



# GUIDELINES FOR REOPENING

South Wood County Recreation Center is looking forward to reopening July 15<sup>th</sup>, 2020. Our board of directors have worked closely with our local health advisors and governing bodies of skating sports. In our reopening, we will be establishing new policies for safety, hygiene, and social distancing measures. We are fully committed to safeguarding the health and safety of all volunteers and customers. For this reason, we ask that you review and follow the guidelines outlined below.

1. Groups must provide a complete participant list and all users (or their legal guardians if below 18) must sign our combined waivers (general liability and COVID-19) before entering the facility. We reserve the right to deny entry to (or ask patrons to leave) any participants that have not executed such waivers.
2. Ice sessions are limited to a maximum of 25 individuals per session.
3. Skaters must dress at home and show up to the rink no more than 15 minutes before their ice session. Locker rooms or shower areas are closed.
4. Restrooms should only be used if urgent and are not to be used for changing purposes.
5. Arrange to drop off kids or limit parent/ guardian accompaniment to one.
6. NO spectators will be allowed until further notice.
7. Make sure no one in your group or their family members has a fever, cough, or other symptoms of COVID-19. If a player, coach or parent has any sort of illness, coughing, or sneezing, they will be required to leave the building immediately.
8. Leave valuables/ personal items at home. We will no longer maintain a Lost and Found.
9. Do not bring outside food/ beverages into the rink. Skaters will be required to use their own individual water bottle and fill them up at home.
10. Everyone entering the building is required to wear a face mask. (Face masks will not be required while on the ice.)
11. Make sure everyone in your group understands social distancing, that is staying at least 6 feet away from others.
12. Hand Sanitizing stations will be available and strategically placed throughout the building. Employees and volunteers will be continuously filling hand sanitizer and hand soap.
13. Everyone is expected to wash their hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds, especially after going to the bathroom, blowing your nose, coughing, or sneezing.
14. Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth.
15. SWCRC continues to prohibit all spitting within or around the facility.
16. Arrival times will be staggered.
17. Skaters MUST leave rink within 15 minutes of the end of their ice session so rink staff can properly clean before the next group arrives.
18. Players will not be allowed to take off gloves to shake hands.
19. There will not be open hockey or public skating sessions until further notice.
20. The only entry point to the facility will be the main entrance on 16<sup>th</sup> Street. The path to the rink will be clearly marked.
21. Skaters and coaches will exit with the clearly marked path and doors.
22. All other areas of the rink will remain closed until further notice.
23. SWCRC will schedule a gap between groups so there is no user overlap.
24. The entryways door handles, restroom fixtures, chairs, rink gate door handles will all be disinfected regularly between ice sessions.
25. Staff/ customer interaction will be only as needed.
26. ALL employees and volunteers will be wearing masks and protective gloves.
