National League Rules

1. One pitch = one inning pitched. A pitcher must pitch consecutive innings in a game. Once a pitcher is removed he is not allowed to pitch for the remainder of that game. Pitch counts must be recorded and limits be imposed on pitchers. No pitcher should throw more than 85 pitches in a game. Once the total pitch count has been calculated, a pitcher must take defined amount of days off from pitcher as follows:

0 to 40 Pitches = 1 Days Rest

41 to 60 Pitches = 2 Days Rest

60 to 85 Pitches = 3 Days Rest

2. Pitcher must be removed from game if 4 batters are hit by pitch in a game or 2 batters in a row. A hit batter is a hit batter whether the ball bounces or not. This would still be an indication that the pitcher lost control of the pitch.

3. Runners shall not advance due to a "balk". If the umpire declares a balk, the play is dead and all baserunners are allowed to return to their base. Balks are called for instructional use.

4. If a home run is hit, all runs will count regardless of inning. This exception only applies if it is an actual home run and does not apply if the batter reaches home as a result of error(s) in the field.

5. Batters do not have to wear helmets with protective cages. Parents must understand the risk. All helmets must be NOCSAE approved.
6. Leading is allowed on the release of the pitch.
7. Once the ball is in possession on a fielder within 6' of the pitching rubber, the runners can no longer advance. Runner will be allowed to return to the base they came from.
8. There is a 1 hour 50 minute time limit on all games which means no inning can start once you have reached the 1:50 mark in the game. You must finish the last inning that was started. Extra innings are allowed as it will be subject to the time limit. If the game ends in a tie and there is still time before the time limit is reached, we will allow extra innings and follow the time limit rules as stated.
9. If there is an overthrow from the catcher, the runners can advance. The only base that can NOT be taken is home, so on an overthrow by the catcher no runner from base is allowed to score.
10. The minimum players to start a game is 7. With that 2 players from opposing team are to help out with fielding in LF and RF till other players show. It is hard enough getting these games in without having to reschedule them because of not enough players.
11. No steals allowed by a team that has a 10-run lead. If lead drops below 10 runs stealing allowed again until the 10-run lead is regained.
12. Mercy Rule – 15 run lead after 4 completed innings (3 ½ innings for home team lead)
