Rules and Gameplay

Welcome to the Neenah Baseball's T-Ball League! In this document you will find our league rules designed for a fun, enjoyable, and safe season for the kids! The T-Ball League is intended for children who are in 4k - Kindergarten when the season begins.

GAME SCHEDULES

League Game Days are Sunday afternoons. Games are scheduled to begin at 4:30 pm, unless otherwise noted. Any warm-ups / practice should be completed prior to 4:30 pm.

Game length will be 1 hour (typically 3-4 innings). Players should arrive before the scheduled start of any game to allow proper time for warm-up. Individual team coaches will communicate warm-up times to their teams.

Games will be suspended for at least 30 minutes after a visible lightning strike or sound of thunder. The 30-minute timer restarts for every new lightning strike or sound of thunder. **Remember the kid's safety needs to be the priority!** Coaches need to mutually concur a game is rained out. League commissioner needs to be notified.

DIAMOND LOCATIONS

All Kid Pitch games are planned to be played on the five fields at the Neenah Southview complex. Located in the City of Neenah. Hwy 41 take Breezewood exit, go east (changes into Bell Street). Complex is on the south side, before Commercial Street.



Games played during the Summer Clash Tournament Weekend (June 1 & 8) will be at Washington Park (631 Winneconne Ave)

FIELD SETUP

1. Bases - 60 feet
2. Coaches should work together to set up the field.
3. All equipment (bases/tee) should be locked in the shed after games.

GAME AND PRACTICE ATTIRE

1. Players will wear the team uniform shirt as provided by their sponsoring organization.
2. The Neenah baseball issued hat shall be worn for all games. Baseball shoes/cleats are optional. Baseball pants are optional. No Metal Spikes.

EQUIPMENT

1. Players will wear the proper protective equipment during all practices and games.
2. Helmets, bats, and gloves are not provided by the league.
3. Two ear flap batting helmets are mandatory when batting and when on deck.
4. Helmet face masks are not mandatory, but are allowed at all levels.
5. Coaches are responsible for enforcing the use of the protective safety equipment.

ROSTER AND BATTING ORDER

1. The batting order will consist of all players present.
2. Each inning the entire order will bat.
3. Coaches should rotate the batting lineup each inning.

GAMEPLAY

1. Each inning will consist of a team batting through the lineup.
2. Players are to advance one base per hit.
3. The last batter will run all of the bases to clear the bases for the inning.
4. The fielding team should field the ball and throw to first base each play.
5. As the season progresses, the concept of force outs and covering other bases can be introduced.
6. Players should rotate positions each innings.
7. Coaches need to keep safety in mind & be ready to assist younger players.
