### **Booster Club approves \$40K for athletic dept "wish list" items**

The Booster Club Board recently approved a number of "wish list" items for the athletic department totaling \$40,400.

The board annually purchases equipment and training aides for several teams based on need and priorities with funding coming from Booster Club memberships, Spiritwear sales, sponsorships and donations.

Among the items approved include:

- Training Room – Training table
- Boys and Girls Gymnastics: Vaulting table
- Boys Golf - Training aides
- Football – Endzone camera
- Boys Swimming and Diving – Pool rental for training off-campus
- Softball – Hitting cages and screens
- Boys and Girls Volleyball – Six net standards
- Boys and Girls Soccer- Field mannequins
- Poms – Marley floor section for part of the dance room
- Boys and Girls Track – High jump pit
- Cheerleading – Four mats
- Boys and Girls Tennis – Court benches

This is in addition to the more than \$95,000 the Booster Club used to purchase an indoor screen system for the fieldhouse which was installed this summer. The screen system separates the

fieldhouse track and courts for different teams and benefits not only Titan athletes who practice indoors, but all Titan PE classes who use the space.

**Titans Crush Niles West on Homecoming**

Dave Schoenwetter wanted his players to appreciate nights like the one when his team play Niles West.

With a strong homecoming crowd behind them, the Titans played strong in all three phases of their Friday, Oct. 11, game against the Wolves, a 70-8 win.

Times have been tough for the Titans this season, who went winless against a very tough nonconference schedule this season. Now after a big win against a Central Suburban League South team and a 3-0 start to conference play, the head coach wanted his team to enjoy the moment, because they earned it.

"I think it's taught them to appreciate what's happening right now because it was so miserable in the first four weeks, we didn't play miserably, we just felt miserably after playing," Schoenwetter told the Glenview Lantern. "Now, the kids are starting to feel that real reward of the hard work. I think they're doing a good job of living in the moment and appreciating what's happening."

South didn't waste much time getting after the Wolves. The Titans forced a Wolves three-and-out on their first possession and seemed to score on their first offensive play of the game before a holding penalty brought it back. That wasn't a bad omen for South, who scored its first touchdown when Andrew Gall rushed in for a 2-yard score with 7:30 left in the first quarter.

The Titans scored two minutes later on a Tommy Gebien 25-yard run and again a couple minutes later when Luke Sennott blocked a Niles West punt and jumped on top of the ball in the end zone, taking a 22-0 lead with just under three minutes left in the third quarter.

Michael Bauer played only in the first half, but still impressed with 81 passing yards and three touchdowns — two to Chris Demirlika and Gebien. Andrew Gall rushed for 86 yards and two

touchdowns while also returning a kickoff return for a touchdown at the beginning of the second half.

Will Solis and Christian Blega each scored rushing touchdowns in the third quarter.

Starting strong had been something the Titans have struggled with much of the season, so scoring 22 points in the first quarter was a welcomed change in pace.

"I thought we came out strong," Bauer said. "I thought that was different from what we're done in the past. I think that's why we put up some strong number. I thought we came out with a strong mentality."

With a 3-4 overall record and 3-0 in conference, the Titans will need to beat both Maine South and Evanston on the road if they hope on making the postseason, given they will have enough playoff points to qualify for the postseason. According to Bauer, none of the player are phased or worried about having to win two games, he just knows his teammates are focused on continuing his team's recent mantra: 1-0.

"The sky's the limit," Bauer. "We can go as far as we want to go and I know this group wants to push because we want to make the playoffs."

Maine South will pose as a tough test, especially at home. The Hawks are 5-2 after battling numerous injuries this season. South, like many of the teams in the state since 2000, have struggled against the Hawks.

"We know that we have a great challenge next in Maine South and we know that they have a great program with a lot of good players," Schoenwetter said. "We're going to sell our kids on this being a great opportunity and let's get together and see what could happen."

GBS faced off with defending state champion, New Trier in front of an energetic and raucous crowd in Winnetka. The Titans came out flying, drawing two early penalties on New Trier. GBS converted on the power play when Daniel McKay slammed home the puck following crisp passes from Hunter Niemann and Jack Muir. The early goal didn't phase New Trier which responded with a goal less than two minutes later. The score stayed tied late into the first period when the Trevians capitalized on a power play and created traffic in front of the net to score consecutive goals to take a 3-1 lead. New Trier maintained pressure and drew another penalty on the Titans but the resilience of the GBS penalty kill created a turnover which Theo Papalas converted into a short-handed goal to close the first period trailing 3-2.

New Trier regained a two-goal lead with a quick goal early in the second period. Smooth passing from Max Ibarra and strong skating by Jack Pryzbylo created a great scoring opportunity which Joe Young finished to cut the deficit to 4-3. The Titans remained within one goal of the Trevians through the balance of the second period.

Once again, New Trier opened the third period with a strong push and extended their lead to two goals.
