TONIGHT'S GAME

The U.S. Olympic Men's Ice Hockey Team tangles with Sweden here tonight in quarterfinal action at the XXV Olympic Winter Games. Team USA is the home team, will wear its blue jersey and occupy the left bench (from the player's perspective looking onto the ice). Tonight's game will be televised live on NBC and streamed live on Peacock.

TALKING POINTS

USA VS. SWEDEN

The U.S. and Sweden have met 15 previous times in the Olympics, but never in the quarterfinals. Sweden has won seven times, while the U.S. has six wins to its credit, with two ties. Team USA is winless in the last eight games of the series.

TIDBITS

The U.S. had a brief pre-game skate at 12 noon today ... Team USA has not allowed a power play goal in the Olympic tournament, foiling all nine opponent chances through three games ... Coach Snoop Dogg and A.J. Mieczko are joining NBC's broadcast of tonight's game ... The U.S., Sweden and Canada are the only three teams in the Olympic tournament made up exclusively of NHL players ... Yesterday (Feb. 17) marked the anniversary of the U.S. Olympic Women's Ice Hockey Team earning gold in the 1998 Games, the first time women's hockey was ever played in the Olympics. Former USA Hockey president **Walter Bush** is credited as the driving force for adding women's hockey to the Olympic program. In 1998 there were just more than 28,000 female players competing within USA Hockey and sometime in the next two weeks it is expected that for the first time ever, that number will eclipse 100,000 ... After its practice late yesterday afternoon, Team USA enjoyed a dinner away from the Olympic Village ... **Dan Mayasich**, son of legendary U.S. Olympian John Mayasich, arrived in Milan yesterday and is here for the duration of the Olympics. John Mayasich, always in the conversation when pundits talk about the best American player of all-time, helped lead the U.S. to its first gold medal in men's hockey in 1960 and also was part of the 1956 silver-medal squad in Cortina, Italy ... **Mike Eruzione**, captain of the gold medal-winning 1980 U.S. Olympic Men's Hockey Team, arrives tomorrow in Milan and will be here through the duration of the Games ... The U.S. has outshot all three of its opponents in the Olympic tournament ... **Auston Matthews**, **Matthew Tkachuk**, **Brady Tkachuk** and **Quinn Hughes** are the four players who have at least one point in each of Team USA's first three games.

IN THE CROWD

Michigan governor **Gretchen Whitmer** is expected to be among those in attendance at tonight's game in addition to U.S. Senators **Jerry Moran** (Kansas), **Kirsten Gillibrand** (New York), **John Barrasso** (Wyoming), **John Boozman** (Arizona), **Deb Fischer** (Nebraska), and **Gary Peters** (Michigan).

HELLEBUYCK BACK IN GOAL

Connor Hellebuyck will start in goal for Team USA. He is second in the Olympic tournament in both save percentage (.952) and goals against average (1.00). Hellebuyck has played in two of Team USA's three games, including in a 5-1 win over Latvia (17 saves) to open the Games on Feb. 12 and also in Team USA's last outing on Sunday (Feb. 15), a 5-1 triumph over Germany (23 saves).

U.S. WOMEN GO FOR GOLD TOMORROW

The U.S. Olympic Women's Ice Hockey Team goes for gold tomorrow against Canada with opening faceoff set for 7:10 p.m. local/1:10 p.m. ET. (USA Network/Peacock). The U.S. has five straight shutouts to its credit over its first six games and has outscored opponents, 31-1.

WHAT'S IN A NICKNAME

Team USA equipment manager **Chris "Frosty" Scoppetto**, who has supported multiple U.S. teams on the international stage over the course of his career, got his nickname from Brad McCrimmon back in 1996. The nickname originated while Scoppetto was working as an assistant equipment manager for the Phoenix Coyotes. He was consistently seen alongside Coyotes player Keith Tkachuk, leading McCrimmon to compare their close pairing to that of former Bruins trainer John "Frosty" Forrestall, who was famously always with Bobby Orr. Scoppetto is the godparent to Keith Tkachuk's daughter, Taryn.

AVERAGE AGE OF U.S. OLYMPIC TEAMS

The 2026 U.S. Olympic Men's Ice Hockey Team has an average age of 28.42 and is the fifth oldest on record. Brock Faber, born Aug. 22, 2002, is the youngest member of the squad and was one of four 19-year-olds on the 2022 U.S. Olympic Men's Hockey Team. Brock Nelson, at 34, is the oldest.

LEADERSHIP GROUP

Forward **Auston Matthews** (Scottsdale, Ariz.) is the captain of the 2026 U.S. Olympic Men's Ice Hockey Team. He is in his 10th season playing for the Toronto Maple Leafs and is the most prolific goal scorer in the NHL since his arrival. Matthew Tkachuk, an alternate captain for the two-time defending Stanley Cup champion Florida Panthers is serving as an alternate captain as is Charlie McAvoy, who is an alternate captain for the Boston Bruins. The leadership group is the same three players the U.S. utilized for last February's 4 Nations Face-Off.



DID YOU KNOW -- JACK HUGHES

Did you know U.S. forward **Jack Hughes** played in all three major IIHF world championships in the 2018-19 season? Below is an entry from the USA Hockey game notes vault from May of 2019.

Jack Hughes is the fourth player in IIHF history to play in the Under-18 Men's World Championship, World Junior Championship and Men's World Championship in the same season, joining Switzerland's Kevin Fialia and Vadim Karaga and Andrei Kostitsy from Belarus. Hughes is the youngest American to ever play for a U.S. team in the top-level men's world championship.

TIDBITS FROM PREVIOUS GAME NOTES

The U.S. had three full practices and a morning skate prior to its opening game ... Team USA includes just two players with Olympic experience in defenseman **Brock Faber** and **Jake Sanderson**, both who were part of the 2022 U.S. Olympic Men's Ice Hockey Team. Said Faber, "Its my second time, but it feels like the first." The 2022 Beijing Games were the "COVID" games and played in a "bubble" without friends and family ... **Ellen Hughes**, mother of Jack and Quinn Hughes, is the performance consultant for the U.S. Olympic Women's Ice Hockey Team. Ellen played on the 1992 U.S. Women's National Team and has been working with the U.S. Women's National Team program since October 2023 ... **Pat Kelleher**, executive director of USA Hockey, arrived last Thursday (Feb. 5) and is here for the duration of the Games. His brother, Chris, is the director of player personnel for the U.S. Olympic Men's Ice Hockey Team ... **Mike Trimboli** (Massena, N.Y.), president of USA Hockey, arrived today and will be here for the rest of the Games ... U.S. defenseman **Quinn Hughes** likes to read, but shares that he doesn't read on game days, calling it bad luck ... A good number of players had the chance to meet **Snoop Dogg** on Feb. 10 in the Olympic Village. Snoop is serving as the honorary coach for the entirety of Team USA and came to the U.S. athlete resource center to show support and provide some words on inspiration ... **Brij Singh**, who is serving as team leader of the U.S. Olympic Men's Hockey Team for the second straight Games, is believed to be the first Turban Sikh to be part of any Winter Games official team delegation ... Players have taken the opportunity to go to women's hockey, speed skating and figure skating while here in Milan.

WON GROUP FOR FOURTH TIME IN THIS FORMAT

Since this current Olympic format was established in 2010, the U.S. has won its group four times, including this year where it won all three of its preliminary round games in regulation. Team USA rolled to an unbeaten 3-0 mark in 2022, with wins over China (8-0), Canada (4-2) and Germany (3-2) in preliminary round play. The U.S. went 2-1-0-0 (W-OTW-OTL-L) in 2014 with regulation wins over Slovakia (7-1) and Slovenia (5-1), sandwiched by a 3-2 shootout victory over host Russia, which featured the shootout heroics of T.J. Oshie and goaltending of Jonathan Quick. In 2010, the U.S. was 3-0-0-0, earning regulation wins over Switzerland (3-1), Norway (6-1) and Canada (5-3) in preliminary round play.

OPENING CEREMONIES; MEETING VICE PRESIDENT

Charlie McAvoy, Jeremy Swayman, Jake Oettinger and **Zach Werenski** flew over ahead of the rest of the team to attend the Opening Ceremonies. The trio left NYC the evening of Feb. 5 and arrived in Milan the morning of Feb. 6. The next day (Feb. 7), the four had a private audience with U.S. Vice President Vance and then went to the Starbucks Winter House to sit down to do enjoy lunch and do a few select interviews. The rest of Team USA arrived in Milan on Feb. 8.

ALL-TIME IN OPENING GAMES

In its first game of an Olympic tournament, the U.S. is 12-0-2-8-3 (W-OTW-OTL-L-T), including a 5-1 win in its first game of these 2026 Olympic Winter Games. The U.S. has won five of its last seven Olympic-tournament opening games.

Team USA includes two sets of brothers – **Matthew** (Florida Panthers) and **Brady** (Ottawa Senators) **Tkachuk** and **Quinn** (Minnesota Wild) and **Jack** (New Jersey Devils) **Hughes**. The only other time a U.S. Olympic men's hockey team has had two sets of brothers was on the 1960 gold medal-winning squad (Squaw Valley) with Bill and Roger Christian and Bill and Bob Cleary.

BROCK NELSON AND THE OLYMPICS

Brock Nelson is part of one of the most storied hockey families in the U.S. From Warroad, Minnesota, Nelson is the fifth member of his family to play for the U.S. in the Olympic Winter Games.

- His grandfather, **Bill Christian**, and great-uncle, **Roger Christian**, won gold at the 1960 Squaw Valley Olympics.
- His uncle, **Dave Christian**, was a standout on the "Miracle on Ice" team that earned gold at the 1980 Lake Placid Olympics. Dave is here in Milan with his wife Lisa for the duration of the Games.
- His great-uncle, **Gordon Christian**, earned an Olympic silver medal as part of Team USA in the 1956 Games in Cortina, Italy.

Business Enterprise

Bill and Roger Christian founded the Christian Brothers Hockey Company, which manufactured hockey sticks in 1964, before selling the company in 2002. In the mid-1980s, the company produced approximately 500,000 sticks annually and was known for manufacturing wooden sticks used by NHL legends like Bobby Hull and Bobby Orr.

BOSTON UNIVERSITY CONNECTION

Team USA's ties to Boston University are significant with five players and five staff having connectivity to the Terrier men's hockey program. Players Jack Eichel, Clayton Keller, Charlie McAvoy, Jake Oettinger and Brady Tkachuk all competed at BU, while staff members Mike Sullivan, David Quinn, John Hynes, Chris Drury and Chris Kelleher either played and/or coached at BU.

The U.S. has played five games on Valentine's Day in the Olympics and has a 3-2 record.

Since this current Olympic format was established in 2010, the U.S. has won its group three times. Team USA rolled to an unbeaten 3-0 mark in 2022, with wins over China (8-0), Canada (4-2) and Germany (3-2) in preliminary round play. The U.S. went 2-1-0-0 (W-OTW-OTL-L) in 2014 with regulation wins over Slovakia (7-1) and Slovenia (5-1) sandwiched by a 3-2 shootout victory over host Russia, which featured the shootout heroics of T.J. Oshie and goaltending of Jonathan Quick. In 2010, the U.S. was 3-0-0-0, earning regulation wins over Switzerland (3-1), Norway (6-1) and Canada (5-3) in preliminary round play.

The U.S. is one of 12 teams competing at the 2026 Olympic Winter Games.

The tournament features 12 teams divided into three groups of four. Team USA is competing in Group C alongside Germany, Latvia and Denmark. Group A includes Canada, Czechia, Switzerland and France, while Group B features Finland, Sweden, Slovakia and Italy.

The teams will play round-robin within their group, with four teams earning byes to the quarterfinal round and eight teams playing qualification games to earn quarterfinal spots. The winners of the four quarterfinal contests advance to the semifinals, and the two semifinal winners will square off in the gold-medal game while the two semifinal losers will meet for bronze.

ABOUT THE NTDP

Founded in 1996, USA Hockey's National Team Development Program began operations in Ann Arbor, Michigan, and remained there until the summer of 2015, when it moved to its current home at USA Hockey Arena in Plymouth, Mich. The full-time program is composed of two squads, the U.S. National Under-18 Team and U.S. National Under-17 teams, which compete in the USHL as well as against international and collegiate competition. The Under-17 Team competes in the United States Hockey League and also participates in three international events annually. The U.S. National Under-18 Team's schedule includes games against NCAA Division I and III opponents, contests versus USHL teams as well as competition in three international tournaments.

2026 PARALYMPIC WINTER GAMES

The U.S. Paralympic Sled Hockey Team has been training in Boulder, Colo., since the beginning of January in preparation for the Paralympic Winter Games, which are set for March 6-15 in Milan. The U.S. has won gold in the last four Paralympic Winter Games, an unprecedented feat.

HOCKEY WEEKEND ACROSS AMERICA

Hockey Week Across America will be held a week later than typical to take advantage of the visibility provided by the Olympic Winter Games. The week-long celebration and will feature a theme for each of the three days, including USA Day on Monday (March 2); Stick Salute Day on Tuesday (March 3), Hockey Is For Everyone Day (March 4), Volunteer Appreciation Day (March 5), Hockey Jersey Day (March 6), Try Hockey For Free Day (March 7) and Welcome To Hockey Day (March 8). Hockey Week Across America was started by USA Hockey in 2008 to engage the hockey community in celebrating the game at all levels and exposing the sport to new audiences.
