

MN USA Tournaments Explained:

Minnesota USA Wrestling is one governing body of wrestling. MN USA wrestling tournaments are different than a normal hometown tournament. Each wrestler needs to have a membership card in order to participate. This card is \$45, purchased through the MN USA wrestling website (www.mnusawrestling.org), or at a MNUSA tournament. These tournaments separate wrestlers by age and weight, not grade and weight. This is the different divisions for MNUSA:

Pee Wee 6U (Born 2014-2015)

Bantam 8U (Born 2012-2013)

Intermediate 10U (Born 2010-2011)

Novice 12U (Born 2008-2009)

Schoolboy 14U (Born 2006-2007)

Grouping the wrestlers together by age means that wrestlers have the potential to wrestle against kids in other grades.

Wrestlers will most often wrestle a round robin format with 4 kids in the bracket. What place you get will give you points to qualify for the state tournament in March 2020. In order to qualify for this state tournament, you need to earn 30 points during the current season. Below is how many points you receive for each place. Double point qualifiers means just what it says, double points. So instead of earning 40 points for 1st place, you would earn 80 points.

1st Place: 40 points

2nd Place: 25 points

3rd Place: 10 points

4th Place: 0 points

The MNUSA state tournament is March 6, 7, and 8, 2020 in Rochester. These tournaments are listed on the Guillotine website.
