

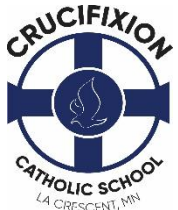

Pastor's Message

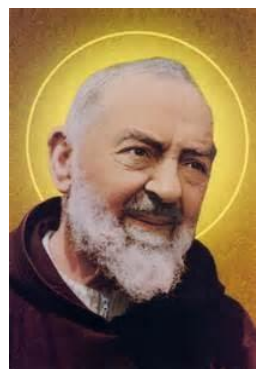
We never have enough storage, that is true in both our homes and our church / school. Originally, we thought that we could put a basement at the same floor level as our gym under the entire new daycare. Upon further investigation, such a basement would be a five-foot drop requiring a great deal of wasted space for ramps. Instead, we will be adding 1300 square feet in storage on the back of the future daycare attached to the gym (and the same level as the gym floor). Much work has been done in the past few months to more efficiently use the 1,008 square feet of storage we already have in the basement of the church.

Saint of the Week: Padre Pio
*"Pray. Hope. And don't worry."

Padre Pio's words serve as a bright light in the seeming darkness of our world. To a Christian, prayer is not empty words, it is not a lack of action, it is not ignoring the problem. Prayer is, as Padre Pio says, "the best weapon we have." Prayer is our first and most important line of defense, our most powerful tool to combat evil, the most loving act we can perform for our friends and neighbors who are suffering. Was a full kitchen considered for the new gathering space project?

We have recently received questions about the kitchen that will be included in the gathering space project. The plan is to build a catering kitchen rather than a full kitchen. A catering kitchen is designed to support smaller events and gatherings by allowing us to reheat, stage, and serve pre-prepared food, rather than cook meals from scratch on-site.

Although a full kitchen was considered, it would cost Crucifixion an additional **\$200,000** or more and is not necessary for most parish events. A catering kitchen was determined to be a more cost-effective and responsible use of Crucifixion's resources, while still enhancing our ability to support fellowship and community gatherings. 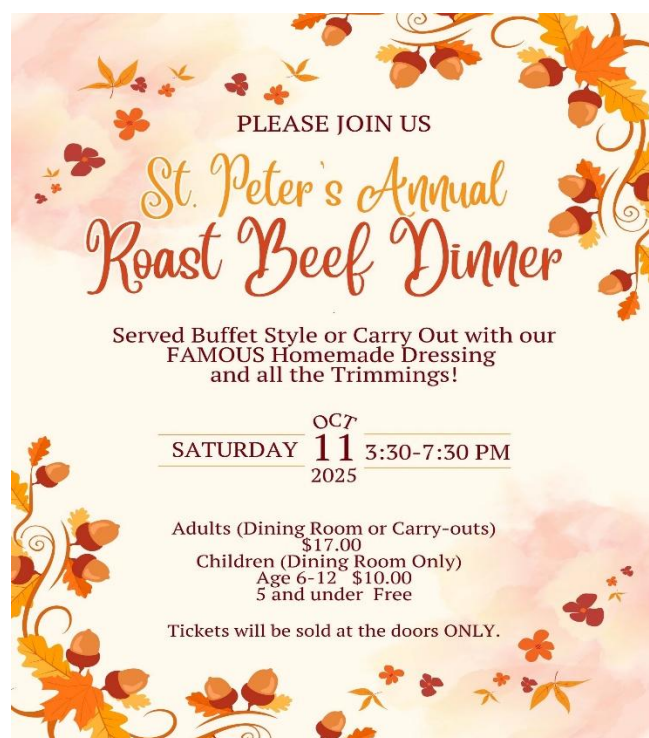

KC Corner: How did the Knights of Columbus come to be? Recognizing a need in his community, Father Michael J. McGivney, the 29-year-old assistant pastor of St. Mary's Church in New Haven, Conn., gathered a group of men at his parish on Oct. 2, 1881.
