The U.S. is the home team tonight, will wear its white jerseys and occupy the left bench ... The U.S. and Finland played a pair of overtime games in last year's World Juniors, with the Finns winning in the preliminary round and the U.S. coming out victorious in the gold medal game. The teams met in pre-tournament action in Duluth, Minn., ahead of this year's WJC, with Team USA gaining a 3-1 win ... Team USA had a short practice yesterday at 1 p.m. at Grand Casino Arena ... **Cole Hutson** is back in the lineup tonight after going off due to injury midway through Team USA's game vs. Switzerland on Dec. 27. He skated yesterday and the day before ... Eight of the last 10 games between the U.S. and Finland have been decided by a single goal, including three overtime games ... The U.S. had an 18-game streak in the WJC without a regulation loss until its 6-3 defeat at the hands of Sweden on Wednesday (Dec. 31) ... **Nick Kempf** will start in goal tonight for Team USA. He is 1-0 with a 1.54 GAA and .938 save percentage in the tournament.

## FROM PREVIOUS VERSIONS OF GAME NOTES

At age 64, **Bob Motzko** is the oldest coach to ever guide the U.S. in the World Juniors. Motzko is making his third appearance as head coach of a U.S. National Junior Team, having led the U.S. to gold in 2017 and bronze in 2018. Prior to Motzko, Ron Wilson (2016) and Dean Blais (2012) shared the distinction of being the eldest coaches to ever guide a U.S. National Junior Team, both at age 60. John Perpich (1984) and Kevin Constantine (1991) are the youngest at age 31. The average age of the head coach for the U.S. National Junior Team is 45 ... **Kamil Bednarik** grew up speaking Slovak as his parents -- Kamil Sr. and Miriam -- are both from Slovakia. They moved to the U.S. in 1997 and Kamil grew up in the Chicago suburbs ... Team USA's goal song is Free Bird from Lynyrd Skynyrd. It was suggested by Jacob Fowler to leaders of the 2024 U.S. National Junior Team and has caught fire. It is now become the de facto goal song for all U.S. teams in international play.

## LEADERSHIP GROUP

Forward **Brodie Ziemer** (Chaska, Minn.), who returns to the U.S. National Junior Team after helping the squad earn the gold medal a year ago, is the captain of the 2026 U.S. National Junior Team. Ziemer was also the captain of the silver medal-winning U.S. National Under-18 Team in the 2024 IIHF U18 Men's World Championship. Forwards **James Hagens** (Hauppauge, N.Y.), **Max Plante** (Hermantown, Minn.) and **Teddy Stiga** (Sudbury, Mass.), along with defenseman **Cole Hutson** (North Barrington, Ill.) are serving as alternate captains. All four were part of the 2025 U.S. National Junior Team.

## HUTSON CLIMBING CHARTS

Defenseman **Cole Hutson** (North Barrington, Ill./Boston University) is climbing the charts in the Team USA record book. In last year's World Juniors, Hutson became the first-ever defenseman to lead the tournament in points with 3-8--11. He had two assists in Team USA's 6-3 win over Germany on Dec. 26 and is now just one point shy of tying Erik Johnson for the top spot in career points by a defenseman. In addition, his 10 career assists in the WJC have tied Ryan Suter for the top spot in the U.S. record book.

## TEAM CHARTER

Tom Kouleentes, a lifelong educator and principal at Libertyville High School in Illinois and Stan Bowman, general manager of the Edmonton Oilers, helped the U.S. National Junior Team develop its team charter for the World Juniors. The process started during USA Hockey's U.S. National Junior Evaluation Camp this past summer in Minneapolis, Minn., where both Kouleentes and Bowman were on hand. It finished on Dec. 14 in Saint Paul with Kouleentes leading the session to complete the process. The team charter encompasses the guiding principles the players mutually agreed they will utilize throughout the tournament.

## MURRAY WILLIAMSON

Two-time U.S. Olympic coach **Murray Williamson** (1968, 1972-silver) had the original idea for the IIHF World Junior Championship more than 50 years ago. Williamson passed away Sept. 15, 2025, at age 91. He resided in the Twin Cities throughout his adult life.

## VIKINGS WELCOME TEAM USA

The Minnesota Vikings welcomed Team USA to their Christmas day game against the Detroit Lions at U.S. Bank Stadium. During a timeout in the first quarter, Team USA was recognized on the field before the capacity crowd, which broke out in chants of USA. The players had a chance prior to the game to be along the back of the North end zone and referee Shawn Smith stopped to talk to some of the guys for a few minutes and wish them luck. In addition, actor Josh Duhamel came down to the tunnel where the players were staged to take a photo.

## TEAM USA AT THE WORLD JUNIORS

Entering the 2025 IIHF World Junior Championship, the U.S. holds a 167-13-7-121-11 (W-OTW-OTL-L-T) all-time record in the event. Most recently, Team USA went 5-1-1-0 in the 2025 tournament and earned the gold medal. To date, Team USA has earned 16 podium finishes, including seven gold medals (2004, 2010, 2013, 2017, 2021, 2024, 2025), two silver medals (1997, 2019) and seven bronze medals (1986, 1992, 2007, 2011, 2016, 2018, 2023). The United States has medaled in eight of the last ten tournaments, the best medal stretch in the history of the country.

## WORLD JUNIORS IN THE USA

The U.S. is hosting the IIHF World Junior Championship for seventh time. Team USA is looking for its first-ever gold medal on home soil in the tournament. The U.S. has played in the bronze-medal game in the last three tourneys on U.S. soil.

## TOURNEY OPENERS

Including 2026, the U.S. is 23-2-1-22-2 (W-OTW-OTL-L-T) all-time in World Juniors opening games. Since 2000, Team USA has won 22 of 27 openers, going 20-2-1-3-1.

## LEGENDARY STAN WONG

Legendary athletic trainer **Stan Wong** marks his 58th appearance on the staff of a U.S. team on the international stage. He is working his 24th straight IIHF World Junior Championship and has also been an athletic trainer for the last five U.S. Olympic men's hockey teams in addition to 18 U.S. men's national teams, 10 Deutschland Cup squads and for Team USA at the 2012 Youth Olympic Games.

## THE JOURNEY -- AN OVERVIEW

The U.S. began its World Juniors journey in St. Paul, Minn., on Dec. 14 before moving to Duluth, Minn., for a nine-day camp that included a pair of pre-tournament games against Germany (Dec. 21) and Finland (Dec. 23) at AMSOIL Arena. All total, 30 players started with Team USA vying for a spot on the final 25-man U.S. roster.

## WORLD BREAKFAST OF TEAMMATES

Some 800 people gathered for the Hockey Ministries International World Breakfast of Teammates at Roy Wilkins Auditorium on Dec. 27. His responsibilities include oversight of USA Hockey's international efforts, including its men's, women's and sled programs as well as the National Junior Development Program. The U.S. has enjoyed unprecedented success on the international stage under his guidance.

### ABOUT MOTZKO

**Bob Motzko** is serving as head coach of the U.S. National Junior Team for the third time. He led Team USA to gold at the 2017 IIHF World Junior Championship and bronze in the 2018 event. One of the most accomplished coaches in American hockey today, Motzko is in his 21st campaign as an NCAA Division I men's hockey head coach and eighth season guiding the University of Minnesota men's hockey program. In his time in Minneapolis, Motzko has led the Gophers to five-straight NCAA Tournament appearances, including two trips to the NCAA Men's Frozen Four, along with three Big Ten regular-season titles and one Big Ten Conference tournament title. The recipient of the Spencer Penrose Award as the top coach in NCAA Division I men's ice hockey in 2022-23, Motzko spent 13 seasons as the bench boss at St. Cloud State University and guided teams to eight NCAA Tournament appearances, including a spot in the 2013 NCAA Men's Frozen Four.
