Conference games still tied after a five-minute 5-on-5 overtime advance to a five-minute 3-on-3 overtime (and sudden victory shootout if still tied) with the team that wins the second overtime/shootout receiving an extra point in the standings (3/SW in the standings), making all games worth three (3) points. The 3-on-3 overtime and shootouts only affect conference standings, while the game is officially a tie for NCAA purposes.

## NCHC FACTS AND FIGURES

**ROAD WARRIORS:** For the second straight weekend, the NCHC features a full slate of conference play with four series on the docket. Last weekend, road teams went 5-2-1 in conference play, taking 17 of a possible 24 points. On the season, road teams are now 6-5-3 in conference play and have won all three 3-on-3 overtimes (1)/shootouts (2).

**POLL POSITIONS:** Five NCHC teams remain ranked in the USCHO.com Poll for the second straight week. The five ranked teams in the poll tie with Hockey East for the most from one conference. Three NCHC teams are ranked, all in the top 10, in the *USA Hockey Magazine* Poll (page 9):

- North Dakota moved into the top five in the USCHO.com Poll and received one first-place vote for the first time this season. The last time UND was ranked in the top five was Dec. 4, 2017.
- With five teams ranked in the USCHO.com Poll again, the NCHC has now had five teams in the poll in six of eight weeks this season. Six different NCHC teams have been ranked so far this season.

**MOVEMBER MADNESS:** For the sixth straight season, NCHC officials have organized a team to raise funds for Movember. In addition to sprouting lip sweaters to raise awareness, the officials are holding silent auctions this weekend to raise money with one auction at the Denver game on Friday and the other at the North Dakota game on Saturday. **WE'RE GOING STREAKING:** No. 5/6 North Dakota heads into its series with St. Cloud State riding a seven-game unbeaten streak (6-0-1), which is the longest active unbeaten streak in the country (Cornell is second at 6-0-0). UND is also perfect at home this season, going 7-0-0 and outscoring its opponents a combined 34-9. In all games, North Dakota ranks in the top five nationally in both offense (4.00 gpg/4th in NCAA) and defense (1.55 gpg/3rd in NCAA), one of three teams to do so (Cornell and Harvard). UND is also allowing the fewest shots on goal per game in the NCAA this season at 20.45, while the Fighting Hawks 94.9 percent penalty kill is second nationally (37-of-39). (pages 28-29)

**THE STARS ALIGNED:** For the third straight week, an NCHC player was named an NCAA Star of the Week as North Dakota sophomore goaltender **Adam Scheel** nabbed Second Star on Tuesday after allowing only two goals, going 1-0-1 and compiling a .966 save percentage at Denver last weekend. Scheel's teammate, junior forward **Jordan Kawaguchi**, was Third Star two weeks ago (Nov. 12), while Western Michigan junior forward **Paul Washe** was Second Star on Nov. 5. (page 8)

• Colorado College earned its first two wins in conference play this season with a sweep at St. Cloud State last weekend, topping the Huskies 4-2 and 5-2. It was CC's first weekend sweep against St. Cloud State since Dec. 10-11, 2010. The Tigers handed SCSU its first series sweep at home since Nov. 18-19, 2016 when North Dakota did the trick.

• Freshman forward **Josiah Slavin** and freshman defenseman **Brady Smith** each collected his first career goal at SCSU. Slavin's came on an empty-net Friday, when he also had an assist on the game-winning goal for his first multi-point game. Smith's goal served as the game-winner Saturday and marked his first collegiate point in eight games.

• Junior forward **Christiano Versich** posted his first career multi-goal game with two in Friday's win at SCSU, including scoring the game-winner. He also scored an empty-netter on Saturday for a three-goal series.

• **Matt Vernon** is CC's first freshman goalie to record a weekend sweep on the road since Nov. 13-14, 2009 (Joe Howe at Minnesota State).

• Denver earned only one point in conference play last weekend against North Dakota, tying the Fighting Hawks on Friday, 1-1, before falling in 3-on-3 overtime. On Saturday, the Pioneers fell to UND, 4-1. The two goals scored by the Pioneers were their fewest in a home series since 2012, before the NCHC started play. DU is now winless in its first four conference games so far this season, after going 8-0-0 in non-conference play to start the year.

• After going 6-for-8 on the penalty kill against North Dakota last weekend, the Pioneers' penalty kill is now 45-for-50 on the season, with the 90.0 success rate ranking eighth in the NCAA. DU's penalty kill has also scored three short-handed goals this season, which ties for second nationally.

• Freshman goaltender **Magnus Chrona** has played all but one game for DU this season, posting a record of 7-2-2 with a 2.16 GAA and a .911 save percentage, both of which rank third among NCAA freshman netminders. He also has two shutouts on the year, which ties for second nationally among all goaltenders.

## Miami RedHawks

• Miami earned its first conference win of the season last Friday, topping Minnesota Duluth, 3-1. The RedHawks dropped a tight, 3-2 decision on Saturday to settle for the series split. Friday's win over UMD snapped a six-game losing streak against the Bulldogs and marked only Miami's second win over UMD in their last 19 meetings (now 20 meetings).

• Senior captain and forward **Gordie Green** dished out an assist both nights against UMD. He now has at least a point in seven of 11 games this season, including the last three. He ranks fifth in the NCHC with a team-high 12 points (4g, 8a), averaging 1.09 points per game. Green is now only nine points away from becoming the 53rd player in Miami program history to post 100 career points (he has 38-53-91 currently).

• Senior goaltender **Ryan Larkin** has started 107 of Miami's 122 games since his freshman season in 2016-17, including both games against the Bulldogs last weekend. After racking up 67 saves against UMD, he is now only 56 saves away from moving into second on Miami's career list and needs 175 to become the all-time record holder in that category. His 2,800 career saves rank fourth all-time in NCHC history.

• Minnesota Duluth saw its four-game unbeaten streak snapped at Miami last Friday, falling 3-1, before bouncing back for a 3-2 win on Saturday to earn a split on the road. Three of the four goals the Bulldogs scored last weekend came on the power play. UMD has now scored more than three goals in a game only twice all season (winning both Oct. 25 at Minnesota and Nov. 9 vs. Denver), but ranks last in the NCHC offensively, averaging only 2.60 goals per game.

• Junior defenseman **Scott Perunovich** had a hand in all four UMD goals at Miami, assisting on each, including a career-high-tying three in Saturday's win. It was his third-career three-assist game. He's now riding a four-game point streak with seven assists in that span. The St. Louis Blues prospect leads all NCHC blue liners and ranks second nationally among defensemen with 13 points, while his 11 assists tie for the NCHC lead among all skaters and tie for the NCAA lead among blue liners.

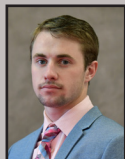

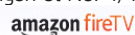

## JULIE & SPENCER PENROSE MEMORIAL CUP

Awarded to the NCHC regular season champion, the Julie and Spencer Penrose Memorial Cup (right) serves as the league's crowning achievement. The Cup is named after Julie and Spencer Penrose, who were tremendously successful in the business world and did much of it in Colorado Springs in the early 1900s. The couple made much of their money in the copper industry, which is why the trophy includes copper stars on it. The Penroses also set up the El Pomar Foundation, which still today helps pay for amateur sports and other non-profits, including the NCHC office located in the Copper Building next to the Penrose House on the grounds of the Penrose compound in Colorado Springs. The El Pomar Foundation has also issued grants for the Penrose Cup, medallions for each individual champion and the NCHC's annual Post-Graduate Scholarship. St. Cloud State won its second straight and third Penrose Cup overall last season, also winning it in the NCHC's inaugural season (2013-14). North Dakota has won two Penrose Cups back-to-back (2014-15, 2015-16), while Denver is the only other Penrose Cup champion (2016-17) to date.



## NCHC TOURNAMENT/FROZEN FACEOFF

The NCHC Tournament will consist of four quarterfinal series on the first weekend following regular-season play (March 13-15, 2020). The four higher seeds will host the four lower seeds in a best two-out-of-three format. Seed #1 will host Seed #8, Seed #2 will host Seed #7, Seed #3 will host Seed #6, and Seed #4 will host Seed #5. The winners of the four quarterfinal series will advance to the NCHC Frozen Faceoff at Xcel Energy Center in Saint Paul, Minn. for the two semifinal games on Friday, March 20. Semifinal games will be reseeded based on the final regular-season standings. The winners of the two semifinal games (4:08/7:38 p.m. CT) will then meet in the Championship Game (7:38 p.m. CT) on Saturday, March 21 for an automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament, while the two losers from the semifinal games will face each other in the third-place game (3:38 p.m. CT) earlier in the day. The 2018 NCHC Frozen Faceoff, won by Denver, was named Visit Saint Paul's Event of the Year for 2017-18. Minnesota Duluth won the 2019 Frozen Faceoff title, its second NCHC Tournament crown (2017).

## FRIDAY, NOV. 15

On the first full night of conference play, the four games Friday provided a bit of everything with an upset, a road win and a 3-on-3 overtime, while two teams pushed unbeaten streaks to six and both teams making conference debuts fell. The biggest surprise of the night came in Oxford, where Miami scored a pair of goals late to edge No. 6/6 Minnesota Duluth, 3-1. In a top-20 tilt, No. 20 Western Michigan was also victorious at home, stretching its unbeaten streak to six games (5-0-1) with a 3-2 win over No. 19 Omaha in the Mavericks' conference opener. The lone road team to win Friday was Colorado College, which collected its first conference win of the season with a 4-2 victory at St. Cloud State behind a trio of power play goals. Like Omaha, it was the conference opener for the Huskies. In the nightcap, rivals No. 9/9 North Dakota and No. 2/1 Denver played to a thrilling, 1-1 overtime tie, with UND earning the extra standings point in 3-on-3 overtime, pushing its unbeaten streak to six games, as well (5-0-1).

Behind two goals in the final four minutes of the game, Miami (3-5-2, 1-2-0-0 NCHC) upset No. 6/6 Minnesota Duluth (4-4-1, 1-1-1-0 NCHC), 3-1, in Oxford for its first conference win of the season. Miami senior goalie Ryan Larkin tied a season high with 35 saves, as UMD outshot the RedHawks, 36-17. Senior forward Karch Bachman put Miami ahead in the second period with a short-handed goal, while the Bulldogs answered less than a minute into the third period to tie the game on the power play. RedHawks sophomore defenseman Derek Daschke then tallied the game-winner with 3:58 left in regulation, while an empty-netter sealed the MU win.

Also victorious at home was No. 20 Western Michigan (6-3-2, 2-0-1-1 NCHC), which topped No. 19 Omaha (5-3-1, 0-1-0-0 NCHC), 3-2, at Lawson Ice Arena to extend its unbeaten streak to six games. The loss was the conference opener for the Mavericks. Junior forward Paul Washe pushed his point streak to six games with a pair of goals for the Broncos, the first coming on the power play and the second breaking a 1-1 tie. Classmate Austin Rueschhoff then tallied the game-winner for WMU short-handed with 5:45 to play in the second period, making it 3-1. WMU freshman goalie Brandon Bussi finished with 30 saves in net as Omaha outshot the Broncos, 32-25, in defeat.

In perhaps the most thrilling game of the night, long-time rivals No. 9/9 North Dakota and No. 2/1 Denver (8-1-2, 0-1-2-1 NCHC) played to a 1-1 overtime tie in Denver with UND earning the extra NCHC standings point in 3-on-3 overtime. The Fighting Hawks (7-1-2, 2-0-1-1 NCHC) struck first as sophomore forward Jasper Weatherby deflected a shot on the power play midway through the second stanza, while DU answered 57 seconds later when junior forward Kohen Olischefski knocked in a loose puck. After no scoring in 5-on-5 overtime, senior captain Colton Poolman popped in a puck in 3-on-3 overtime to give UND the extra point, while running North Dakota's unbeaten streak to six games. Freshman Magnus Chrona made 37 saves for DU as UND outshot them, 38-31.

Scoring the game's first two goals and last two goals, Colorado College (3-3-1, 1-1-1-0 NCHC) earned its first conference win of the season, topping St. Cloud State, 4-2, in the Huskies (2-3-4, 0-1-0-0 NCHC) NCHC opener in St. Cloud. Junior forward Christiano Versich scored two goals for the Tigers, both on the power play, as CC went 3-for-3 on the man advantage. Versich scored the game-winner midway through the third period, while freshman forward Josiah Slavin added an empty-net goal and an assist in the win.

## SATURDAY, NOV. 16

Home-ice advantage was non-existent Saturday night as the road team won all four NCHC games, including three of the games being decided by a trio of goals. Colorado College was the lone team to earn a weekend sweep, using a three-goal second period to down St. Cloud State, 5-2. No. 9/9 North Dakota earned five of six points on the weekend at No. 2/1 Denver with a 4-1 victory behind strong special teams play. No. 19 Omaha doubled up No. 20 Western Michigan, 6-3, for its first conference win of the season and a series split, led by junior forward Kevin Conley's first career hat trick and four-point night. The lone game not decided by three goals was in Oxford, where No. 6/6 Minnesota Duluth held off Miami for a 3-2 win, scoring two power play goals to get the series split.

The lone NCHC team to complete a sweep on the weekend was Colorado College (4-3-1, 2-1-1-0 NCHC), which downed St. Cloud State, 5-2, Saturday on the road. It was CC's first sweep of the Huskies (2-4-4, 0-2-0-0 NCHC) since 2010. Five different Tigers scored a goal in the win, with three coming in the second period, including the game-winner from freshman defenseman Brady Smith, which was his first career goal and put CC up 3-0. Both of SCSU's goals in the loss came on the power play. The Tigers outshot the Huskies, 32-29, in the win.

No. 9/9 North Dakota (8-1-2, 3-0-1-1 NCHC) pushed its unbeaten streak to an NCAA-best seven games with a 4-1 win over No. 2/1 Denver at Magness Arena. It was UND's first series win at Denver (8-2-2, 0-2-2-1 NCHC) since 2003. The Fighting Hawks struck twice in the first period with senior forward Cole Smith scoring the first of his two goals in the game, the first on the power play and the second short-handed in the second period, while junior defenseman Josh Rieger scored his first career goal in the first frame, as well, which was the game-winner. Sophomore goalie Adam Scheel totaled 27 saves and UND killed all six Denver power plays in the win, as the Pioneers outshot North Dakota, 28-22, despite the loss.

Junior forward Kevin Conley powered No. 19 Omaha (6-3-1, 1-1-0-0 NCHC) to double up No. 20 Western Michigan (6-4-2, 2-1-1-1 NCHC), 6-3, at Lawson Ice Arena as the Mavericks earned a series split and snapped WMU's six-game unbeaten streak. Conley tallied a career-high four points, including his first career hat trick, for the Mavs, who scored two goals each period. Conley scored the game's first two goals and added the game-winner in the second stanza to break a 3-3 tie. UNO went 2-for-3 on the power play and received two assists each from sophomore forward Tyler Weiss and freshman forward Ryan Brushett. WMU outshot Omaha, 29-24, despite the loss, and got two goals from junior forward Ethen Frank.

In the lone narrow contest of the night, No. 6/6 Minnesota Duluth (5-4-1, 2-1-1-0 NCHC) salvaged a weekend split at Miami (3-6-2, 1-3-0-0 NCHC) with a 3-2 victory. Each team scored once in the first period, while UMD struck twice on the power play in the second stanza to get the win, as sophomore forward Noah Cates tallied the game-winner. Miami scored both of its goals on the power play, with the second coming late in the second period to close the gap to one at 3-2, but the RedHawks couldn't find the equalizer in the final frame. UMD outshot Miami, 35-18, in the win.
