTEE: Douglas Wm Baird

Doug Baird has coached three different sports for a total of ninety-nine seasons over thirty-five years and continues to coach. He has coached middle school boys and girls track in Mount Pleasant (1990-94) and Hesperia (1995-96/99), and was the girls high school head track coach in Hesperia (1996-98). He was the boys and girls head cross country coach at Hesperia High School from 1995-2015 and from 2017-2022. His girls cross country teams have won ten Conference Championships, three MHSAA Regional Championships, two MHSAA State Titles, thirty-six Invitational Wins, and have a win/loss record of 69/22. His boys cross country teams have won fifteen Conferences Championships, four MHSAA Regional Championships, one MHSAA Runners Up Finish, two MHSAA State Titles, sixty-five Invitational Wins, and

have a win/loss record of 89/19. Coach Baird also had three girls cross country Academic All-State teams and six boys cross country Academic All-State teams. In 2023 he returned as the assistant coach of the Hesperia High School boys and girls cross country teams.

Coach Baird began his career as a wrestling coach in Mount Pleasant as the Middle School wrestling coach (1989-90). He served as the assistant head wrestling coach at Coleman High School (1990-91), and at Mount Pleasant High School (1991-94), and Hesperia High School (1995-03 and 2023-24). He was the head wrestling coach at Hesperia High School from 2004-2013 and again from 2016-2021. His teams accumulated eleven Conference Titles, fifteen MHSAA District Titles, ten MHSAA Regional Titles, four MHSAA State Runners Up Finishes, one MHSAA State Title, fifty-three Invitational Wins and have a win/loss record of 503/99. He has had nine Academic All-State wrestling teams and in 2006 his team won the, MHSAA-Good Sports are Winners Award. Ten of Coach Baird's wrestlers were Academic All-Americans, forty-three wrestlers won 100+ matches and nine wrestlers won 200+ matches. In all sports coached combined, Coach Baird's athletes earned 112 MHSAA All-State Individual Medals, 22 MHSAA Individual State Champions, and 12 MHSAA Individual Runners Up. Coach Baird has coached two Mr. Wrestler athletes which is an accomplishment that no other Division IV team has yet to match. Many of his athletes went on to compete at the collegiate level.

Throughout his coaching career Doug has been honored for his service to his teams and sports on numerous occasions. He was named the Michigan Wrestling Association (MWA) Regional Coach of the Year nine times, the MWA State Coach of the Year in 2008, the National Wrestling Coaches Associations Michigan Coach of the Year Nominee two times, and the MWA Regional Assistant Coach of the Year in 2001. He was also selected to coach in the MWA East/West All-Star Wrestling Match in 2008, and coached Team Michigan Fargo National Championships for Freestyle/Greco in 2019. He was named the Michigan Interscholastic Track Coaches Association (MITCA) Boys Cross Country Coach of the Year two times and the MITCA Girls Cross Country Coach of the Year two times. In 2019 Doug was inducted into the MITCA Hall of Fame.



## HALL OF FAME INDUCTEE: Charles Bates

Charlie Bates' career as a diving coach spanned over fifty years. After a very successful high school and collegiate diving career, he began his coaching career in 1956 at Ypsilanti High School. He was the swim and dive coach there for one season producing one state qualifying diver. From 1957-1958 he was the diving coach at Maine Township High School in Illinois, with state qualifiers in 1958 and 1959. In 1960 Charlie moved on to the University of Illinois for one season with one Big 10 Qualifier. Beginning in 1962 he spent the next four seasons as the diving coach at Harvard University producing a three time Ivy League Champion Diver. From 1978-2000 Charlie served as the diving coach at Brighton High School with numerous conference and regional champions, state qualifiers, seventeen All-State Divers and many All-

American divers. Brighton divers were represented at the state and/or regional competitions for 20 consecutive years under his tutelage. One of these divers would eventually go on to earn an Olympic Bronze Medal in 1984. From 2002 – 2022 Charlie coached at Howell High School with seven All-State Divers.

Charlie Bates was extremely active in the High School Diving Community regularly serving on judging panels at the conference, regional and state levels. He was also one of the first paid NCAA coaches in the sport. He was a member of the Michigan Interscholastic Swim Coaches Association (MISCA) for forty –four years. In 1988 he received MISCA Bruce Harlan Award. He also authored a book about the use of trampolines in coaching diving.

Coach Bates was not only known for the performance of his divers but the character, commitment and sportsmanship he helped develop during the practices and meets during the long diving season. "There are few coaches more loved by their athletes than Charlie Bates"

Charlie Bates will also be remembered for his participation as a member of the "Three Stooges" comedy diving act. This diving group performed at the 1960's World's Fair and was composed of Charlie Bates, Dick Kimball (UM head diving coach), and John Narcy (MSU head diving coach).





## HALL OF FAME INDUCTEE: Michael Forgette

Michael Forgette has accumulated thirty-six years of coaching all levels of basketball in the Upper Peninsula of Michigan at Gwinn High School. He began his coaching career as the 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grade boys basketball coach at Gwinn High School for one year in 1966. From 1967-1970 he coached the 9<sup>th</sup> grade boys basketball team, becoming the head JV basketball coach from 1970-1974. He returned to coach the 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grade boys basketball team for eleven years from 1974-1985. In 1985 Mike became the head varsity boys basketball coach for eleven years – until 1996. His boys varsity basketball teams earned two MHSAA District Titles and two MHSAA Regional Titles and had a win/loss record of 108/132. Mike also coached the Gwinn High School girls varsity basketball team for twenty-five seasons, from 1977-2002. His varsity

girls teams won the girls Mid-Peninsula Conference Basketball Title eight times, earned eight MHSAA District Titles, three MHSAA Regional Titles, were the MHSAA State Runners Up in 1996, and had a win/loss record of 311/215. Mike also served as the assistant varsity track coach for Gwinn High School during the 1995 and 1995 seasons.

Coach Forgette is respected by his peers and athletes for “fostering character, grit, respect and many other life skills in countless youth throughout his career.” He has been honored for his and his team’s accomplishments throughout his career. In 1996 the Gwinn High School Varsity Girls Basketball Team was named the Upper Peninsula Class C Basketball Team of the year, and Mike was named the Upper Peninsula Class C Girls Coach of the Year in 1996. He was also Coach of the Upper Peninsula Womens All Star Game in 1992, 1993 and 1997. And in 2023 Gwinn High School named the new gym floor the “Coach Forgette Floor”. His coaching motto throughout his career was, “If you think you can, you’re right! If you think you can’t you’re right too!”

After his coaching career at Gwinn High School, Mike continued to serve his sport and community. He became the assistant coach for the Northern Michigan University Womens Basketball Team (2003-2005), and for the Finlandia University Basketball Team (2011-2013). He also served as the Upper Peninsula Summer Sports Festival Womens Basketball Chair. Mike returned as a volunteer coach for the Gwinn High School Boys Basketball team from 2014-2019. From 1974-1994 Mike was an MHSAA Official.



## HALL OF FAME INDUCTEE: Vicky Groat

Vicky Groat has been coaching volleyball in the state of Michigan for twenty-seven seasons and is still actively coaching. She began her career as the head coach of the girls varsity volleyball team at St Philip High School in Battle Creek from 1997-1999, returning as head coach in 2001 and continues in that position today. Her teams have earned multiple Southern Central Athletic Association Conference Titles, multiple St. Joe Valley Conference Titles, twenty-seven MHSAA District Titles, nineteen MHSAA Regional Titles, six MHSAA Runners Up Finishes, and twelve MHSAA State Titles. Coach Groat’s win/loss record is an impressive 1265/343/101. Her teams have been Academic All State Teams every year she has coached. Each year 1-2 girls on her team make All State Honors and in 2012 Amada McKinzie was named Miss

Volleyball. Many of her athletes have gone on to compete at the college level. In addition to coaching volleyball Vicky has been the Athletic Director at St Philip High School since 2008 and continues to hold that position. She was also the principal at St Philip for nine years stepping down at the start of the second semester this school year.

Throughout her career Vicky has received many awards and recognitions for her accomplishments. She has been named the Battle Creek Enquirer Coach of the Year five times, the Michigan Interscholastic Volleyball Coaches Association Coach of the Year ten times, the Michigan High School Coaches Association Coach of the Year in 2009 and the National High School Athletic Coaches Association Coach of the Year in 2020. She has been inducted into the St Philip High School Hall of Fame and in 2011 she was inducted into the Michigan Interscholastic Volleyball Coaches Association Hall of Fame. In 2023 Vicky was the recipient of the MHSAA Allen W. Bush Award.

Vicky has taken on many leadership roles to support her sport, coaches and student athletes. She was a member of the Michigan High School Athletic Association Representative Council from 2017-2020, the Volleyball Chair for the City of Battle Creek Athletic Directors for ten years, held the position of President (1yr) and Vice President (1yr) of the Southern Central Athletic Association, and was a Board Member (10yrs) and Individual Academic Chair (10yrs) for the Michigan Interscholastic Volleyball Coaches Association. She has also been a volunteer at the MHSAA Volleyball Finals from 2007-present and helped organize and chaperone St Philip’s High School trip to Rome.

Throughout her career Coach Groat’s philosophy has been this: “To compete at the highest level and be successful. Success will not only be judged by our wins and losses, but our skill improvement, sportsmanship, and how we represent our school, teammates and our parents. I expect our teams to play with maximum effort, class, discipline and respect. If we do this, all other rewards will come. When you work hard and play hard, good things will happen. We play as a team not as individuals.”



## HALL OF FAME INDUCTEE: Doug Jager

Doug Jager enters the MHSCA Hall of Fame having coached for fifty-eight seasons over thirty-three years at Grand Rapids Christian High School. He became the varsity girls and boys head cross country coach in 1991 and coached both teams for thirty-two seasons. His varsity girl's cross-country teams earned eighteen Grand Rapids City League Championships, eight Ottawa/Kent League Championships, twenty MHSAA Regional Championships, five State Runners Up Finishes, and six State Championships. Between 2001-2021 the girls' varsity cross country teams finished in the top 5 in the state nineteen times. Doug's girls' cross-country teams were also named the Michigan Cross Country Coaches Association Team of the Decade for 2000-2009 and 2010-2019, and in November of 2022 his team was ranked number 1 of all girls' teams in Michigan this century (2000-2022 – Jeff Hollobaugh, Track & Field News). Coach Jager's varsity boys' cross-country teams earned eighteen Conference Championships, twenty Regional Championships, and one MHSAA State Championship. Doug also coached the Grand Rapids Christian High School girls track and field team for twenty-five seasons and the boys track and field team for three seasons. In 2014 the girls track, and field team won the Michigan Interscholastic Track Coaches Association State Championship and finished as Runner's Up in 2022. Doug has coached twenty-two MHSAA All-State Individuals, three MHSAA Individual State Champions, and in 2012 Julia Bos was named Gatorade Cross Country Runner of the Year.

Over the course of his career Coach Jager has received many recognitions and awards. He has been named the MHSAA Regional Coach of the Year eighteen times, the Division 2 State Coach of the Year seven times, the MHSAA Girls Cross Country Coach of the Year six times, the MHSAA Boys Cross Country Coach of the Year once, the National High School Athletic Association Coach of the Year in 2012 and the USA Track and Field Coach of the Year in 2014. He has also been inducted into the Michigan High School Track Coaches Association (MITCA) Hall of Fame, the Grand Rapids Christian High School Hall of Fame, and the Kalamazoo Christian High School Hall of Fame (Alumni).

Doug has actively supported his community and sport through his participation in several associations and events. He is a Michigan Track Coaches Association past president, served on the Michigan Cross Country Committee, Co-host of ESPN cross country weekly wrap-up show (10 years), member of the Cross Country Ranking Committee for many years, Director of Eagles running camps-middle school and high school (25+ years), Co-Meet Director of the CFE cross country meet, Meet director of the Ottawa/Kent County Championship meet, provided commentary for the Fifth-Third /Amway Riverbank Run for women's lead car for many years, and was three time president of the Oakdale Park Church Council.



## HALL OF FAME INDUCTEE: Victoria Kowalski

Victoria Kowalski has accrued sixty-seven seasons of coaching student athletes over forty-four years. Vicky was the varsity girls golf coach at Mercy High School in Farmington Hills from 1980-2023, and the varsity girls bowling coach at Mercy High School from 2003-2024. Her teams have been highly successful under her leadership. The Mercy High School varsity girls golf teams have earned eighteen Catholic League Golf Championships, ten MHSAA Regional Titles, three MHSAA State Runners Up Finishes, four MHSAA State Championships, and had a win/loss record of 360/60. The varsity girls golf team also produced twenty All-State Individual Medalists, eighteen All-State Individuals (coaches selections), one All-State Champion; Erin Borowiec, who was also selected as Miss Golf. The Mercy High School varsity girls bowling team earned ten Catholic League Golf Championships, one MHSAA Regional Title, and had a win/loss record of 190/20. The varsity girls bowling team produced one All State Individual (coaches selection), one Individual State Runners Up; Cathleen Kowalski, who was also selected for the girls bowling Dream Team.

Coach K, as she is affectionately known, has made "an indelible impact on the school's athletic program and the lives of countless students," and has been recognized by her peers and community for her service and commitment. She was named Girls Golf Coach of the Year four times, the Catholic High School League Coach of the Year eighteen times, the Michigan Interscholastic Golf Coaches Association (MIGCA) Regional Coach of the Year six times, the MIGCA State Coach of the Year two times, and the National Girls Golf Coach of the year two times. Coach K was inducted into the Catholic High School Hall of Fame in 2007, the MIGCA Hall of Fame in 2009, the Michigan High School Interscholastic Bowling Coaches Hall of Fame in 2021, and the Mercy High School Athletic Hall of Fame in 2022.

Over the years Vicky has taken on many leadership roles and generously volunteered to further the growth and success of her athletes, sports and community. She has served as the coordinator of the Catholic League Bowling Committee fifteen times, the Catholic Golf League thirty times, the MHSAA Golf Committee six times, the MHSAA Bowling Committee eight times, was the director of the Golf Regional Meet six times, and was the director of the Bowling Regional ten times. She has also volunteered her time to organize and oversee multiple Catholic High School League bowling and golf tournaments.



## HALL OF FAME INDUCTEE: Kimberly M. Napieralski

Kimberly M. Napieralski's career as a golf coach spans forty-one seasons over twenty-five years at Grand Rapids Central High School where she continues to coach. Kim began her coaching career as the head JV girls golf coach from 1999-2006. She added on the head JV boys golf coaching position from 2002 -2006. In 2006 she became the head varsity boys golf coach and in 2012 became the head varsity girls golf coach. She continues to coach the varsity boys and girls golf teams at Grand Rapids Central High School with great success. Coach Napieralski's varsity girls golf teams have earned three Ottawa Kent "OK" Gold Conference Titles, one MHSAA Regional Title, and one MHSAA State Title in 2023. The girls golf team also earned Academic All-State Team honors seven times and have a win/loss record of 1,013/286. Her varsity boys golf teams have earned six Ottawa Kent "OK" Gold Conference Titles, three MHSAA Regional Titles, one MHSAA State Runners Up Finish, and two MHSAA State Titles (2021, 2023). The boys golf team also earned Academic All-State Honors four times and have a win/loss record of 1,826/568. Her teams have produced five MHSAA All-State Individuals, one MHSAA Individual State Champion, and one MHSAA Individual Runners Up. Will Preston was named Mr. Golf in 2024 and was selected for the Super Team, All-State Team, as well as being the Salutatorian of his class. Matthew Sokorai was selected for the All-State Team. Will Preston went on to Penn State and Matthew Sokorai went on to Grand Valley State University.

Coach Napieralski is well respected in the golf community and has been recognized for her commitment and accomplishments many times. She has been named the Michigan Interscholastic Golf Coaches Association (MIGCA) Boys Golf Coach of the Year four times, the MIGCA Girls Golf Coach of the Year three times, the Michigan High School Coaches Association Coach of the Year in 2023, and the National Federation of State High School Associations- Michigan, Boys Golf Coach of the Year in 2022 and 2023. In 2022 Kim was inducted into the Michigan Interscholastic Golf Coaches Association Hall of Fame.

Kim has been actively involved in promoting her sport and community throughout the years. For many years the "OK" Gold Conference coaches have put her in charge of the securing the site and organizing the Conference Championship. She has also served on the MIGCA – Board of Directors Membership (2023), served as the Immaculate Heart of Mary Golf League Rules Chairman (15 years), and helps young girls in her area develop basic golf skills. She is also an American Red Cross Blood Donor.



## HALL OF FAME INDUCTEE: Kimberley Nichols

Kimberley Nichols joins this year's class of inductees with thirty-one seasons of coaching experience and counting. She began her coaching career as the assistant varsity gymnastic coach at Portage Northern Cooperative High School from 1996 -1997. From 1998-2007 Kim was the assistant coach of the girls varsity track and field coach at Coldwater High School. During her tenure she coached the first women pole vaulters for Coldwater High School, including one MHSAA State Finalist and multiple school record pole vaulters. She served as a volunteer assistant coach for the girls varsity gymnastics team at Coldwater High School in 1998 then took on the role of head coach from 1998-2001 and 2008-2023. Her teams have produced one National Uneven Bars Champion – Kylie Dudek 2013, one MHSAA State Finals Uneven Bars Champion, One MHSAA State Finals Vault Champion, two MHSAA State Finals All-Around Runners Up, eleven All-State Medalists, forty MHSAA Gymnastics State Finals Qualifiers, four Regional Champions, twenty MHSAA Qualifying Gymnastics Teams to Regionals and twenty-five South Central Gymnastics League (SCGL) Conference Champions.

Coach Nichols is known for her "commitment and dedication" to her athletes, sports and community. She was selected as the Michigan High School Gymnastic Coach and Judges Association (MHSGCJA) Coach of the Year (2019) and the Michigan High School Coaches Association (MHSCA) Coach of the Year (2019). She also established and hosted the Stick-It-For-A-Cure Gymnastics Meet at Coldwater High School. Her teams collected over \$130,000 in donations to the cancer center of their community hospital over thirteen years. This not only had a positive impact on local cancer patients, but instilled the "power of volunteering and giving back" to her athletes. Her teams were recognized for their efforts and received the Regional Jr. Philanthropist Award – ProMedica Hospital in 2018, and the National Philanthropist Program Award – Pro-Medica Hospital in 2019.

Kim was a MHSAA Girls Gymnastics Official for eleven years (1994-98 and 2002-07), and was a judge at the MHSAA Gymnastics finals five times. She has been a MHSGCJA member since 1994, and was a presenter at the MHSGCJA Clinic in 2019. Kim has also served on the MHSAA Girls Gymnastics Committee four times, the MHSAA Gymnastics Officials Selection Committee four times and has coached a USA Gymnastics Club for fifteen years.



## HALL OF FAME INDUCTEE: Edward Stanbury II

Edward G. Stanbury II, a 1978 graduate from Grand Blanc High School, continued at Central Michigan University where he earned a varsity letter and degree in 1982. He received a Regular Army Commission as a Lieutenant in the US Army and as an Air Defense Artillery officer and attained the rank of Major serving during Desert Storm. After completing his service, he began his nearly 40-year coaching career as an Asst. Football Coach at New Mexico State University and Fresno City College. In 1995, Ed moved back to Michigan to become an art teacher and football coach at his alma mater, Grand Blanc High School. In 1997, Ed became the Boys Head Track & Field Coach and started coaching Boys Cross Country.

Ed's Cross Country teams earned several Conference Titles and three Regional titles. His track & field teams earned a total of eleven conference championship titles, while competing in; The Big 9, KLAA and SVL Conferences. Titles also included, seven KLAA West Division Championships, three KLAA Association Championships, eleven MHSAA Regional Championships, and two consecutive State Runner-Up finishes at the MHSAA Div-1 Finals. In addition, he coached the 2005 Grand Blanc Track Boys to a MITCA Team State championship. His teams had three Top Ten MITCA finishes, nineteen MHSAA Top 25 finishes, Nine Top Ten MHSAA finishes, and six Top five MHSAA finishes. Many of his athletes went on to win relay State titles and individual State titles in open events. There were five 1600m champions, in which two were State record setting and the final one still holds today.

Many of Coach Stanbury's athletes have gone on to compete at the collegiate level and beyond. Including several collegiate All-Americans, a Heisman Trophy winner, several NCAA champions, NFL players, and Grant Fisher, USA record holder in several events, and recent medalist at the Paris 2024 Olympics.

Ed has received many honors over the years. He was named the Genesee County Coach of the Year (Bill Perry Award) seven times, the Saginaw Valley League Track and Field Coach of the Year in 2019, the MHSAA Regional Coach of the Year three times and was a MSHAA Coach of the Year nominee seven times. In 2016 Ed was inducted into the Michigan Interscholastic Track Coaches Association (MITCA) Hall of Fame. He was honored by the Grand Blanc High School Alumni Committee as a 2019 Distinguished Graduate. Ed, a member of The Class A State Championship 1977 Grand Blanc High School Cross Country team, celebrated the team induction into the Greater Flint Area Sports Hall of Fame in 2016.

Coach Stanbury announced his retirement as Head Coach of Track and Cross Country at the conclusion of the 2024 Track Season, marking a 29-year coaching career at Grand Blanc High School.



## HALL OF FAME INDUCTEE: Michael Venos

Michael Venos' coaching career spans four decades and sixty-three seasons and is still actively coaching. He began coaching at Grand Blanc High School as the head coach for varsity boys water polo and the assistant varsity boys/girls swim coach from 1983-1989. He moved on to Bloomfield Hills Andover High School as the assistant varsity boys/girls swim coach from 1990-1992 and to Bloomfield Hills Lahser High School as the assistant varsity boys swim coach (1992). His next coaching position took him to Ferndale High School as the head varsity boys/girls swim coach from 1993-1997. In 1998 Mike was hired as the head coach of the varsity boys swim team at Brother Rice High School for the next twenty-five seasons and as the head coach JV baseball team at Brother Rice High School for the next five seasons. He also served as the head coach of the varsity girls swim coach at Notre Dame Prep from 2014-2016 and has been the head coach of the varsity girls swim team at Mercy High School since 2016-present. His varsity boys swim teams at Brother Rice High School have earned twenty-two Catholic League District Titles, three MHSAA State Runners Up Finishes, six MHSAA State Titles, finished as the National Dual Meet Runners Up from 2014-2017 and were National Dual Meet Champions in 2000. His varsity boys swim win/loss record is an impressive 480/90. Coach Venos' Mercy High School varsity girls swim team has earned seven Catholic League District Titles, two MHSAA Runners Up Finishes, three MHSAA State Titles, and were National Dual Meet Runners Up from 2017-2020. The varsity girls swim win/loss record is 95/15. Mike's teams have also produced over one hundred MHSAA All State Individuals and fifteen MHSAA Individual State Champions. Student athletes Mike Zennedjian and Chris Bagley were both named Michigan Interscholastic Swim Coaches Association (MISCA) Swimmers of the Year. Mike also coached numerous Dream Team Individual and Relay student Athletes. Many of his athletes have gone on to compete at the collegiate level.

Coach Venos has been honored many times for his coaching accomplishments and service to his sport. He was named the Oakland Press Coach of the Year three times, the Observer-Eccentric News Coach of the Year two times, the MISCA Zone Coach of the Year (2000), the MISCA State Coach of the Year four times, the National Federation of High School Coaches National Coach of the Year in 2017, and in 2016 he received the Matt Mann Award – Swimming Hall of Fame (MISCA's highest honor). Mike has also been inducted into the Catholic League Hall of Fame (2016), the Grand Blanc High School Distinguished Alumni Hall of Fame (2019) and the Brother Rice Hall of Fame (2020).

Over the years Mike has also taken on several leadership positions to support and promote his sport and athletes. He has served as a MISCA board member zone vice president (2000-2007), is presently a MISCA board member at large, served as Catholic High School League (CHSL) meet manager 2003-present, member of the MHSAA swim committee four times, was a MISCA presenter in 2017, a MISCA coaches board presenter five times and an Ohio coaches clinic presenter in 2018. Mike has also coached summer club swimming every year since he was 16, and has coached at the USA club level and the YMCA producing three YMCA National Champions and four Olympic Trial Qualifiers.



## HALL OF FAME INDUCTEE: David Zulkiewski

David Zulkiewski joins this year's class of MHSCA Hall of Fame inductees with twenty-three seasons as a swim/dive coach. He began his coaching career at the assistant coach for the girls swim/dive team at Lahser High School and as the assistant boys swim/dive coach at De La Salle Collegiate for one season each in 1999-2000. He was the head coach of the boys and girls varsity swim/dive team at Andover High School from 2000-2013, and the Head Coach of the girls swim/dive team at Bloomfield Hills High School from 2013-2021. Dave has had tremendous success during his coaching career. His varsity boys swim/dive team at Andover High School earned one Oakland Athletic Association (Blue Division) Title. His girls varsity swim/dive teams earned five Oakland Athletic Association (White Division) Titles. His overall win/loss record was 130/100/2. His teams produced twenty-six All-State Individuals, two MHSAA Individual Runners Up, and six MHSAA Individual State Champions. He also coached three All-Americans; Mike Desautels (6) 2003-2005, Jayme Groth (1) 2011, Ines Charles (1) 2013, and 3 All-American Relays 2003-2004, 2004-2005.

Coach Zulkiewski is well respected in the swim and diving community and has been honored for his service and achievements many times. He was named the Oakland Athletic Association Coach of the Year three times, the Michigan Interscholastic Swim Coaches Association (MISCA) Zone 2 Regional Coach of the Year two times, the MISCA Zone 2 State Coach of the Year two times, received the National Interscholastic Swim Coaches Association Outstanding Service Award in 2023, and the MISCA Matt Mann Award – Swimming Hall of Fame in 2019 (MISCA's highest honor).

Dave has been an active member of many different associations and committees. He has been a MISCA board member from 2000-present, served as zone vice president, awards chair, president-elect, president, past president and currently is in charge of the MISCA web site. He has also served on the Oakland County Championship Meet Committee – Qualifying times and meet packet, served on the MHSAA swim committee three times, was the Northwest Suburban Swim League Representative from 2022-present. Dave also helped State Champs create and produce the Poolside Podcast for two years, then created the MISCA Main Set Podcast which he currently runs. He has also compiled all of the state meet results back to 1943 and published them on the MISCA website. He then went on to create the All Time Top 16 performances in MHSAA history and published them on the MISCA website.

## NHSACA HALL OF FAME

### Kris Hubbard

Upon her retirement from the head coaching position in 2019, she had spent 41 years coaching Whiteford High School Bobcats Girls' sports. Originally from Blissfield, Michigan, she went on to Western Michigan where she played basketball, volleyball, and field hockey. She began her coaching at Whiteford High coaching three sports, track, volleyball, and basketball, until the girls who were going to play softball asked her to coach them as well. That program grew quickly from its beginnings under coach Hubbard. She had much success in every sport that she coached, but it was with basketball and softball that she had the most success. Eight conference titles in Basketball along with seven district championships, a regional title and a state runner up finish. In softball she led the Bobcats to 15 conference titles, 23 district titles, 13 regional titles, three state runner up finishes and three state championships in 1984, 1985, and 1987.

She was a charter member of the Michigan High School Softball Coaches Association where she served as a District chair, regional chair, and all-state selection committee member for about 30 years. She has been inducted into the Whiteford High Hall of Fame, the Western Michigan Hall of Fame, and the Michigan High School Softball Coaches Association Hall of Fame. She was a national Coach of the Year finalist in 2007, and she was named Michigan High School Softball Coaches Association State Coach of the Year three times (1984, 1985, and 1987). She was also state basketball Coach of the Year in 1984. The Monroe Evening News chose her as volleyball Coach of the Year one time, basketball Coach of the Year three times, and softball Coach of the Year four times. She coached dozens of All-State athletes and athletes who went on to play at the collegiate level. In her coaching career, she had a 1,415 and 660 win/loss record in the four sports that she coached.

The softball field at Whiteford High is named Kris Hubbard Field. And she works as a volunteer for the softball program. From the state of Michigan, the National High School Athletic Coaches Association Hall of Fame inductee—Kris Hubbard.

### Kay Johnson

Coach Johnson graduated from Whitmer High School in Toledo, Ohio. It was on to Adrian College and then to the University of Toledo. Her entire coaching career has been at Morenci High School in Morenci, Michigan. Through her career she has coached basketball, track and volleyball, coached cheer and of course her special sport—softball. She was even athletic director for a short time. Coach Johnson was the head coach for volleyball for seven years and head coach for basketball for fourteen years. Softball, however, has been for passion for 52 years...and she hasn't retired yet!! As she finished her 50th year of softball coaching, she was honored by her former players for achieving that milestone. Her Bulldog teams have 998 wins over the two generations of players who have played for her. She has one State Championship in Track and Field with two regional titles. In softball, she has coached teams to 11 conference titles, 24 district titles, nine regional crowns, two state titles, two state runners up finishes, and two more four appearances.

She is a charter member of the Michigan High School Softball Coaches Association that goes back 51 years, and she has been on their executive committee for over 10 years. ## NHSACA Kathy Holloway Award

The Kathy Holloway Women of Inspiration Award is presented annually to a female that has promoted female athletics by either coaching, serving, supporting, or leading high school female athletic programs. At the heart of the award are individuals that support female athletic programs that focus on changing lives and inspiring women to strive for greatness. The award is named after Kathy Stewart Holloway. Coach Holloway was the first female elected President of the National High School Athletic Coaches Association (NHSACA) and served in that role in 1992.

Jean LaClair has coached for thirty years of which 24 have been at Bronson. She has been an athletic administrator for twenty-six of those years. She has served as a president and board member of the Michigan Volleyball Coaches Association for over 25 years, served on the Public Relations Committee Chair for the Michigan Interscholastic Athletic Association for over 10 years, served on the NHSACA Volleyball Committee Chair for over 6 years, and served on the National Athletic Directors Relations Committee.

As a volleyball coach she has led her teams to 1,353 wins, 436 losses, and 101 tournament ties. Her teams have fifty conference, district or regional championships, on runner up finish, and five state championships.

Jean LaClair has been a national coach of the year from both the NHSACA and NFHS and has been inducted into two Halls of Fame (Michigan High School Coaches Association and the Michigan Interscholastic Volleyball Association).
