1985 FUND FOR WOMEN

- In 2022, the bursary is a maximum of \$930. The committee may decide to award multiple bursaries, but the accumulated total may not exceed the maximum.
- The committee may request the successful applicant(s) to share knowledge gained at a meeting, conference, or event with other members or complete reports to FHO and the Committee
- Successful applicant(s) must submit receipts of payment for course, conference fees, air fare, provincially or nationally run training sessions, or training or identification camp levels.

QUEST FOR GOLD

- The Quest for Gold program provides direct financial assistance to Ontario athletes so they can compete at the highest national and international levels.
- An athlete must be:
 - an Ontario resident for one year prior to their nomination for carding status
 - a member of their provincial and multi-sport organization (PSO/MSO) and/or their national sport organization (NSO)
