RIVALRY SERIES, PRESENTED BY DISCOVER

One of the fiercest rivalries in all of sports returns as the U.S. Women's National Team and Canada face off in the 2025 Rivalry Series, presented by Discover. Slated for four games, the series opens up with two games in the United States in November, followed by the final two games of the series in December in Canada.

This season's series serves as an evaluation and preparation tool for the upcoming Olympic Winter Games in Milan in February 2026.

Established by USA Hockey and Hockey Canada during the 2018-2019 season, the Rivalry Series is an annual showcase of the highest level of women's hockey at varying locations in the United States and Canada.

TEAM USA IN THE COMMUNITY

USA Hockey and the U.S. Women's National Team are committed to growing the game in communities across the United States. In every U.S. city hosting a Rivalry Series game, members of the national team participate in community outreach events aimed at connecting with both girls and women's hockey players in the local area.

In the days leading up to the first game of the Rivalry Series, USA Hockey partnered with the Cleveland Monsters and local youth hockey associations to get out in the community.

Team USA players, along with Cleveland Monsters players teamed up to host a ball hockey clinic with kids from Douglas MacArthur Girls Leadership Academy, an all girls school in Cleveland. In addition, they hosted a bring a friend to skate at BAM Arena with over 80 kids.

LAST TIME OUT

Eight different players scored and 16 recorded at least a point, as the U.S. Women's National Team topped Canada, 10-4, in game three of the 2025 Rivalry Series, presented by Discover. **Abbey Murphy** recorded four points (2G, 2A), while **Kendall Coyne Schofield** (1G, 2A) and **Kelly Pannek** (2G, 1A) posted three points each.

QUICK SHOTS

TODAY'S MATCH UP

Today's game marks the fourth and final game of the 2025 Rivalry Series, presented by Discover. It's the second meeting of the two teams this week, after facing off on Wednesday. The U.S. currently leads the series 3-0-0-0 (W-OTW-OTL-L) and can sweep with a victory today.

IN THE RIVALRY SERIES

Started during the 2018-19 season by USA Hockey and Hockey Canada, the Rivalry Series enters its sixth season (2018-19, 2019-20, 2022-23, 2023-24, 2024-25, 2025-26), with the U.S. holding a 12-4-4-10 (W-OTW-OTL-L) all time record. In the month of December, Team USA has a 3-1-2-1 advantage.

U.S. SCORES 10

Team USA scored 10 goals against Canada during its 10-4 victory in game three on Wednesday. It marked the largest all-time offensive output against Canada by the U.S. and the most goals scored against them since posting nine in a 9-2 preliminary round win at the 2012 IIHF Women's World Championship.

LARGEST MARGIN OF VICTORY

The U.S.' six-goal victory on Wednesday was the second-largest margin of victory for the red, white and blue all time against Canada and the largest since winning by seven during the preliminary round of the 2012 IIHF Women's World Championship.

SERIES VICTORY

With Wednesday's victory, Team USA took a commanding 3-0-0-0 victory in the series. Even with game four slated for Saturday, the U.S. will reign victorious in the 2025 edition, marking the first Rivalry Series victory for Team USA since 2019-20.

POWER PLAY, EMPHASIS ON POWER

Through the first three games of the series, the U.S. has tallied six power play goals, including two in a 10-4 victory in game three. **Hilary Knight** and **Abbey Murphy** each have recorded two power play goals on the series.

MOST IN CANADA SINCE 2021

Wednesday's 10 goals was the most the U.S. has scored during a game in Canada since a 10-2 quarterfinal victory over Japan in the 2021 IIHF Women's World Championship in Calgary.

A FAMILY AFFAIR

It's a family affair in Edmonton this week for Team USA. First, Joy Dunne's older brother Josh, a member of the Buffalo Sabres, was in town playing the Oilers on Tuesday (Dec. 9), before Jesse Compher's older brother J.T., a member of the Detroit Red Wings, was in town to play the Oilers on Thursday (Dec. 11).

MAKING TEAM USA

Today's game marks the final game before the U.S. Olympic Women's Ice Hockey Team is announced. The final 23-player roster that will take the ice in Milan will be revealed in early January alongside the U.S. Olympic Men's Ice Hockey Team and U.S. Paralympic Sled Hockey Team rosters.

The 2025 U.S. Women's National Team features 30 players, 17 forwards, 10 defenders and three goaltenders, and boasts all 25 players from the 2025 team that took home gold at Women's Worlds.

Hilary Knight (Sun Valley, Idaho) is the captain of Team USA for the 2025 Rivalry Series. **Alex Carpenter** (North Reading, Mass.) and **Megan Keller** (Farmington Hills, Mich.) returns as alternate captains.

John Wroblewski is the head coach of the 2025 U.S. Women's National Team. **Shari Dickerman**, **Brent Hill** and **Josh Sciba** are serving as assistant coaches, while **Alli Altmann** is the team's goaltending coach.

2025 U.S. WOMEN'S NATIONAL TEAM STAFF



JOHN WROBLEWSKI, HEAD COACH

John Wroblewski is serving as the head coach of the U.S. Women's National Team for the 2025 Rivalry Series after leading Team USA to a gold medal at the 2025 and 2023 IIHF Women's World Championship and silver at the 2022 WWC and 2024 WWC.

Wroblewski joined the U.S. Women's National Team following two years (2020-22) as the head coach of the Ontario (Calif.) Reign, the AHL affiliate of the LA Kings, and four seasons (2016-20) as the bench boss of the USA Hockey National Team Development Program.

Over his four years with the NTDP, the program reached its first USHL playoff berth since 2012 and finished top-three in all 12 international tournaments played. He led his team to 33-consecutive international victories from 2016-18, and also oversaw the development of 29 NHL Draft picks, including Jack Hughes, who was selected first overall by the New Jersey Devils in 2019.

At the IIHF level, Wroblewski guided the U.S. Under-18 Men's National Team twice, resulting in a gold in 2017 and bronze in 2019.

The Neenah, Wisconsin, native began his coaching career as an intern assistant coach with the NTDP and was promoted to a full-time assistant coach the following season, a position he held from 2008-10.

Wroblewski, a player on the inaugural NTDP roster in 1997, skated four years with the University of Notre Dame (1999-2003). He went on to play four years (2003-07) professionally with the ECHL's Fresno Falcons, recording 125 points (65-60) in 273 career games.

ASSISTANT COACHES

SHARI DICKERMAN, ASSISTANT COACH

Shari Dickerman is returning as an assistant coach for the U.S. Women's National Team during the Rivalry Series, after serving in the same capacity since the 2022-23 season.

Dickerman, who is in her second season as head coach at Minnesota State University, previously served as assistant coach of the 2022 U.S. Collegiate Women's Select Team, that competed at the 2022 Collegiate Series against Canada in August. Prior to her appointment to the USA Hockey staff, Dickerman served as an evaluator at numerous USA Hockey camps.

A member of the Mavericks staff since 2009, Dickerman has helped lead Minnesota State for the last 15 seasons and was named head coach in March 2024.

As a player, Dickerman was an All-American goaltender for the Mavericks.

BRENT HILL, ASSISTANT COACH

Brent Hill is returning as an assistant coach for the U.S. Women's National Team during the 2025 season, after serving in the same capacity since the 2022-23 season.

Hill is currently serving as an assistant coach of the Quinnipiac Women's Ice Hockey team, a role he's held for the last three seasons.

Hill was on the bench as an assistant coach for the 2015 U.S. Under-18 Women's World Championship, leading the squad to a gold medal at the 2015 IIHF Under-18 Women's World Championship.

Prior to Quinnipiac, Hill spent four seasons at the helm of Bishop Kearny Selects Academy, following a season as an assistant coach at Merrimack University and four seasons as an assistant coach at RPI.

JOSH SCIBA, ASSISTANT COACH

Josh Sciba is reprising his role on the U.S. Women's National Team staff during the 2025 season, after serving in the same capacity since the 2022-23 season.

As an assistant coach, Sciba helped lead the U.S. Under-18 Women's National Team to a gold medal at the 2022 IIHF Under-18 Women's World Championship, after serving in the same capacity for the 2019 U.S. Under-18 Women's National Team.

Sciba is in his second season as assistant coach for the New York Sirens, following a six-year stint as head coach of Union College.

As a player, Sciba was a member of the USA Hockey National Team Development Program from 2001-03, prior to playing four years at the University of Notre Dame.

ALLI ALTMANN, GOALTENDING COACH

Alli Altmann returns as the goaltending coach of the U.S. Women's National Team after serving on the U.S. Women's National Team staff for the last five seasons (2021-2025).

Altman also guided the U.S. Under-18 Women's National Team for four seasons, having served in the goaltending coach role from 2017-22. She guided the U.S. to two golds and two silvers during that time.

Altman is currently the co-owner and vice president of DEVENIR Goaltenders. She played four seasons for Minnesota State University, recording a career .901 save percentage.
